It is a place of grace, love and of course mercy! One day soon I hope to organize another pilgrimage to Poland and visit the shrine again. It is a great sign of hope in our world.


WHAT IS DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY?

The Feast of Divine Mercy is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter (Sunday April 24 this year) which concludes the Octave of Easter. This feast is based on the devotion to Divine Mercy that St. Faustina Kowalska (a Polish nun and saint) reported as part of her encounter with Jesus, and is associated with special promises (2) or in the Presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or from Jesus and plenary indulgences declared by the Church.

St. Faustina had personal visions and visitations from Jesus and had conversations with him. He asked her to paint the vision of his merciful love being poured out from his Sacred Heart and RECEIVING AND SHARING MERCY specifically asked for a feast of Divine Mercy be established on the refuge in him.

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The souls that go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment...It is my desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the First Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not SOME TIDBITS OF INFORMATION have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy."

(St. Faustina Diary 699)



St. John Paul II declared Divine Mercy Sunday during the homily for the canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska on April 30, 2000 in Rome. In his homily he said,

"Today my joy is truly great in presenting the life and witness of Sr. Faustina Kowalska to the whole church as a gift of God for our time...It is important then that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the word of God on this Second Sunday of Easter, which from now on throughout the Church will be

called 'Divine Mercy Sunday'"

St. John Paul II concludes his homily by saying:

"And you, Faustina, a gift of God to our time, a gift from the land of Poland to the whole Church, obtain for us an

awareness of the depth of divine mercy; help us to have a living experience of it and to bear witness to it among our brothers and sisters...Today, fixing our gaze with you on the face of the Risen Christ, let us make our own your prayer of trusting abandonment and say with firm hope: Christ Jesus, I trust in you!"

WHAT IS A PLENARY INDULGENCE?

St. John Paul II not only declared Divine Mercy Sunday a universal feast of the Church, but in 2002 he attached a plenary indulgence to it

offering special graces and blessings for the faithful. A plenary or full indulgence offers the faithful who fulfill certain conditions parishes have a strong and deep devotion to St. Faustina and God's immense mercy, forgiveness of sins and removes all temporal punishment for sins. There are many different ways to receive a plenary indulgence which includes those for Divine

The usual conditions for every plenary (full) indulgence:

- (1) Sacramental confession within about 20 days before or after
- (2) Reception of communion on the day or days before or after
- (3) Prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father

Here are the specific conditions for the Divine Mercy indulgence:

- (1) In any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honour of Divine Mercy
- reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (example—Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!)

Divine Mercy Sunday reminds us that we need to seek Christ's first Sunday after Easter Sunday so that humanity would take mercy through the gift of the Eucharist, the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the many different devotions that shower us with grace. Not only are we called to receive that love and mercy, but may it transform us to offer love, mercy and peace to those around us needing light and hope.

> Our celebration on Sunday April 24th at St. Joseph Church will include Divine Mercy devotions with the opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please mark your calendars and join us!! We will also be live-streaming this event.



Now little Johnny was sick on Palm Sunday and stayed home from Church with his mother. father returned from church holding a palm branch. Little Johnny was curious and asked why his father why he had a palm. His father explained, "You see, when Jesus came into town, everyone waved palm branches to honor him; so, we got palm branches today." "Aw, shucks," grumbled Little Johnny. "The one Sunday I can't go to Church, and Jesus shows up!"

The Church celebrates both Palm Sunday and Passion Sunday at the same time. Today's liturgy combines contrasting moments of glory (the royal welcome given to Jesus by his followers), and suffering (the drama of his unjust trial, culminating in his crucifixion). Holy Week challenges us to remember and relive the events which brought about our redemption and salvation, to appreciate gratefully the price Jesus paid for our salvation, and to return God's love for us, expressed through the suffering and death of Jesus, by loving others. Our meditation on these Paschal mysteries should assist us in our dying to sin and rising with Jesus, resulting in our healing, reconciliation, and redemption. participation in the Holy Week liturgy will also deepen our relationship with God, increase our faith and strengthen our lives as disciples of Jesus.
