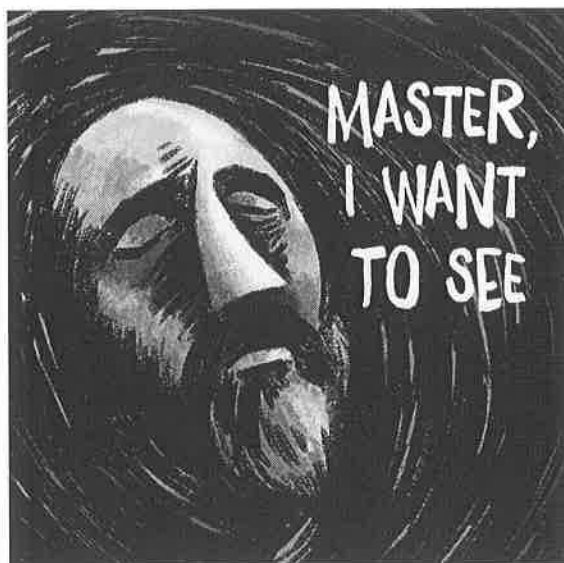

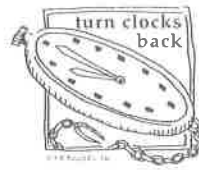

REFLECTION
