

We are also excited to introduce new prayer opportunities following our evening Masses to build up our faith. After consulting with the entire Parish Staff please find below the new weekday Mass schedule effective October 12, 2021: (Please note: The weekend Mass schedule remains the same).

- This schedule allows for an 8:00 AM Mass Tuesday to Friday (which is always very well attended) and for two evening Masses on Tuesday and Thursday nights which allows for those who work during the day to attend Mass.
- Having the evening Masses at 6:30 PM allows priests to attend various meetings (which could start at 7:15 pm) and gather the faithful for various prayer opportunities like adoration, Stations of the Cross, Confessions and other devotions.
- Due to holidays and other ministry responsibilities, the weekday Mass schedule needs to be set up so that one or two priests could cover all the celebrations.

There will be no Confessions at Blessed Sacrament on Saturday, October 2.

OUR LADY OF VICTORY & OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY CELEBRATION

Everyone is invited to attend a special bilingual (English & Polish) outdoor Mass at 9:00 AM followed by the Rosary that will take place on Saturday October 2 at Our Lady of Victory Parish. Please bring a mask (required for receiving Communion outside & in case of limited physical distancing outdoors) and a lawn chair. Be sure to physically distance to keep everyone safe. ***If there is inclement weather, we will celebrate inside the church with limited seating on a first come—first serve basis).

COVID-19 UPDATE - PROOF OF FULL VACCINATION

Due to the latest "proof of vaccination" regulations that came into effect on September 22, 2021 any use of parish halls, meeting rooms or ancillary spaces (not including areas used for worship) will require everyone participating to prove their full vaccination unless they have a medical exemption (requiring a doctor's note) and people under 12 years old.

***Please note that all our Masses, funerals, confessions, baptisms, weddings and any other liturgical celebrations do not need proof of full vaccination. We continue with what we have been doing the last several months.

What does this mean for us in our family of parishes? 1. This means that the parish staff will continue to offer ministry and connect with various groups and committees mainly online. 2. We will continue to gather for Mass and other various celebrations following the current mask and physical distancing regulations. 3. We will continue to serve all those in need and support one another during this challenging time.

"THE COMEBACK"

MESSAGE SERIES

MOUNTING A "COMEBACK"


Last week I preached the first of a three homily message series called "THE COMEBACK". I shared what a message series was



and how we are overwhelmed by many serious storms in our lives, world and Church. These real and seemingly insurmountable challenges may make us feel completely helpless. They may just be too big for us to bounce back from—at least on our own— but with God and each other, I truly believe that we can mount a comeback to change the world.

LAST & SERVANT OF ALL

In last Sunday's gospel, Jesus told the disciples that to be the greatest, we must be last of all and servant of all. We need to be humble, trusting, loving and always



Our world doesn't really acknowledge or celebrate being last and all of us so often look to be served rather than to serve. This is because we are so often wrapped up in what we need and want never looking beyond that and never seeing the bigger picture of life.

Jesus offers us a different path for true "success" in our lives. It isn't all about what we can take in this life—but about what we give and how we care for one another. This is the key to mounting our "comeback" from the storms, challenges and struggles today. This is how we offer light in darkness, joy in sorrow, hope in despair and life in the face of death.

In order for us to get back on course, to follow the right path and calm the storms in the world, we need to adapt, modify and change working

together bringing Christ's loving presence through who we are and what we have.

A NEED FOR DISCIPLINE & THE BIGGER PICTURE

In the first homily of the series I offered many different examples of

"comebacks". In all these circumstances the comebacks needed a response that saw the bigger picture. They didn't simply react to the storms but wanted to forever silence them for the sake of moving forward. Rocky Balboa eliminated distractions to train harder, the Boston Bruins did not play out of desperation but adapted their strategy to create scoring chances against the Leafs, Terry Fox refused to be pushed to the sidelines because

of cancer, Nelson
Mandela offered
reconciliation
after 27 years of
imprisonment and
St. John Paul II
offered mercy
and hope to his
would-be
assassin.

In the gospel this Sunday, Jesus tells us that if there

are things that cause us to sin, take us off track, distract us from what is most important or blind us to the needs of others we need to change. To truly mount a "comeback" in the midst of the many storms, we can't react but we need to respond like Jesus—filled with mercy, peace and grace.

For us to do this we need the discipline of an athlete eliminating bad habits and distractions so that we can harness the strength to overcome the challenges and darkness in our world. How can we do this?

(1) PERSONAL PRAYER

In order to be like Jesus today, we need to know Him. A regular daily personal prayer life allows us to open our hearts to Christ. Prayer is much more about listening than speaking. Through our prayer the Lord can give

us strength, advice and guidance to be a shining light of hope constantly encouraging us to be last and servant of all.

(2) THE EUCHARIST

Just like any athlete who needs to eat healthy food to have energy and be strong, we need the Eucharist, the Bread of Life, as food for the journey so we become what we eat.

(3) RECONCILIATION

If we are going to respond with mercy, grace and hope and not simply react—we need to experience mercy and love in our own lives. The Sacrament of Reconciliation offers us true change helping us "comeback" from the darkness of sin into the light of grace.

(4) FAITH IN ACTION (SERVICE)

If we are going to respond with God's grace seeing the bigger picture in our "comebacks" we need to go beyond ourselves and help be change for those who are in need. Being hope and love for others helps us be transformed too. There are many opportunities in our faith community and beyond to meet Christ in those who are suffering. Will we make the time?

(5) EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

It is very important for all of us to search our hearts taking stock of what we spend our time doing and where we spend our money. Do we need to change our priorities? Do we spend enough time with our family and friends? Are we preoccupied with our own wants and needs? What is missing in our lives? What do we value most? Regular examinations of conscience help us prune those things that take us away from God and one another. It helps us grow into the disciples we are all called to be.

(6) COMMUNITY

We need each other—we cannot mount a comeback alone. Our faith community is not only a place for us to receive the sacraments but the source of strength, united together through Christ. It is the place where we support, care and encourage one another (especially in the midst of the pandemic). We respond with mercy, love, peace and hope together as a safe harbour in the storms.

DEACON'S PEN

Fr. Richard Rohr, in his Daily Meditation for this past Tuesday tells us very clearly that "In most nations today, our moral compass has been thrown off its foundations." This is certainly true in our beloved Canada. Actions that were once understood to be serious moral wrongs - grave sins - are now very often considered to be acceptable behaviour! This is especially true of our various levels of government and many other powerful organizations!

In our Gospel this weekend, Jesus uses hyperbole to encourage us to think seriously about what causes us to sin. He does not want us to cut off our hand or our foot, or to gouge out an eye! He wants us to spend quality time pondering those influences in our lives that cause us to commit evil and to sin! We are all so easily convinced by the evil forces in this world to commit every nature and kind of evil and sin.

Jesus is telling us to grow up, and to eliminate from our lives every influence that causes us to sin, or to think evil and sinful thoughts! He is calling us to make eternal salvation our highest priority! He is calling us to actively seek to live in His Kingdom here and now and for all eternity! This necessarily means rooting out the causes of evil and sin in our lives!

As the opening reflection in the Living with Christ Missalette for this Sunday reminds us: He is calling us to ask what do I do with my hands, see with my eyes, feed into my mind, or speak with my tongue that leads me to sin? Spend the time, every day, rooting these out, confessing them, and then taking seriously our promise to avoid even the proximate occasion of sin! Then, on a regular basis, attend the Sacrament of Reconciliation and hear, through Jesus' representative (the Priest), that our sins have been forgiven and forgotten by Almighty God!
