



# Readings for February 24

1 Samuel 26: 2,7-9,12-13,22-25. 1 Corinthians 15: 45-49. Luke 6: 27-38

**FEBRUARY 17, 2019** SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



On Saturday night after Mass the First Parter Family Skate was held at Kinsman Arena. Although I didn't attend the Family Skate I am told that about seventy people attended and had a wonderful time both at

the arena and at St. Ursula that hosted the attendants with refreshments. Thanks to the Knights for helping in the organizing of this event.

This Thursday, February 21st, the Knights of Columbus will celebrate the Marian Prayer Program in honour of Our Lady of Help of Persecuted Christians. As the Knights have done in the past in sponsoring a Prayer Vigil to honour the intercession of Mary, this year the Knights will come together at St. Ursula and invite all of you to join them in this time of prayer. They will meet at 5:00 pm. in St. Ursula Church and have a holy hour that will include prayer and readings. They will break for an hour before coming together for the celebration of Eucharist at 7:00 pm. at which time the prayers and readings will focus on this intercessory prayer of Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians. Confessions will be celebrated as usual from 6 to 6:45 pm. Please join us for this time of prayer.

The holy Season of Lent is nearly upon us and the one thing that I desire is that all of us have the opportunity to benefit from the graces that are available to us in our Family of Parishes. Lent offers us all a very special opportunity to grow in our relationship with God and to deepen our commitment to a way of life, rooted in baptism. In our busy world, Lent provides us with an opportunity to reflect on our patterns of behavior, to pray more deeply, experience sorrow for what we've done and failed to do, and to be generous to those in need.

We begin this year the celebration of Lent with Ash Wednesday on March 6<sup>th</sup>. This is a day when all Christians are called to dispose ourselves to a period of fasting, prayer and alms giving. We have ash placed on our foreheads as a sign of our willingness to enter into a time of penitence and look forward to the mystery of the Paschal Sacrifice that we celebrate in Easter.

Let's prepare ourselves for this time.

Why is Easter not a fixed date like Christmas? Have you ever wondered why Easter Sunday can fall anywhere between March 22 and April 25? And why Eastern Orthodox churches usually celebrate Easter on a different day than Western churches? These are good questions with answers that require a bit of explanation.

Why Does Easter Change Every Year? Since the days of early church history, determining the precise date of Easter has been a matter for continued argument. For one, the followers of Christ neglected to record the exact date of Jesus' resurrection. From that point on the matter only grew increasingly more complex.

A Simple Explanation At the heart of the matter lies a simple explanation. Easter is a movable feast. The earliest believers in the church of Asia Minor wished to keep the observance of Easter correlated to the Jewish

Passover. The death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ happened after the Passover, so followers wanted Easter always to be celebrated after the Passover. And, since the Jewish holiday calendar is based on solar and lunar cycles, each feast day is movable, with dates shifting from year to year.

The Lunar Impact on Easter

Prior to 325 A.D., Easter was celebrated on the Sunday immediately following the first full moon after the vernal (spring) equinox. At the Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D., the Western Church decided to establish a more standardized system for determining the date of Easter. Today in Western Christianity, Easter is always celebrated on the Sunday immediately following the Paschal Full Moon date of the year. The date of the Paschal Full Moon is determined from historical tables. The date of Easter no longer directly corresponds to lunar events. As astronomers were able to approximate the dates of all full moons in future years, the Western Church used these calculations to establish a table of Ecclesiastical Full Moon dates. These dates determine the Holy Days on the Ecclesiastical calendar. Although modified slightly from its original form, by 1583 A.D. the table for determining the Ecclesiastical Full Moon dates was permanently established and has been used ever since to determine the date of Easter. Thus, according to the Ecclesiastical tables, the Paschal Full Moon is the first Ecclesiastical Full Moon date after March 20 (which happened to be the vernal equinox date in 325 A.D.). Thus, in Western Christianity, Easter is always celebrated on the Sunday immediately following the Paschal Full Moon. The Paschal Full Moon can vary as much as two days from the date of the actual full moon, with dates ranging from March 21 to April 18. As a result, Easter dates can range from March 22 through April 25 in Western Christianity.

Eastern vs. Western Easter Dates

Historically, Western churches used the Gregorian Calendar to calculate the date of Easter and Eastern Orthodox churches used the Julian Calendar. This was partly why the dates were seldom the same. Easter and its related holidays do not fall on a fixed date in either the Gregorian or Julian calendars, making them movable holidays. The dates, instead, are based on a lunar calendar very similar to the Hebrew While some Eastern Orthodox Churches not only maintain the date of Easter based on the Julian Calendar which was in use during the First Ecumenical Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D., they also use the actual, astronomical full moon and the actual vernal equinox as observed along the meridian of Jerusalem. This complicates the matter, due to the inaccuracy of the Julian calendar, and the 13 days that have accrued since the year A.D. 325. and means, in order to stay in line with the originally established (325 A.D.) vernal equinox, Orthodox Easter cannot be celebrated before April 3 (presentday Gregorian calendar), which was March 21 in A.D. 325. Additionally, in keeping with the rule established by the First Ecumenical Council of Nicaea, the Eastern Orthodox Church adhered to the tradition that Easter must always fall after the Jewish Passover since the resurrection of Christ happened after the celebration of Passover.


