I know that you missed my column in this bulletin last week but the cold that we have shared in the rectory got the best of me and our secretary took pity on me and inserted a beautiful meditation on the readings. Thank goodness that I have turned the corner on the cold and feel much better - to say the least that I say goodbye to the nasty cough that accompanied the cold. This time of the year seems to always present itself with adverse health problems and a fall cold is one of them.

Fr. Rob Rocheleau, who is my travel buddy, reminded me last night it is only four weeks and three nights until we are flying to Europe. Vacation - seemed like a long way away. Parishioners would ask me when is your vacation and I would reply - November. Well here we are closer than ever. This vacation includes a flight to Venice and then board a cruise ship for eleven days and visiting Rajicka, Split, Dobrovinik, Crete, Malta, Sicily, Naples, and landing in Rome. Then after the cruise Fr. Rob and I will spend a week in Rome wandering the ancient city. The Holy Father will be away when we are there. He is visiting the East. Just thought you might like to know.

Today is the Life Chain - the silent protest in front of the hospital and witnessing to the value of human life. Also this afternoon is the St. Vincent de Paul Turkey Dinner. They have been sold out for almost two weeks. My regrets that I will be unable to attend either of these events but I will be out of town.



A LITTLE FAITH

Today our readings are about faith, frustration, and how much is enough. Habakkuk is a complainer having an argument with God. Timothy is encouraging a community challenged by cowardice and the apostles want more faith than they have. Things aren't happening fast enough for any of them or for us. All of them and we want God to do something sooner rather than later and we want God to give us a reason to believe that it will all work out. What does God do? God puts it back on them—and us—telling Habakkuk to describe the world he wants; telling the apostles to do more than the expected. Doing more with less is a familiar phrase today and a reminder that a little faith may be enough even for the most difficult times.

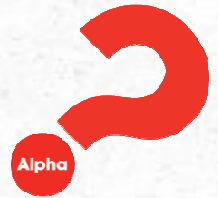
