Ezekiel 34: 11-12, 15-17. 1 Corinthians 15: 20-26, 28. Matthew 25: 31-46.

November 15, 2020 THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

MESSAGE FROM BISHOP FABBRO

"I am here by extending the dispensation from the Sunday obligation, including the solemnities of the Nativity of the Lord and Mary, Mother of God, until Easter. It seems unlikely that our situation with respect to the Covid-19 pandemic will change in the near future."



DEACON'S PEN

In our Gospel reading this week, Jesus continues His teaching about Heaven. This time, He compares the Kingdom of Heaven to a man who was going on a long journey. The man summoned his slaves and entrusted his property to them. He expected that each would manage that which had been entrusted to them according to their individual abilities.

Note:

This message should most definitely <u>not</u> be construed in a discriminatory way. Jesus values every human being with <u>unconditional love and respect</u>. Jesus lived among us during a profoundly patriarchal time, so He spoke about "men", since that was how His listeners thought and believed. This message applies equally to men and women; to young and old; and to people of every level of talent and ability!

Note also:

Jesus <u>did not</u> expect all three people to produce the <u>same results</u>. He expected each to apply <u>their specific talents and abilities in a productive and meaningful way, and to produce positive results</u>.

Upon his return, the man praised the one who then had four talents <u>every bit as much</u> as the one who then had ten talents. However, when it came to the one who proved lazy, and had buried his master's talent in the ground (producing no results), the master had clear condemnation.

The lazy slave, because of his <u>extremely poor choice</u>, lost even what little he had, and was "thrown into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth". It is also important to note that the lazy slave knew better - he openly admitted that he "knew that his master was a harsh man...".

I believe that the message here is that no innocent person will be condemned because they innocently did not "know" what was expected of them. The guilty - those who reasonably should know what is expected of them but produce no positive results anyway will be the ones who will be condemned.

It is clear here that Jesus is referring to all of us as the people to whom He entrusts His "property" - the world and all that is in it. We are <u>all</u> expected to apply our respective talents and abilities for the good of the earth, the good of the environment, the good of society and the good of every other person. We are <u>not</u> all expected to produce the same quantity of results, <u>nor</u> are we all expected to produce the same quality of results.

We <u>are</u>, however, expected to do our best with what we have been given! Salvation (spending eternity in our Lord's Kingdom of light and love) will be the same for each person who lives a <u>genuinely faith filled</u>, <u>genuinely hope filled</u>, <u>genuinely love filled life!</u> However, the consequences that will accrue to those who refuse to live that way will be catastrophic!

May our Risen Lord richly bless you and all those you love.

REFLECTION

God gives us the gift of His very self and asks us to invest it. Investing God's greatest gift of Himself wisely, allows God's kingdom to grow and flourish. God trusts us with this pearl of great price in hopes that it will produce abundant fruit. While God's gift of self is realized in the gifts of faith, hope, and love, they are not meant to be solely for personal benefit. They are intended to be shared and are at the heart of Jesus' blueprint for happiness, the Beatitudes.

When we properly invest God's greatest gift, His most treasured possession, we invest in the wellbeing of all of our brothers and sisters and the world in which we live. We take up most seriously our call to be stewards and properly manage, not only our own affairs, but the affairs of those around and before us. God has put tremendous confidence in us. Do we have that same confidence in God?

We often go the extra mile and put in the additional effort when it comes to those concerns closest to us: our families, friends, careers, home and securities. But when it comes to things that are not as close to us, we can become lax and less conscientious. Tending to God's treasure requires a great deal of focus and persistent hard work. It demands that I see the bigger picture, God's picture, in which self-sacrifice is a given as we labor for the establishment of God's kingdom, God's vision. Fear and a lack of trust can loom large, however. We are afraid of letting go of what is "mine" and apprehensive of jeopardizing what we have in order to venture into something bigger and more promising.

Fear and a lack of trust serve no purpose in God's kingdom. They benefit neither the person nor God. What is required is a courageous resolve that produces the fortitude necessary to stay the course and do what God is asking. Doing all in our power to cultivate the seeds of faith, hope, and love in our world, working diligently to put all of our relationships in proper order, becoming attentive to systems and ideologies that hurt and oppress people, being mindful of injustice, and laboring on behalf of the poor and the needy are at the core of what each of us is asked to do. It is how we invest God's most precious gift wisely. If persistent, alert and attentive, then life will gradually improve around us, there will be greater peace and we will experience joy.
