## Deacon's Pen

Let us listen this weekend to the Gospel of Matthew which speaks to us about focusing our energies on Jesus. Peter first doesn't recognize Jesus, then jumps out of the boat, tries to walk to Jesus but fails and starts to drown. The Lord Jesus who went about doing good works and healing sickness and infirmity of every kind, commanded his disciples to care for the sick, to pray for them and to lay hands on them. Jesus was sent by the Father out of His love for us, a love that began at the very moment of creation. This passage forms the central part of my prayers for a sick person who is craving help. Many have heard it, at sickness, some while in their dying bed.

However this passage I think is a perfect inspiration to seek Jesus no matter what our problem or concern might be. Just remember he will help if:

- 1. We have faith in the support, power and love Jesus can give us.
- 2. Each one of us has to accept Jesus recognize Him, know who He is, accept Him as our friend and helper.
- 3. Peter's actions reinforce this:
  - a) First Peter had to be convinced it was Jesus walking on the water. He didn't recognize his friend - do we always recognize Jesus.
  - b) Then if Peter kept his eyes, mind and focus on Jesus, everything went well.
  - c) But when the wind hit Peter, it took his mind and focus off Jesus, he became frightened and he began to sink.
  - d) Yet, even then, Jesus came over to take him by the arm and lift him back up. Jesus helped him, not necessarily in the way Peter asked, but in an important and supportive way. Jesus may not always come to our aid as we perceive the need, but as God sees the need.
  - e) The message is to keep trusting in Jesus. He will not fail you. Keep your eyes on Jesus.

I know Jesus wants to help, but he doesn't intrude in our lives. He waits for us to know we need help and then ask Him for His help.

We can know the unknowable and touch eternity when we encounter the core silence in our souls.

We can do this even on a noisy street and in the midst of the greatest distraction. Once we have made friends with silence, the rambling noise of the world no longer seems to matter, and we can carry a deep forgiving peace within us, even when physical silence cannot be found. We know that we are loved, cared for, sustained, nourished, embraced, and carried. There is nothing to fear in silence, and I can be present to myself in the same way that God is present to me. I can see myself as God sees me. All of my faults, weaknesses, imperfections, failings, and sinfulness melt away in the abundance of God's mercy. All of the worldly things we see as being important no longer are.

It is in silence that all of the barriers that divide us disappear. There is no more "yours" and "mine" but only the oneness of "ours." There is no longer a need to "figure things out," and we tap into our desire to simply let things be. Silence is creative and powerful and gives us hope. Silence is God's greatest blessing. God became one with humanity in silence. It allows us to be one with all of creation, with the moon and the stars and all of the creatures God has made. The smallest particle of creation radiates with beauty. Silence allows us to soar beyond ourselves and connect in ways that the mind can only imagine. When all is quiet, we begin to see that it is only our fear that keeps us from the Lord. It is our fear that causes us to sink and to fail. We can hear the gentle whisper that tells us to reach for God's hand. We discover that we yearn for the salvation and wholeness that only God can give to us. Be still my soul and be at peace.
