

FAMILY UPDATE FROM FR. JOHN

DIOCESE OF LONDON VACCINATION POLICY



On October 18, 2021 Bishop Fabbro promulgated the temporary COVID-19 vaccination policy for clergy, lay ecclesial ministers, staff and volunteers in the Diocese of London. DIOCESE OF You can read <u>Bishop Fabbro's letter</u> explaining the policy and the policy itself via the diocesan website.

In addition, Bishop Fabbro has mandated all visitors including any independent contractors to any diocesan, parish or cemetery office to provide proof of full vaccination if present for more than 15 minutes. ***Please note that the vaccination policy for those attending Masses, does not apply baptisms, funerals, weddings or other liturgical celebrations.

The policy does apply to all volunteers in the family of parishes—this includes Mass hosts, musicians/cantors, lectors, Eucharistic ministers and outreach volunteers. I want to thank everyone who has already dropped off or emailed me proof of vaccination. The deadline for volunteers to submit proof of vaccination is December 2, 2021.

Volunteers who for whatever reason choose not to provide a proof of full vaccination will need to temporarily step aside from volunteer ministry until the policy is rescinded by Bishop Fabbro. I hope and pray that once the policy is no longer in effect, those volunteers will return to serve in our parishes.

The pandemic has been a very challenging time for all of us and I know that there are some that disagree with Bishop Fabbro's temporary vaccination policy. None of this is easy or taken lightly. Diocesan officials are following the advice from the provincial Ministry of Health and regional health authorities. I ask for your patience and understanding as we all try our best to keep everyone safe, especially the most vulnerable during this global crisis.

This coming Thursday we take time to stop, pause and remember all those men and women who placed their lives in harms way for freedom and peace all over the world. Remembrance Day is also a time to




pray for peace, that all nations may resolve conflicts through dialogue and mutual understanding.

DEACON'S PEN

"When is enough, enough?" Is the question many ask themselves when giving to help others through charity or their church. Jesus helps us understand that the act of giving should never be questioned - it should be a natural tendency. A poor lady, gives more than she can afford, more than she has. Why give to our church? Not because it is time to save bricks and mortar or keep priests or staff alive. It is because we give as a gift to Jesus - it helps us be with Jesus and to do Jesus' work.

We give in Jesus' name because we want to, to help others, as another method of prayer, to be one with Jesus - we do so out of respect. Giving is better than receiving. It always makes one more satisfied. Giving at church is not the act of paying admission, paying to occupy a seat. Just as Jesus sacrificed himself for us, we can sacrifice for him, whether Church is open or not! It would be perfect if all gave because it is an act of charity and an act of paying tribute to Jesus. While it could be seen as a sacrifice, it would be better to be seen as a free will gift. That is what the poor lady in Jesus message was doing - giving a gift - a gift she couldn't afford.

In reading this gospel, Jesus is not suggesting we starve ourselves to give to charity, but that we use sensible and sensitive consideration to share our good fortune with others. Our donation to the Church is a gift to Jesus, to help undertake the spiritual works that he started. It is also an offering or a penance for our sinfulness, atonement for all the times we aren't Christ like. Historically, that is what offering a sacrifice at the altar of our God was about. Spiritual love should never stop; neither should giving.
