

From the

From time to time as your Pastor I make Partir decisions that affect the entire Parish Family. In the two and a half years that we have been a Family we have endured through changes that has altered our way of being that is radically different from the past. changes have been necessary for our being a cooperative and functioning Parish Family.

The most recent decision that I have made affects our Sunday Mass Schedule. When Our Lady of Victory came on board as part of the Family in July, I had been asked to wait for six months to change the Mass schedule and also to retain the Mass for the Polish speaking parishioners. After reviewing opportunities for parishioners to attend Mass in the various churches in our Family I have come to decide that a Saturday evening Mass be cancelled from our schedule. Our Lady of Victory will lose the Saturday evening Mass at 5 pm. There is available space at the Saturday 5 pm Mass at Blessed Sacrament. Also I have changed the Mass for the Polish speaking parishioners at Our Lady of Victory to 9 am and the English Mass will be at 11 am. This change will allow Father Peter to celebrate at the later Masses in the Family that he has not been able to so far.

These changes, as difficult as they are, bring all of our churches to a somewhat equal footing. Blessed Sacrament and St. Joseph have two Sunday Masses, St. Agnes and St. Ursula have one Sunday Mass and Our Lady of Victory has one English Sunday Mass and one Polish speaking Mass.

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Advent. The appearance of John the Baptist is central to the theme of our celebration. As the forerunner to the Messiah we are called to see our responsibility in being the announcers of the Lord's coming. There are many distractions in the world today - from Black Friday to Shopping Bonanzas - and we are to be the heralds that bring the awareness of His coming to those who will listen. Tomorrow we will celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception and we ask the intercession of our Blessed Mother to fill us as intentional disciples. Come and celebrate the Mass on Monday at Our Lady of Victory at 8 am.

during the month of November for purchase born of a virgin is a distinct belief, even though many of food, clothing and furniture. This is possible Catholics erroneously think that the Immaculate Sacrament Conception refers to Jesus.

> Contributing to the confusion is the celebration of the Immaculate Conception during the season of Advent. While the faithful are preparing to honor the birth of Jesus, we commemorate the conception of Mary. The choice of Dec. 8 for the Immaculate Conception does not directly relate to Advent; it corresponds more to the traditional date for the feast of the birth of Mary, Sept. 8, which coincides with the dedication of a Jerusalem church in honor of the mother of Mary. The that day nine months. In a similar way we celebrate the Annunciation on March 25, nine months before the birth of Jesus.

Belief in the Immaculate Conception asserts that God preserved Mary from all sin from the moment of her conception, thus preparing a pure vessel for the incarnation of the Son. This belief is not expressly contained in the Scriptures, but it enjoys a God bless from the Soup Kitchen widespread following in the church's tradition. Although the Immaculate Conception of Mary has been affirmed since the earliest centuries of Christianity, it was not formally proclaimed a dogma of the church until 1854. Dec. 8 is now a holy day of obligation in the United States, which is placed under Mary's patronage with this title.

> When Mary is depicted as the Immaculate Conception, she is often shown wearing a crown of stars as the woman in Revelation 12 and standing on a snake, reversing the temptation of Eve. Mary, Immaculate Conception, is the exalted queen of heaven who manifests God's power over sin.






