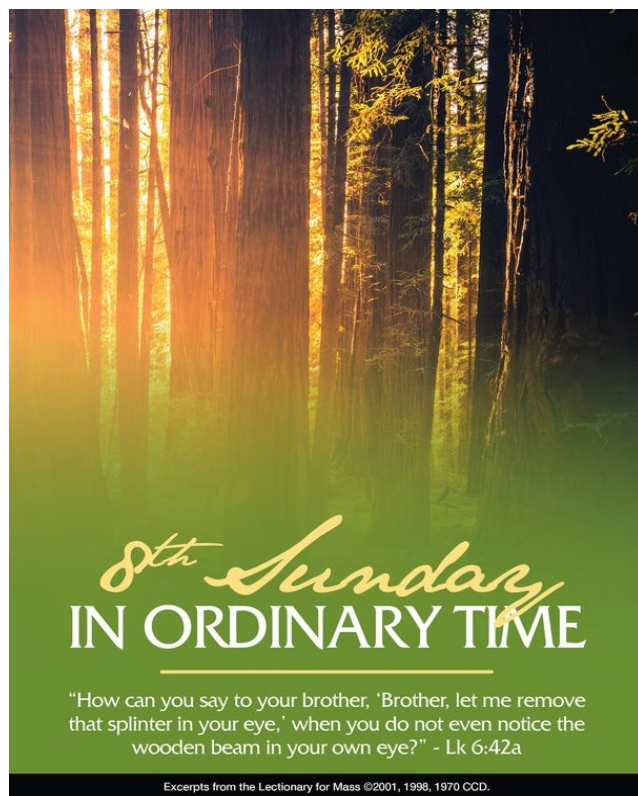

# STUDENTS NOT MASTERS

## WE NEED TO LISTEN BETTER

This weekend I continue my latest message series (homily series) called **CAN YOU HEAR ME NOW?** This four part homily series is a chance for all of us to look at how we can listen better and more to God and one another. This way we can truly be faithful disciples who tear down walls, heal divisions and share the Good News in our world.

## DISCIPLES NOT MASTERS

In order for us to really listen with our minds and hearts to God and to each other, we need to remember that we are not the masters but disciples and students of the one Master—our Lord Jesus Christ. This means that we are always looking to learn new things and realize that we do not know everything.

In the gospel this weekend Jesus says, **“A disciple is not above the teacher, but everyone who is fully qualified will be like their teacher.”** The role of our faith communities is to train, educate and empower all of us to be like the teacher, willing to offer our lives for the sake of those who are in need. We come to worship and celebrate as one family in order that we

together can be images of Christ in our families, work places and the world. We are not the masters but students who seek to be Jesus in our world by the way we serve, forgive and sacrifice each day without hesitation or judgement. We are all trying to help build the kingdom of God one action at a time.

## BLINDNESS IN OUR LIVES

One of the challenges that we all face is the fact that we think we can do everything on our own. We get caught in the trap of completely relying on ourselves and not God and others who can help us in our journey to heaven. We forget that we are students of the master so often eager to direct, criticize and condemn others while thinking we are perfect. We have a common journey and mission requiring each other.

Being a student of Christ means that we must be humble, gentle and realize that we need Jesus and others in our lives. This not only for our own benefit, but for the world to encounter Christ. Jesus states in the gospel this weekend, **“Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit?”** In order for us to truly see and listen in our world, we need open minds, hearts and lives knowing that we do not know everything. We all need healing, grace and love so that we may see most fully what we need to change in our lives while seeing how we can help those around us.

## ARE WE PASSING THE TEST?

Of course if we are students, this means that we have tests and exams to pass showing our progress. This happens for us in our faith lives as well. If we are disciples of the Lord and students of the one Master, we are formed into His likeness for the sake of our world today. How can we know if we are on the right path and following our Divine Teacher? We can see by the good works that we produce each day. We hear Jesus again in this weekend’s gospel as he says,

**“Out of the good treasure of the heart, the good person produces good, and out of evil treasure, the evil person produces evil; for it is out of the abundance of the heart that the mouth speaks.”**

These are powerful words that remind us that to truly listen requires a conversion of heart to what God wants and a

surrendering of what we want. It is from the heart that we produce either good or bad in our world. We just need to look at what we are doing and ask ourselves these helpful questions:

- (1) Am I making the people around me better or worse?
- (2) Is what I say helping build people up or tear them down?
- (3) How many things that I do each day are for me or to help others?

Let us open our hearts to the Lord’s healing grace so that we can truly see ourselves as empowered students who are like the Master---called to share and live the Gospel each day to help transform the world.

**To: All the Faithful of the Diocese of London**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am pleased to bring you updates on the progress of the Truth and Reconciliation Committee of the Diocese of London which I established last fall and on some of the ongoing efforts of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops.

- Our local Committee has been able to meet three times, virtually, and they are currently compiling a list of resources that our parishes and faith communities may find helpful in their pursuit to better understand the legacy of Canada's residential school system. Their hope is to provide a variety of resources, appropriate to various ages and backgrounds.
- Responding to the actions called for by the final report of Canada's Truth and Reconciliation Commission, our own Committee is developing resources for distribution to parishes and other opportunities for both education and formation. Its hope is to provide an opportunity for our clergy, lay ecclesial ministers and staff to better understand the issues our nation faces, while considering how our parishes might cooperate as agents of reconciliation.
- Last month, on 28 January, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops announced that it will establish a new registered charity to support and advance healing and reconciliation initiatives. The charity is expected to manage the Indigenous Reconciliation Fund, which will accept contributions from 73 dioceses across Canada to fulfill the \$30-million financial commitment made by Canada's Bishops in September. The commitment of the Diocese of London to this fund is \$1,800,000 over the next five years.

Any administrative costs will be on top of the \$30-million being raised and will not be deducted from this principal amount. Independent auditors will foster transparency in this work.

The Bishops intend the funds to contribute to the following priorities:

- Healing and reconciliation for communities and families
- Culture and language revitalization
- Education and community building
- Dialogues for promoting Indigenous spirituality and culture

I have asked the Truth and Reconciliation Committee of the Diocese to assist me in reviewing and assessing requests made by individuals or groups. The Committee will continue to work with me on goals, objectives and the manner by which it will review and assess requests.

- The delegation to Rome of Indigenous Elders and leaders, which had been delayed by the pandemic, is now scheduled to meet with Pope Francis the week of 28 March 2022. A final audience with all participants will take place on Friday, 1 April 2022.

There is a recognition that any authentic healing will take time, but the preliminary work that is being done and the accomplishments of our diocesan Committee are positive steps forward. We pray that God, who in Jesus has embodied reconciliation, may bring this work to fruition in our Diocese and across our country.

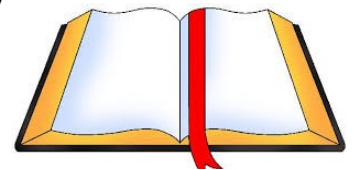

We can’t remove it on our own for we need the grace of Christ, the strengthening of the sacraments and the support of a loving community. With that grace, strength and support we can truly become a people who not only “talk the talk” but also “walk the walk.”

## **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

What we say and how we say it reveals the true intentions of our hearts. The content and manner of our speech is a window into the recesses of our souls. Our consciences, attitudes, sentiments, weaknesses, and motives are displayed. As much as we think we can hide the truth of our lives from others, we cannot. Who we really are is not only expressed on our lips but is written on our faces. Jesus says precisely this, "For every tree is known by its own fruit." What does the fruit of our lives say about us?

Because we like to play the game of hide and seek with ourselves, in pretending that we are hiding we deflect attention others may give to us by becoming more critical of others. After all, the more time one can spend analyzing others' behavior the less time one has to look at his or herself. Often, the behaviors we abhor most in others are the very ones we are guilty of ourselves. We just don't know it yet. The more we put ourselves in the role of a judge, the more satisfaction and control we seem to achieve. Yet, what about ourselves? In focusing our attention on the beams in others' eyes, the aridity and barrenness of our lives goes unchecked. St. Ambrose reminds us that "no one heals himself by wounding another." Bringing our brothers and sisters down by being overly critical, serves no positive purpose.

But the one who knows how easy it is to fall into sin and weakness and how quickly errors in judgment can be made, knows the depth of true compassion, mercy, and kindness. Having recognized our own poor choices, misguided opinions, negative emotions, and ability to do horrendous things, we can be more sympathetic and understanding of where others may be. We are designed to be mentors and guides to one another. In walking the journey together, we can help each other become the best we can be. Humility is the order of the day and the primary virtue that prevents us from being hypocrites.
