I have spent time silent retreating these past 6 months. Some have felt left out because they can't go to church, can't go to a retreat house, can't sing in the choir. I do too and miss all those very spiritual things immensely. But reality is reality and I have spent time in silent retreat wherever I can, at home, walking in the woods, in the cemetery or just down a street. In fact, any time alone, thinking or pondering about the gospel is a silent retreat. While on retreat I like to be guided by a retreat master, but these past few months, I have stepped up to the plate and asked myself the typical questions a retreat master might give me; I chose small sections of the gospel that that person might suggest and studied and pondered and wrote about them; and I prayed on them.

One day I realized that before the Pandemic, a mass was scheduled in memory of my brother Dan who passed away in October of 2019. Since church was cancelled, there could not be a mass said for him that I could attend. At what would be the normal mass day and time, I went to the cemetery, sat on the grass at our parent's graves and prayed my daily prayers for my brother, plus some more - I spent the hour there instead of in church. While it wasn't the same as mass and receiving communion, it was the best I could do and it helped me. And I knew my brother would be with me wherever I was, would listen and give me brotherly support as well.

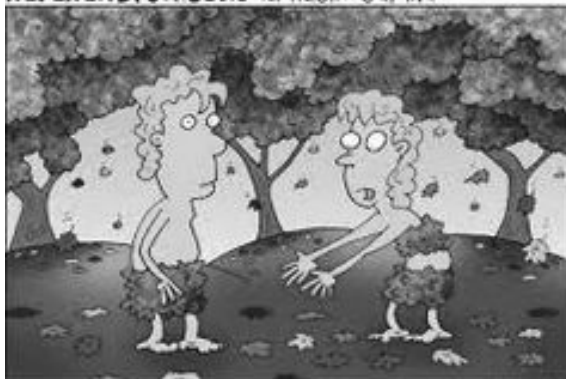

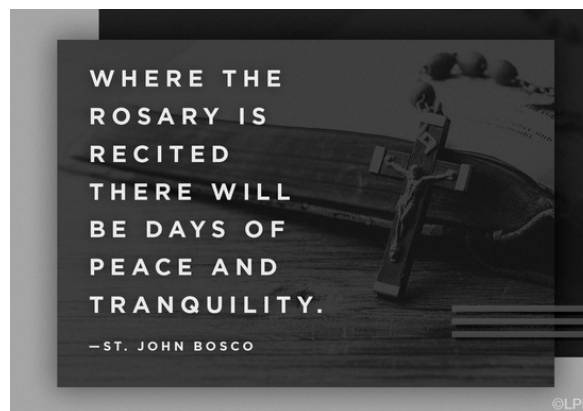

Recently we celebrated the 106th "World Day of Migrants and Refugees". Many of us can trace when our family left their homelands, often because of famine, war or disaster. It is with gratitude that we thank the Indigenous people of Turtle Island, which is now called Canada, for life in this beautiful country.

This year's theme as declared by Pope Francis is "Forced like Jesus Christ to flee". Today millions of people are homeless and forced to find shelter and food just to survive. Our Catholic Family of Parishes has sponsored 3 families and 3 single adults in the past 5 years. They are grateful what we and Canada provide for them. They are enriching our society. Following is an update on these families.

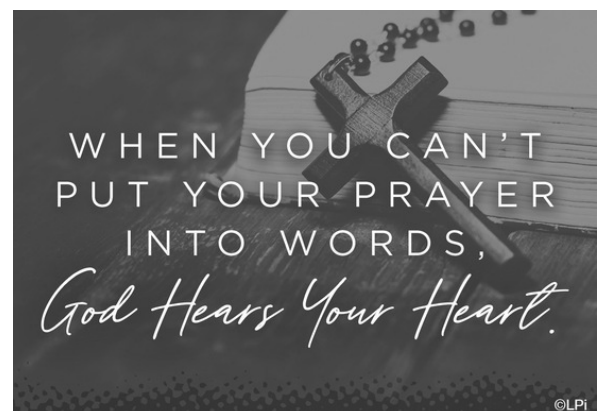
- ♦ One family has become Canadian citizens and own their own home.
- ♦ Six adults are working, 3 adults are studying English and upgrading diplomas online through the Adult Language School in Chatham.
- ♦ Ten children are happy to be back at school and valiantly trying to make up for lost education because of the pandemic.
- ♦ One child has been born in Canada and is beginning to talk in both languages.
- ♦ Two of the adults have married and a third will be married this month.

These families have pooled their finances and have applied to sponsor a brother, his wife and 4 children, presently living in Turkey.

Let us thank God that we as a parish have been able to sponsor these few people. Their lives are much more peaceful and hopeful.

Our lives and our awareness of God's love for all have deepened.

**GOSPEL MEDITATION
ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING
OF SCRIPTURE**

Do you ever wonder why things never seem to come together? We see glimpses of consistency, equity, justice, peace, harmony, and wellbeing, but it always falls short. Human life is still expendable and manipulated, people are used for personal advancement, countries are at war, the economy continues to face turbulence, anger and frustration are widespread, and happiness is the possession of just a few and not the many. Could it be that we are serving the wrong kingdom? We keep trying to make our kingdom work and find ourselves still scratching our heads after repeatedly failed attempts to do so. It is almost as if people are saying, "we'll get it right this time if we do ...," as if some new and secret innovation has yet to be tried.

We serve God's kingdom. We may not like hearing that, but it is true. God did not make only a few of us. God made all of humanity and all of humanity is called into service. How often do we defer any of our decision making to God? Secular leaders enjoy winking at the Sacred Scriptures and using them when they advance a cause, but are they really listened to? Even those who consider themselves believers tend to sift through God's Word, taking what seems to fit and apply and discarding the rest. After all, if we were really serving God's kingdom, we would see an abundance of fruit testifying to this fact. But what's growing on the vine is anything other than good Gospel-centered fruit.

Nothing in this world or the next belongs to us. We have such a hard time believing this and live our lives as if everything belongs to us. And, the fruit does not lie. Trees that are neglected and not properly fertilized reveal that fact. They cannot keep these deep secrets from being discovered. If God's kingdom was really being served, then life would have looked much differently after the crucifixion. By now, there would be plenty of fantastic fruit to harvest in abundance: faith, hope, love, prudence, temperance, justice, and fortitude. Do we see these in abundance around us? Why not?

Still we grapple with ownership, privilege, status, and the protection of our rights. It's all about us and what we want, think we need, and expect to acquire. When did this change of focus occur? We may be struggling with this since humanity's day in the garden and have never understood that the focus cannot be on us and the apple but on God and God's justice. Maybe the only answer is that the Kingdom be taken from us and given to someone who is willing to do a better job. Is that the fate we really want?

As we are all forced to slow down in our current world, unfortunately some things continue along, such as our household bills and expenses. The same goes for our parishes as well, that operate mainly on donations received at Mass. If you normally donate with your offertory envelope when you attend Mass, there are some other options—including a new, easy, online option.

E-TRANSFER

Using your online banking website or app, add the parish you wish to donate to using the parish email address:

No password is needed as the parishes are set up for autodeposit.

PAD (Pre-Authorized Debit)

If you wish to set up PAD, you won't have to worry about remembering to bring your envelope to Mass or be concerned that you can't donate because you can't attend Mass, such as our current situation.

There is a form available on the website (www.ccfp.dol.ca/how-to-donate or click Giving/How to Donate on the top menu). You can print off the form and fill it out and either scan the form and a void cheque and email it (using the email addresses above), or mail the form and void cheque to the office (using the address indicated above). Please note for this method, the form must be received before the 15th of the month in order to take effect the next month.



We have a new way to make your donations to the Chatham Catholic Family of Parishes! Parishioners and visitors can make donations online using a computer, laptop, tablet or any mobile device, using your Visa and Mastercard (credit card, as well as Visa and Mastercard debit cards) for any type of donation. This includes both one-time donations and recurring donations. We have been working with a team of experts from Plently Inc. to develop this capability.

Getting Started Is Easy

- Using your **mobile device's** camera, scan the QR code (see codes below with the particular parish name you wish to donate to), and simply follow the instructions on the screen to make your donation. If you have an older Android smartphone, you may have to install a scanning app – newer androids and all iPhones will scan without the scanning app. You will quickly be directed to the web application.

OR

- On your **computer or electronic device**, go to Chatham Catholic Family of Parishes website: www.ccfp.dol.ca, then choose the **How to Donate** button on the home screen, or on the top menu, click **Giving/How to Donate**, and follow the instructions for the particular parish you wish to donate to.

You will have the option to choose where your donation will go, such as Regular Sunday Offertory, Christmas, Building etc. You can also add a comment. Any funds donated through Plently will be part of your annual tax receipt from the parish.

There is no fee to make your donation using this service. Plently Inc. runs on Amazon Web services and meets strict Payment Card Industry Data Security Standards (PCI DDS) for service providers.

This option is currently not available for Our Lady of Victory Parish.
