A MESSAGE, FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. JIM HIGGINS



After much prayer and deliberation I have decided to step down from being Pastor of the Chatham Catholic Family of Parishes. However, I am not retiring, but assuming a different position - that of being a Parochial

Vicar or Associate Pastor. I will be serving in the East Windsor Family of Parishes - which include the Parish of the Atonement, St. John Vianney, St. Vincent.

The announcement happens now so that the new pastor of the Family of Parishes can be announced for Chatham. The new pastor is Father John Jasica. He was ordained in 2001. This transfer will happen on July 1, 2021.



2020 OFFERTORY ENVELOPE NUMBERS

DEACON'S PEN

The celebration of the Baptism of our Lord draws the Christmas season to a close. Jesus' baptism prepares Him for His public ministry and fulfills all righteousness (Matthew 3.15). As Jesus was coming up out of the water, He saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on Him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.' (Mark 1.10-11). Combined with the teaching in the faith that we received from our parents, grandparents, godparents, and Catholic teachers, and our regular (active) participation in the celebration of the Mass, our knowledge and understanding of the Catholic Faith are to be ever strengthened and deepened, so that we are well prepared for a life of mission in the service of our Risen Lord.

Sadly, in so very many cases, this simply does not happen, or does not happen effectively, resulting in lukewarm Catholics who are in no way prepared for a life of mission in the service of our Risen Lord. This is indeed sad.


There is an especially important message in this week's Gospel that is all too easy to overlook - "I have baptized you with water; but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit" (Mark 1.8). The Holy Spirit is the key to the entire Christian Faith!! It is the Holy Spirit who motivates, animates, and informs the faithful!

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that: "The Holy Spirit, whom Christ the head pours out on his members, builds, animates, and sanctifies the Church. She [the Church] is the sacrament of the Holy Trinity's communion with [humankind]." (Article 747).

What, then, could possibly be more important that our relationship with the Holy Spirit, <u>calling upon</u> the Holy Spirit for guidance and support whenever we are about to undertake anything?

May our Risen Lord richly bless + you and all those you love!

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS When God Whispers

"You don't need to shout. My hearing works just fine."


Are you a parent that has used that one on your kids? I'm not sure at what age they realize that the volume of their voice doesn't correlate to the likelihood of receiving a favorable reply — it might be sometime in the teenage years, when the talking slows down altogether.

But I've got to admit, it would be nice if God always gave us a loud and dramatic sign when He wanted something — the booming voice and the torn-open heavens ("This is my beloved Son!") really get the message across. Sometimes I find myself envious of the Apostles, who were able to witness such things in person.

The fact of the matter is, in the year 2021, God is more likely to speak in a whisper than in a shout. The prophet Isaiah forewarns that Christ himself will not be a noisemaker — for all his preaching, he will not cry out or shout to bring forth justice to the nations. His way is altogether different than that.

We are not the Apostles, and we do not have the privilege of seeing the Holy Spirit descend on Christ like a dove. But here's the good news: God doesn't need to shout. Our spiritual hearing works just fine. We just have to be listening.

Let's wake up each morning ready to hear God's whispers throughout the day. Let's make a conscious effort to invite those whispers into our hearts, where they can become a catalyst for grace in this world.





We are taking every reasonable precaution to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in our churches and protect



parishioners. Those who attend Mass or other services without a mask and without a valid exemption are violating municipal and provincial COVID-19 restrictions and putting fellow parishioners at risk.

Per Bishop Fabbro, starting January 1, 2021, if you have a medical exemption for wearing a mask, you will be required to bring to the pastor evidence from your physician, nurse practitioner, social worker, psychologist or occupational, respiratory or physical therapist attesting to your condition. Once you do so, you will be provided a document to bring to Mass each time. When you register for Mass, please let them know you have been granted an exemption, so that you can be seated in a designated area.

We will still ask that you wear a mask briefly to enter and exit and to receive Communion, unless your disability prevents you from doing so. Those who refuse to comply with this diocesan regulation will be asked to leave and will not be permitted to attend Mass until they agree to wear a mask.

We are aware that this new protocol does go beyond the requirements in most health unit orders and local by-laws, but they are required to protect the safety of our parishioners, parish teams and volunteers while on church property. Infections continue to increase in our communities and small sacrifices like wearing a mask can slow the transmission of the virus, and are a sign of our love for our neighbours and help prevent people from taking advantage of the exemptions for personal reasons.

If you normally donate with your offertory envelope when you attend Mass, there are some other options—including a new, easy, online option.

E-TRANSFER

Create the e-transfer and in the comment/note area, please indicate your envelope number or your address and which fund you are donating to, such as Sunday Offertory, Easter, Building, Share Lent etc.

No password is needed as the parishes are set up for autodeposit.

CHEQUE

If you do not use online banking, you can mail a cheque to the office. Please make your cheque payable to the particular parish and on the memo line, indicate which fund you are donating to. Please mail it to:

PAD (Pre-Authorized Debit)

If you wish to set up PAD, you won't have to worry about remembering to bring your envelope to Mass or be concerned that you can't donate because you can't attend Mass, such as our current situation.

There is a form available on the website (www.ccfp.dol.ca/how-to-donate or click Giving/How to Donate on the top menu). You can print off the form and fill it out and either scan the form and a void cheque and email it (using the email addresses above), or mail the form and void cheque to the office (using the address indicated above). Please note for this method, the form must be received before the 15th of the month in order to take effect the next month.



We have a new way to make your donations to the Chatham Catholic Family of Parishes! Parishioners and visitors can make donations online using a computer, laptop, tablet or any mobile device, using your Visa and Mastercard (credit card, as well as Visa and Mastercard debit cards) for any type of donation. This includes both one-time donations and recurring donations. We have been working with a team of experts from Pllenty Inc. to develop this capability.

Getting Started Is Easy

•Using your **mobile device's camera**, scan the QR code (see codes below with the particular parish name you wish to donate to), and simply follow the instructions on the screen to make your donation. If you have an older Android smartphone, you may have to install a scanning app — newer androids and all iPhones will scan without the scanning app. You will quickly be directed to the web application.

OR

•On your computer or electronic device, go to Chatham Catholic Family of Parishes website: www.ccfp.dol.ca, then choose the How to Donate button on the home screen, or on the top menu, click Giving/How to Donate, and follow the instructions for the particular parish you wish to donate to.

You will have the option to choose where your donation will go, such as Regular Sunday Offertory, Christmas, Building etc. You can also add a comment. Any funds donated through Pllenty will be part of your annual tax receipt from the parish.

There is no fee to make your donation using this service. Pllenty Inc. runs on Amazon Web services and meets strict Payment Card Industry Data Security Standards (PCI DDS) for service providers.

This option is currently not available for Our Lady of Victory Parish.
