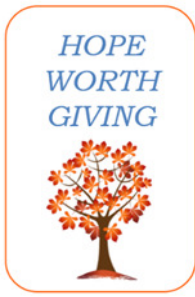

COVID-19 UPDATE - PROOF OF FULL VACCINATION

Due to the latest “proof of vaccination” regulations that came into effect on September 22, 2021 any use of parish halls, meeting rooms or ancillary spaces (**not including areas used for worship**) will require everyone participating to prove their full vaccination unless they have a medical exemption (requiring a doctor’s note) and people under 12 years old.

*****Please note that all our Masses, funerals, confessions, baptisms, weddings and any other liturgical celebrations do not need proof of full vaccination. We continue with what we have been doing the last several months.**

2. We will continue to gather for Mass and other various celebrations following the current mask and physical distancing regulations.

Statement of Apology by the Catholic Bishops of Canada to the Indigenous Peoples of This Land

We, the Catholic Bishops of Canada, gathered in Plenary this week, take this opportunity to affirm to you, the Indigenous Peoples of this land, that we acknowledge the suffering experienced in Canada's Indian Residential Schools. Many Catholic religious communities and dioceses participated in this system, which led to the suppression of Indigenous languages, culture and spirituality, failing to respect the rich history, traditions and wisdom of Indigenous Peoples. We acknowledge the grave abuses that were committed by some members of our Catholic community; physical, psychological, emotional, spiritual, cultural, and sexual. We also sorrowfully acknowledge the historical and ongoing trauma and the legacy of suffering and challenges faced by Indigenous Peoples that continue to this day. Along with those Catholic entities which were directly involved in the operation of the schools and which have already offered their own heartfelt apologies¹, we², the Catholic Bishops of Canada, express our profound remorse and apologize unequivocally.

We are fully committed to the process of healing and reconciliation. Together with the many pastoral initiatives already underway in dioceses across the country, and as a further tangible expression of this ongoing commitment, we are pledging to undertake fundraising in each region of the country to support initiatives discerned locally with Indigenous partners. Furthermore, we invite the Indigenous Peoples to journey with us into a new era of reconciliation, helping us in each of our dioceses across the country to prioritize initiatives of healing, to listen to the experience of Indigenous Peoples, especially to the survivors of Indian Residential Schools, and to educate our clergy, consecrated men and women, and lay faithful, on Indigenous cultures and spirituality. We commit ourselves to continue the work of providing documentation or records that will assist in the memorialization of those buried in unmarked graves.

Having heard the requests to engage Pope Francis in this reconciliation process, a delegation of Indigenous survivors, Elders/knowledge keepers, and youth will meet with the Holy Father in Rome in December 2021. Pope Francis will encounter and listen to the Indigenous participants, so as to discern how he can support our common desire to renew relationships and walk together along the path of hope in the coming years. We pledge to work with the Holy See and our Indigenous partners on the possibility of a pastoral visit by the Pope to Canada as part of this healing journey.

We commit ourselves to continue accompanying you, the First Nations, Métis and Inuit Peoples of this land. Standing in respect of your resiliency, strength and wisdom, we look forward to listening to and learning from you as we walk in solidarity.

My Apology to the Indigenous Peoples of this Land

On 24 September 2021, at the conclusion of our Plenary Assembly, the Bishops of Canada issued a statement to you, the Indigenous Peoples of this land, acknowledging the suffering of those who attended Canada's Indian Residential Schools as well as the intergenerational trauma and the tragic legacy of suffering that Indigenous people continue to experience. The whole system of the residential schools did not respect the languages, culture and spirituality of Indigenous Peoples but sought rather to suppress them. The Bishops acknowledge that the Catholic religious orders and dioceses which ran these schools participated in this system, and that terrible abuses were committed in them by some of these Catholics. In their statement, the Catholic Bishops of Canada express their profound remorse and apologize unequivocally.

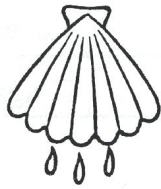
In solidarity with the Bishops of Canada, I too want to acknowledge the grave harm afflicted on you, the Indigenous Peoples of this land, to express to you my profound sorrow and to offer my own unequivocal apology to you. With the Bishops of Canada, I am committed to the process of healing and reconciliation across the country and here in the Diocese of London.

As an expression of our continuing commitment to healing and reconciliation, we will take the following actions in the Diocese of London:

1. Conversations with local Indigenous communities: We will continue conversations that have already been taking place with band members at Walpole Island and Aamjiwnaang First Nation. These conversations and others give us an opportunity to learn from local Indigenous communities how best we can journey with them on the road of truth and reconciliation and could also provide a platform for educational opportunities.
2. Educational opportunities: Currently, there are some excellent educational opportunities in our diocese, such as the Truth and Reconciliation Speaker Series offered by the Springbank Catholic Family of Parishes in London and available virtually to all in our diocese. We will continue these conversations with local Indigenous communities to learn from them the educational process that is needed and are adding resources to a dedicated page on our website.
3. Service of Reparation: With guidance from local Indigenous communities, we will craft a "service of reparation" to express the suffering and the harm afflicted by the residential schools, to atone for the role our Church played in them and to seek God's guidance as we journey on the path of healing and reconciliation.
4. Collection of funds: Our diocese will develop a fundraising plan as our contribution to the nation-wide collective financial commitment to support healing and reconciliation initiatives for residential school survivors, their families, and their communities announced by the Bishops of Canada on 27 September 2021. The allocation of funds raised in our diocese will involve the input of local Indigenous communities and will be part of our efforts to build good relationships and partnerships with them. We will also continue our financial commitment to the Diocese of Whitehorse, with its large Indigenous population.
5. A new committee to oversee this work: We will establish a committee to oversee these actions: the conversations, the educational pieces, the service of reparation, and the collection and distribution of funds. This committee would be named by the Bishop and report to the Bishop regularly. The work of healing and reconciliation is ongoing. The duration of this committee and the role it would play into the future, however, will need to be determined.

In union with the Bishops of Canada, I commit the Diocese of London to accompany you, the Indigenous Peoples of this land, on the journey of healing and reconciliation. I realize that there is much more work to do in our diocese, but I know that "we look forward to listening and learning from you as we walk in solidarity". Through the intercession of our Lady of Guadalupe, may God bless you and may our efforts bear fruit in abundance.

DEACON'S PEN

Even though my life has kept me busy with looking after the needs of my single daughter and her 4 boys as well as looking after the needs of my aging parents, I have managed to squeeze in time to help out at Outreach for Hunger, attend the Catholic School Board meetings as their chaplain and continue to provide service to our church community. I also set time aside to do some reading.

Here are a few examples.

1. *"Mercy- Life in the Season of Dying"* by Peter Roebbelen - So often in the presence of death the Christian response is to pray for healing so life will continue. Turning that action on its head, this book demonstrates that life and healing can actually be part of death both for those who are approaching the end of life on earth as well as for those who are walking with them.
2. *"Benedict XVI Last Testament - in his own words"* with Peter Seewald - In his own words the Pope Emeritus speaks explicitly about the reasons for his resignation, the emphases of his pontificate, about his admiration for his successor Pope Francis and controversial topics during his papacy such as Vatileaks, the clerical sex abuse scandals and reforming the Curia. Never before has Benedict XVI spoken in such a personal way about his faith, the current challenges for Christianity and the future of the Church.
3. *"Everybody Needs to Forgive Somebody"* by Allen R. Hunt - This little book and the twelve real-life stories in it, will help you capture the power of forgiveness in your life. Because everybody needs to forgive somebody.
