Please remember that Bishop Fabbro has extended the dispensation from the Sunday obligation up to and including Easter Sunday.

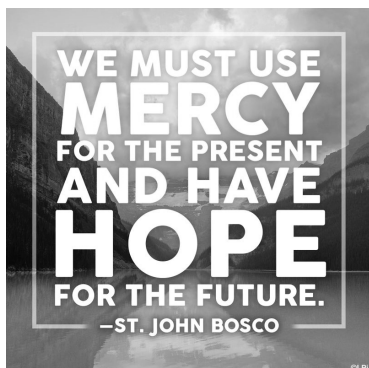


ENVELOPE DISTRIBUTION

Since our parishes and our Family of Parishes Office has been temporarily closed due to the rapid increases in COVID-19 cases, it is not possible for anyone to pick up the remaining 2021 Offertory Envelopes. For this reason, arrangements are being made for Family of Parishes volunteers to deliver the 2021 Offertory Envelopes that have not been picked up. This will be contactless delivery, whereby a volunteer will take each box of envelopes to the address printed on the top of the box, put them in the mailbox, ring the doorbell, and leave.

Our first wave of deliveries will be to addresses where there is a mailbox that is accessible from outside the building (single family dwellings, townhouses, and condominiums with separate outside entrances, etc.). Once all of those envelopes have been delivered, we will investigate ways to deliver the remaining envelopes to apartment buildings, high rise condominiums, etc. If you had not yet picked up your 2021 Offertory Envelopes, check your mailbox in the coming weeks.

DEACON'S PEN

The last time I wrote to you we were joyfully looking forward to Christmas. Our churches were open, within the guidelines set out by the 'Powers That Be,' vaccines were being approved and I was hopeful of a return to more normal times. Then we were put into the strictest lockdown we have experienced so far during this pandemic. Oh how I long for a return to 'Normal.'

Realistically, I know that normal as we knew it, will never return. The last 12 months have changed us all. Many people are quite content to watch Sunday Mass on T.V., and they are happy about that, and say they may not return to church. They are not restricted geographically, and can watch Mass from anywhere in the world, whenever is convenient for them. Watch, but I don't think they participate, and of course they can't receive the Eucharist. Sure there is Spiritual Communion, which is meant for extraordinary times, but restrictions will be lifted eventually. What are your thoughts about returning to church?

Recently I was reminded of one of Jesus' parables. The passage can be found at Matthew 9: 14-17, Mark 2:18-22, and Luke 5:33-39. It is about putting new wine into old wine skins.

When wine is new, it is in a state of fermentation. It bubbles and expands as the fermentation gases are released. A fresh, pliable wineskin can absorb such expansion and slowly age with the wine until the fermentation process is complete.

To put fresh wine into an old wineskin is asking for trouble. The old wineskin has assumed a definite shape and is no longer pliable. It is fixed and somewhat brittle. The activity of the new wine will stress it beyond its ability to yield, and so both the wine and the skin are lost.

I think the effects of Covid will be with us for a long time. We as a Church Community, have started to look for new ways to reach out and minister to the People of God, some have been successful, and some not. We need and want your help and input. **"You can't put new ideas into old mind-sets. You can't get new results with old behaviours."** So I ask you again; "What are your thoughts about returning to church?"

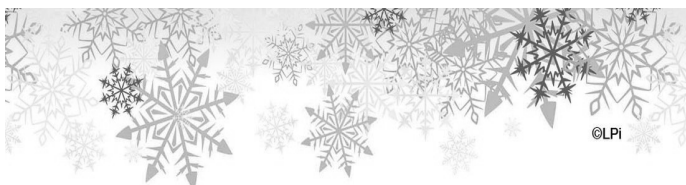
GOSPEL MEDITATION

Most of us are quiet people who desire to live a good and holy life, promote the values and mission of the Gospel as best we can and desire to one day inherit the surprise of life eternal God promises to us. We are not trail blazers. We are simple people who want to do the simple things of life well. But there are others who left a more profound impact along the way of the paths they walked. Folks like Dorothy Day, Martin Luther King, Thomas Merton, Gandhi, St. Teresa of Calcutta, and many others left lasting impacts and legacies. Like Moses, they show us by word and deed who God is and what integrity and a purpose driven life look like. They show us how to be holy. We need Moses people like these to give us inspiration, hope and an example of holy living.

We do not need to do what they did or even mirror their relationship with God. Each one of us is God's special creation, with a purpose and soul known only to us. We need to learn how to open up and bring, without compromise, our soul-ness to life. We know when someone is authentic and centered because they always point to truth, even though they struggle and sin themselves, and they embody an unspoken timeless wisdom that just sounds and feels right. Jesus taught with this same type of authority and it astonished many who listened. We do not need to move mountains, advance a cause, write books or become notable. All we have to do is become credible witnesses of the faith we profess. Moses people can teach us how to do this.

St. Oscar Romero was an amazing man and a Moses figure for sure. He saw God in the burning bush and brought the flame of Gospel faith to the poorest of the poor, challenging the evils of the society in which he lived. He was tireless and persistent. He must have gotten very close to the problem because it cost him his life. He suspected it would. St. Romero said, "When we leave Mass, we ought to go out the way Moses descended Mt Sinai: with his face shining, with his heart brave and strong to face the world's difficulties." We can learn from this wisdom. If we allow the power of the Mass to truly transform us, we will leave that holy encounter changed. Our face will shine, and we will have courage. We can then bring what we have received to life's challenges. That sounds doable, doesn't it? Because of the example of our simple holiness, people will be amazed.

We are taking every reasonable precaution to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in our churches and protect parishioners. Those who attend Mass or other services without a mask and without a valid exemption are violating municipal and provincial COVID-19 restrictions and putting fellow parishioners at risk.



Per Bishop Fabbro, starting January 1, 2021, if you have a medical exemption for wearing a mask, you will be required to bring to the pastor evidence from your physician, nurse practitioner, social worker, psychologist or occupational, respiratory or physical therapist attesting to your condition. Once you do so, you will be provided a document to bring to Mass each time. When you register for Mass, please let them know you have been granted an exemption, so that you can be seated in a designated area.

We will still ask that you wear a mask briefly to enter and exit and to receive Communion, unless your disability prevents you from doing so. Those who refuse to comply with this diocesan regulation will be asked to leave and will not be permitted to attend Mass until they agree to wear a mask.

We are aware that this new protocol does go beyond the requirements in most health unit orders and local by-laws, but they are required to protect the safety of our parishioners, parish teams and volunteers while on church property. Infections continue to increase in our communities and small sacrifices like wearing a mask can slow the transmission of the virus, and are a sign of our love for our neighbours and help prevent people from taking advantage of the exemptions for personal reasons.

Please note that face shields and/or plastic masks are not an appropriate replacement for a face mask. From the Ontario.ca website regarding face shields:

Face shields do not replace masks or face coverings.

A face shield is used to protect the eyes of the person wearing it. Using a face shield without a mask won't protect:

- *You from potentially inhaling infectious respiratory droplets exhaled by others*
- *Others from your infectious respiratory droplets, as they can escape around the face shield*
