

FAMILY UPDATES FROM FR. JOHN

(1) WORDS OF GRATITUDE!!

I want to once again thank the family of parishes staff, Mass Hosts, decorators, musicians/cantors and liturgical ministers for all their hard work during the Christmas season!! All of our celebrations were wonderful



despite the challenges of the pandemic. Fr. Dariusz, Fr. Robert and I were kept very busy and enjoyed every minute of it rejoicing in the birth of our Lord and Saviour with all of you. It was a true blessing to celebrate our first Christmas in Chatham with all of you—both in person and those who joined us online.

(2) COVID-19 UPDATES FROM THE DIOCESE



This past week we received a new update from Bishop Dabrowski and the Diocese of London in response to the very contagious Omicron variant and the new provincial rules. You can read the full letter from Bishop Dabrowski at the diocesan website (www.dol.ca) Here are a few key points for the letter:

- (a) Capacity limits remain the same but we are reminded to maintain physical distancing and properly wear masks to keep everyone safe.
- (b) For the 21 day period of the latest provincial restrictions—congregational singing is suspended. We will once again listen to the hymns sung and speak the Mass parts together.
- (c) Staff will be working remotely unless they need to be in the office to complete their work. This means that the office will be closed. We will monitor phone calls and emails doing our best to respond as quickly as possible.
- (d) Parish halls and meeting rooms continue to be closed with the exceptions for social services like Alcoholics Anonymous, our outreach services to those in need and money counters. Our outreach volunteers and money counters are limited to a maximum of five people per gathering.

I know that the pandemic has caused great difficulties for so many people. This has been a very long and challenging journey. We are all tired and frustrated. We need to hang on to the light and joy of Christmas continuing to do everything we can to support one another during this time. We need extra patience, and understanding being attentive to those who are isolated, afraid or feel forgotten.

(3) SYNOD - A TIME FOR THE CHURCH TO LISTEN

synod is gathering of bishops from across the world that takes place every two to three years at the Vatican to discuss various topics important for the Church and the world. During the pontificate of Pope



Francis, synod topics have included youth and the family.

The latest synod which officially started in October 2021 is very different. Pope Francis wants global consultation from the laity and clergy seeking reflection and input from all of us in parishes and dioceses. He is asking us to look at how we as a Church together share and live the Good News. This synod is not concerned with a particular topic but how we as a Church shine the light of Christ together. It is no longer a one month meeting in Rome but a two year process of consultation that will begin in February for us in Chatham and the other parishes in the Diocese of London.

More details will follow. I want to thank Fr. Robert, who will be facilitating the consultation process in our family of parishes.

Bishop Fabbro said in a letter on December 10, 2021:

"The Church cares about what you think! I encourage you to enter into this process as it is announced and promoted in your parish or institution. Let us all join together in prayer that our experience in this consultation will not only provide local contributions but strengthen us in our desire to be missionary disciples of Jesus."

Below is a quote from a Salt+Light article written by Julian Paparella, a young person formerly from St. George Parish in London and a special advisor for the Synod of Bishops in Rome:

"Through this synod, the Church is saying: the voice of EVERYONE matters because God can talk through ANYONE -- not only bishops, priests, deacons, brothers, or sisters but ALL OF US! Pope Francis has stated that this collaborative, inclusive approach of synodality is precisely the "the path that God expects of the Church in the third millennium." This is truly a revolution of the Holy Spirit towards the Church that God is calling us to be for tomorrow, starting today!"

DEACON'S PEN

I would just like to wish you all a Happy New Year!!

It was so wonderful to see so many people I haven't seen for such a long time over the Christmas Holidays.

It was just a little over two weeks ago that we were celebrating the birth of Jesus, and now we are at his baptism. For us it is not uncommon to baptize young babies. I was eleven days old when I was baptized. In the life of Jesus, around 30 years have passed. So why are we looking at this Gospel today?

The event of Jesus' Baptism is told in all 4 Gospels, as well as in the Acts of the Apostles. So why is this event so important?

The Jewish tradition of the time was that no one should function as a teacher until he completed his thirtieth year. Jesus' baptism was the first step of his ministry, or, more precisely, as being the immediate preparation for his public life. The baptism is significant; it means the manifestation, (epiphany), of Jesus as the Messiah of Israel and the Son of God, and his acceptance of, and the first step taken in, his mission as "suffering Servant."

For us, Christ's baptism is also a sign of the world's reconciliation with God.

Jesus' baptism, the adoration of the Magi, and the first miracle worked by our Lord, (at the wedding feast of Cana), are the first three formal manifestations of the divinity of Jesus Christ.

If things ever get back to normal, and we have water to bless ourselves with when we enter church, that action is a reminder of our own baptism.


GOSPEL REFLECTION

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.
