Deacon’s Pen

In our Gospel passage this weekend, Jesus was asking His disciples: “Who do people say that the Son of Man is?” He received some interesting responses, and then Simon spoke up declared “You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.”

A great many people knew Jesus as the son of Joseph the Carpenter from Nazareth. Three Sundays ago, we were reminded that Jesus and His disciples had fed 5,000 men plus women and children starting with only five loaves and two fish. 5,000 men plus women and children conservatively translates to 20,000 - 25,000 people (men, women & children) all assembled in a desolate place, “listening to Jesus” and being “healed by Him”.

Even though 20,000 - 25,000 people had all heard Jesus speaking to them without a public address system, and no “amphitheatre” to naturally amplify sound. Even though they had been healed of various ailments by Jesus. Even though they had all been fed with delicious bread and fish. There is no indication that the people had made the connection that Jesus is so very much more than an itinerant preacher or a poor Carpenter from Nazareth.

Suddenly, Simon proclaimed that Jesus is the Son of the living God - the Christ of God - the Anointed One -

the long-awaited Messiah. As Jesus pointed out to Simon, “flesh and blood have not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven [has revealed this to you]”.

Then Jesus did something that has only been done a few times in the entire Bible - He changed Simon’s name to Peter. **Peter means rock!** When we build on rock, we have the most solid foundation possible.

Jesus changed Simon’s name to Peter, and then told him, “you are Peter, and on this ‘rock’ (this Peter) I will build my church”.

Dr. Marcellino D’Ambrosio, in his weekly Reflection on the Sunday Scripture Readings this week tells us that “Jesus was making plain that as founder of the new Israel, He was choosing His vicar here on earth.”

In fact, Jesus notes that it is His Father in Heaven who has made this selection. For it is only by virtue of divine revelation that the fisherman knew what no man on his own could possibly know - that **Jesus is the Christ, the anointed one of God.**

We are called to keep our eyes simply and faithfully on Jesus, **always listening to Him and the teaching magisterium of the Church, always placing all our Faith, all our Trust in Him!**

May God richly bless you and all those you love.

There he will be living with the Capuchin Fathers and be a part of a year of observership and then if accepted he will join the Fathers. During this year he will be serving at the Cathedral. Father Peter has been in a period of discernment for some time and in his decision to join the Capuchin his discernment has come to this. We wish him well and assure him of our prayers and support in this step in his priesthood.

Replacing Father Peter will be two priests - Father Olivet Okoro who comes to us from the Catholic Family of Parishes of Norfolk and Father Stanislaw Izdebski who comes to us from Sochi. REFLECTION

The only way to know God is to love God. Our minds will never fully grasp the mystery of God, but our hearts and souls can learn to love the mystery. Years ago, when life had a more innocent quality to it, we believed what we were told or witnessed, unless there was direct evidence otherwise. This was especially true if the information came from someone in authority. In a sense, we were a bit more gullible on one hand but also more trusting on the other. The latter is an admirable quality that sadly can be eroded when we realize we have been duped. With education and technological advances, we find ourselves more skeptical and less likely to too quickly accept and believe what we see and hear.

For all of the good that social media can do, it can also easily distort reality and truth. Photoshop and a myriad other technological truths can add to, fabricate, and make even the non-existent seem real. It is amazing. How far do we allow this obviously justifiable skepticism to take us? Questioning and doubting are healthy elements of any good relationship as long as we don't allow them to turn us away from a deeper experience of love and encounter. If we cannot get our minds around something or empirically justify or prove it, we tend to declare it a hoax, untrue, or unauthentic and walk away. The very same trust that can quickly be eroded is exactly what is essential for all of our relationships, especially our relationship with God. With all things and people that make a profound claim on us, we have to trust in the absence of knowledge. Full self-investment involves plunging completely into the unknown!

Simon Peter said to Jesus, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." Peter came to this knowledge, which is not "head knowledge" because of the relationship he shared with Jesus and what God was able to reveal in and through that relationship. Peter simply "knew" because of love that this is who Jesus really is. The silent exchange of love between friends, and not an intellectual exercise of the mind, brought Peter to this place. When we stop and think about it, there are many things in life that we simply know but do not completely understand. When someone sacrifices their own well-being for another, it may not make intellectual sense when examined. But it makes a world of sense when it is carried out. The vastness of reality and an encounter with incomprehensible mystery all lead us to profound silence where we simply know something to be true. Have you trusted enough to allow your relationship with God to bring you to this place or are you still too skeptical?

HOW TO DONATE TO THE CHATHAM CATHOLIC FAMILY

As we are all forced to slow down in our current world, unfortunately some things continue along, such as our household bills and expenses. The same goes for our parishes as well, that operate mainly on donations received at Mass. If you normally donate with your offertory envelope when you attend Mass, there are some other options—including a new, easy, online option.

E-TRANSFER

Using your online banking website or app, add the parish you wish to donate to using the parish email address:

Create the e-transfer and in the comment/note area, please indicate your envelope number or your address and which fund you are donating to, such as Sunday Offertory, Easter, Building, Share Lent etc.

No password is needed as the parishes are set up for autodeposit.

CHEQUE

If you do not use online banking, you can mail a cheque to the office. Please make your cheque payable to the particular parish and on the memo line, indicate which fund you are donating to. Please mail it to:

PAD (Pre-Authorized Debit)

If you wish to set up PAD, you won't have to worry about remembering to bring your envelope to Mass or be concerned that you can't donate because you can't attend Mass, such as our current situation.

There is a form available on the website (www.ccfp.dol.ca/how-to-donate or click Giving/How to Donate on the top menu). You can print off the form and fill it out and either scan the form and a void cheque and email it (using the email addresses above), or mail the form and void cheque to the office (using the address indicated above). Please note for this method, the form must be received before the 15th of the month in order to take effect the next month.



We have a new way to make your donations to the Chatham Catholic Family of Parishes! Parishioners and visitors can make donations online using a computer, laptop, tablet or any mobile device, using your Visa and Mastercard (credit card, as well as Visa and Mastercard debit cards) for any type of donation. This includes both one-time donations and recurring donations. We have been working with a team of experts from Plently Inc. to develop this capability.

Getting Started Is Easy

- Using your **mobile device's camera**, scan the QR code (see codes below with the particular parish name you wish to donate to), and simply follow the instructions on the screen to make your donation. If you have an older Android smartphone, you may have to install a scanning app – newer androids and all iPhones will scan without the scanning app. You will quickly be directed to the web application.

OR

- On your **computer or electronic device**, go to Chatham Catholic Family of Parishes website: www.ccfp.dol.ca, then choose the **How to Donate** button on the home screen, or on the top menu, click **Giving/How to Donate**, and follow the instructions for the particular parish you wish to donate to.

You will have the option to choose where your donation will go, such as Regular Sunday Offertory, Christmas, Building etc. You can also add a comment. Any funds donated through Plently will be part of your annual tax receipt from the parish.

There is no fee to make your donation using this service. Plently Inc. runs on Amazon Web services and meets strict Payment Card Industry Data Security Standards (PCI DDS) for service providers.

This option is currently not available for Our Lady of Victory Parish.

REFLECTION

My attention is riveted by today's Gospel and Jesus' poignant questions to his disciples: "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" and "Who do you say that I am?" Peter's quick reply to the latter was, "You are the Christ." Did he know what he was saying? I'm not sure. In the same situation, I would have been at a loss for an answer. Now, 2,000 years later, I ponder that second question and I can come up with varied answers. Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd . . . I am the gate . . . I am the light . . . I am the true vine."



A retreat I attended some months ago was based on this scripture passage and provided me with a new perspective. We spent our time for meditation and prayer focusing on reverse questioning: Who am I? How do I see myself? How does Jesus see me? How do I want Jesus to see me?

Reflecting on my relationship with Jesus offered me new insights and a heartfelt desire to follow him more closely. I often take for granted the fact that he is a constant in my life - always present to me, whether or not I acknowledge him. Today's Psalm proclaims, "I give you thanks, O Lord, with my whole heart . . . Your steadfast love endures forever." How blessed are we!
