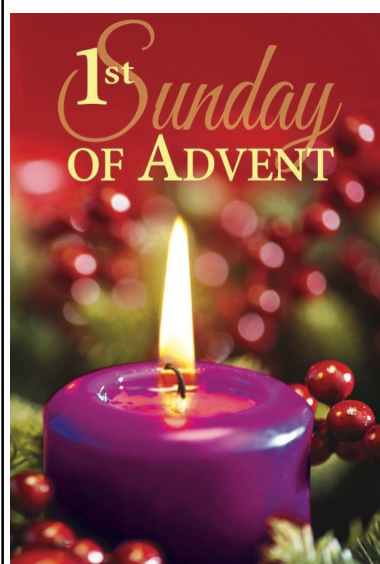

DECEMBER 1, 2019
FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT



Happy Advent! This season of the Church year is special to us. Not only do we begin a new year in the Church calendar but also we anticipate in a spirit of preparation the birth of the Messiah. These four weeks of Advent give us an opportunity to prepare our hearts and our homes for the coming of Christ. While in Europe in the last month I was overwhelmed by the decorations that were in place and it seemed that we missed out on the longing anticipation that has always been a part of this season for me. I pray that you and your families will see this time as a time of longing for Christ to make in us a dwelling place where peace will come to rule in the midst of division and strife.

I had a lovely time away. I escaped the flooding that was experienced in Venice by one day and we seemed to be a day ahead of the storms that battered the many areas of the Mediterranean that we visited. We were not able to visit Montenegro because of rough seas but we did manage to see three cities in Croatia, Corfu in Greece, Valetta and Medina in Malta, Cortina in Sicily, Naples in Italy and then Rome. Our days in Rome were wonderful. We managed to see the major churches in the City and prayed for the unity of our Family of Parishes. Once again I made the special visit to St. Agnes Church and veneration of the relic of St. Agnes and to the Church of Sanctae Crucis to pray in the intercession of Bl. Antoinetta Mea (a seven year old girl who died and has been introduced into the process of sainthood). Prayers at the tombs of St. Peter, St. John XIII, St. John Paul II, St. Pius XII and Paul VI were offered for your intentions. We offered Masses in St. Peter's Basilica for your intentions as well. We managed to visit for the first time the Church of San Lorenzo and prayed for the ministry of our deacons. I give thanks to God for the privilege of being able to once again visit this wonderful part of our world.

This past week the three Families of our Deanery met with Bishop Dabrowski to be encouraged in our ministry with you. We were able to discuss the growing pains as well as the blessings that we have experienced in this new stage of Church development.

We look forward to the Communal Celebration of Penance that will be celebrated on Sunday December 15th at St. Joseph Church. This annual celebration is a wonderful chance for us to receive the forgiveness of the Almighty in preparation for Christmas.
