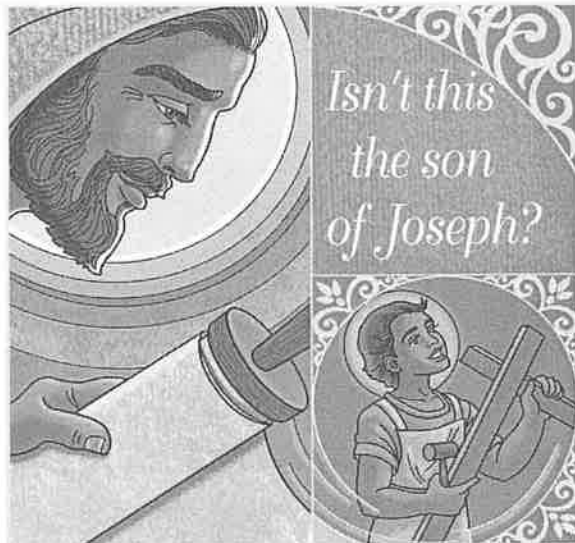

**FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**



The greeting that I receive as you leave the Church on the weekend is usually this question - "Are you keeping warm?"

I know that your concern is genuine and I appreciate it. Living in Chatham is nothing compared to the weather conditions that my sister and brother experience in the Parry Sound area. They laugh when I tell them that it snowed. They have had snow since November and when they came to visit a few weeks ago they thought they had come to the Banana Belt. We should consider ourselves lucky and not complain.

Once again this week the staff went to London for a Family of Parishes Workshop. These sessions deal with the dynamic of working in a family and the issues that we are confronting in this new format of parish life. We will have one more session this coming week so please remember that the offices will be closed again on Thursday.

I have met with the Grand Knights of our Knights of Columbus Councils and they have scheduled their Fish Fries to be coordinated so that all the Parish Family members can take advantage of the dinners. ### NOW THAT'S A GOOD QUESTION

*What is Eucharistic Adoration and what does one do when attending a Holy Hour?*

"The time you spend with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the best time you will spend on earth. Each moment that you spend with Jesus will deepen your union with Him and make your soul everlastingly more glorious and beautiful in Heaven, and will help bring about everlasting peace on earth,"

- *Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta*

What is Adoration? It is highly fitting that Christ should have wanted to remain present to His Church in this unique way. Since Christ was about to take His departure from His own in His visible form, He wanted to give us His sacramental presence; since He was about to offer Himself on the cross to save us, He wanted us to have the memorial of the love with which He loved us "to the end," even to the giving of His life. In His Eucharistic presence He remains mysteriously in our midst as the one who loved us and gave Himself up for us, and He remains under signs that express and communicate this love: The Church and the world have a great need for Eucharistic worship. Jesus awaits us in this sacrament of love. Let us not refuse the time to go to meet Him in adoration, in contemplation full of faith, and open to making amends for the serious offenses and crimes of the world. Let our adoration never cease (Catechism Catholic Church; 1380). What to do in Adoration? Sometimes we can be intimidated to go to Adoration. It is not because we fear being with Jesus in prayer but rather we have never been taught what to do in an extended period of prayer. Is it alright to read, pray a Rosary, or reflect upon the Scriptures? Or do I have to sit there- not moving or making a sound, staring at a gold monstrance with a Host inside? While visiting our Lord in Eucharistic Adoration, we can pray in a variety of different ways.

Here are some suggestions:

1. Pray the Psalms or the Liturgy of the Hours
2. Recite the "Jesus Prayer".
3. Meditate using Scripture Choose a passage from the Bible.
4. Read the life of a saint and pray with him or her.
5. Pour out your heart to Christ and adore Him Speak to Jesus, aware that you are in His presence, and tell Him all that comes to your mind.
6. Ask for forgiveness and intercede for others.
7. Ask Mary to join you as you gaze on Christ in the Eucharist and as you pray the Rosary.
8. Sit quietly and just "be" in the presence of God Think of a visit to the Blessed Sacrament as coming to see your best friend. Sit quietly and enjoy being in each other's company. Instead of talking to the Lord, try listening to what He wants to tell you.

### AN ONGOING MISSION

In his hometown synagogue, Jesus' neighbors are amazed by his words. Nevertheless, they remind each other, "Is this not Joseph's son?"

Surely the people know who he is. The carpenter's son. The young man who had learned in this very synagogue. The boy down the street.

Conflict arises as Jesus begins to define himself in a new way. When he compares himself to the ancient prophets Elijah and Elisha the tensions grow. The tensions multiply when Jesus begins to tell of a new mission for God's people: the good news of the scriptures is intended for all.

In his famous passage from the First Letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul reminds us of the eternal nature of love. Love does not come to an end. In today's readings, we are reminded that, like love, Jesus' mission cannot be contained. Jesus slips through the crowd of persecutors and moves on to new challenges. We are called to this same perseverance in the name of love.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The song of the angels, "Holy, Holy, Holy," resounds from our lips at every Mass. There was a widespread belief in the first religions of the world that God stirred creation into being by a word, a song, a musical note. Music and a sense of God's presence have always been inseparable. In the liturgy, your voice is invited into this song as the priest names the reasons for our praise. "Heaven and earth are full of your glory," and we are not passive onlookers, but participants in this glory. Catholic prayer no longer assigns this angelic hymn to a choir, but gives it to you to sing. Even if your voice is thought to be suitable only for a well-insulated shower stall, you are called into this song.

We are born to sing—just listen to a baby testing the full range of newly-discovered vocal abilities. Soon we get shushed and hushed into quiet, and given lots of messages that our voices are unwanted, and that we need to raise our hands in order to be heard. All of that is overturned in liturgy, the place where God waits to hear us come alive in the song of all creation. In heaven, everyone's in the choir; why not start practicing now?
