

We again enter into the Ordinary Time of the Church Year. Because the term *ordinary* in English most often means something that's not special or distinctive, many people think that Ordinary Time refers to parts of the calendar of the Catholic Church that are unimportant. Even though the season of Ordinary Time makes up most of the liturgical year in the Catholic Church, the fact that Ordinary Time refers to those periods that fall outside of the major liturgical seasons reinforces this impression. Yet Ordinary Time is far from unimportant or uninteresting. Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word *order*. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church - the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ. Thus for Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. There's nothing "ordinary" about that! Likewise, the normal liturgical color for Ordinary Time - for those days when there is no special feast - is green. Green vestments and altar cloths have traditionally been associated with the time after Pentecost, the period in which the Church founded by the risen Christ and enlivened by the Holy Spirit began to grow and to spread the Gospel to all nations.

I received a thank you note from Deacon Rob Renaud to the Parish Family. The Parish Pastoral Council authorized a gift to Rob on the occasion of his ordination to Transitional Diaconate. The gift was the purchase of a new alb. Deacon Rob wrote: "Thank you for expressing God's love in such a thoughtful way. Thank you for your generous gift for my ordination to the transitional diaconate. I will soon journey to the Sisters of the Divine Master to be fitted soon for a new alb, which is very timely as my alb is starting to get "well used". I will use your gift to cover the cost. Be assured of my prayers for Chatham and for you who serve God's people there, each time I go to wear the new alb before Mass. Yours in Christ, Deacon Rob Renaud." We will host Deacon Rob when he is ordained a priest and will celebrate his First Mass with us in the Family of Parishes.
