### Deacon's Pen

In our Gospel passage this weekend, Jesus was asking His disciples: "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" He received some interesting responses, and then Simon spoke up declared "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

A great many people knew Jesus as the son of Joseph the Carpenter from Nazareth. Three Sundays ago, we were reminded that Jesus and His disciples had fed 5,000 men plus women and children starting with only five loaves and two fish. 5,000 men plus women and children conservatively translates to 20,000 - 25,000 people (men, women & children) all assembled in a desolate place, "listening to Jesus" and being "healed by Him".

Even though 20,000 - 25,000 people had all heard Jesus speaking to them without a public address system, and no "amphitheatre" to naturally amplify sound. Even though they had been healed of various ailments by Jesus. Even though they had all been fed with delicious bread and fish. There is no indication that the people had made the connection that Jesus is so very much more than an itinerant preacher or a poor Carpenter from Nazareth.

Suddenly, Simon proclaimed that Jesus is the Son of the living God - the Christ of God - the Anointed One -

During this time of restrictions I will not be the long-awaited Messiah. As Jesus pointed out to reopening our "regular" weekday masses Simon, "flesh and blood have not revealed this to you, or confessions - except for the three but my Father in heaven [has revealed this to you]".

> Then Jesus did something that has only been done a few times in the entire Bible - He changed Simon's name to Peter. Peter means rock! When we build on rock, we have the most solid foundation possible.

> Jesus changed Simon's name to Peter, and then told him, "you are Peter, and on this 'rock' (this Peter) I will build my church".

In fact, Jesus notes that it is His Father in Heaven who has made this selection. For it is only by virtue of divine revelation that the fisherman knew what no man on his own could possibly know - that Jesus is the Christ, the anointed one of God.

We are called to keep our eyes simply and faithfully on Jesus, always listening to Him and the teaching magisterium of the Church, always placing all our Faith, all our Trust in Him!




### REFLECTION

The only way to know God is to love God. Our minds will never fully grasp the mystery of God, but our hearts and souls can learn to love the mystery. Years ago, when life had a more innocent quality to it, we believed what we were told or witnessed, unless there was direct evidence otherwise. This was especially true if the information came from someone in authority. In a sense, we were a bit more gullible on one hand but also more trusting on the other. The latter is an admirable quality that sadly can be eroded when we realize we have been duped. With education and technological advances, we find ourselves more skeptical and less likely to too quickly accept and believe what we see and hear.

For all of the good that social media can do, it can also easily distort reality and truth. Photoshop and a myriad other technological truths can add to, fabricate, and make even the non-existent seem real. It is amazing. How far do we allow this obviously justifiable skepticism to take Questioning and doubting are healthy elements of any good relationship as long as we don't allow them to turn us away from a deeper experience of love and encounter. If we cannot get our minds around something or empirically justify or prove it, we tend to declare it a hoax, untrue, or unauthentic and walk away. The very same trust that can quickly be eroded is exactly what is essential for all of our relationships, especially our relationship with God. With all things and people that make a profound claim on us, we have to trust in the absence of knowledge. Full self-investment involves plunging completely into the unknown!

Simon Peter said to Jesus, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." Peter came to this knowledge, which is not "head knowledge" because of the relationship he shared with Jesus and what God was able to reveal in and through that relationship. Peter simply "knew" because of love that this is who Jesus really is. The silent exchange of love between friends, and not an intellectual exercise of the mind, brought Peter to this place. When we stop and think about it, there are many things in life that we simply know but do not completely understand. When someone sacrifices their own well-being for another, it may not make intellectual sense when examined. But it makes a world of sense when it is carried out. The vastness of reality and an encounter with incomprehensible mystery all lead us to profound silence where we simply know something to be true. Have you trusted enough to allow your relationship with God to bring you to this place or are you still too skeptical?






### The Choice of Stewardship

What does it mean to be a good steward? Does it mean to be an active parishioner, or something more? Are we better stewards because we give more in terms of our money and time to our parish, or are we called to do even more than that?

### REFLECTION

My attention is riveted by today's Gospel and Jesus' poignant questions to his disciples: "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" and "Who do you say that I am?" Peter's quick reply to the latter was, "You are the Christ." Did he know what he was saying? I'm not sure. In the same situation, I would have been at a loss for an answer. Now, 2,000 years later, I ponder that second question and I can come up with varied answers. Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd . . . I am the gate . . . I am the light . . . I am the true vine."

A retreat I attended some months ago was based on this scripture passage and provided me with a new perspective. We spent our time for meditation and prayer focusing on reverse questioning: Who am I? How do I see myself? How does Jesus see me? How do I want Jesus to see me?

Reflecting on my relationship with Jesus offered me new insights and a heartfelt desire to follow him more closely. I often take for granted the fact that he is a constant in my life - always present to me, whether or not I acknowledge him. Today's Psalm proclaims, "I give you thanks, O Lord, with my whole heart . . . Your steadfast love endures forever." How blessed are we!


