\$10,000 ROOF FUND DONATION!!



I want to express my sincerest thanks to the Polish Club of Chatham for their recent generous donation of \$10,000 towards the roof fund at Our Lady of Victory Church. The flat roof that spans the hall, kitchen, side entrance, sacristy and washrooms is in need of replacement. It will be replaced this summer with a company from Windsor that has been contracted for the project. The total cost of the roof replacement will be around \$60,000.

TWO NEW PASTORAL TEAM MEMBERS

As we develop a new pastoral vision of forming disciples who reach out to all and rebuild following the last two years of the pandemic—we as a family of parishes need to move forward with new, dynamic and relevant ministries, programs and outreach that changes lives. The unfortunate realities of the pandemic allowed us to pause and reflect on what we were doing and why we were doing it. It has helped us realize that we need to renew our efforts as disciples in new ways to engage our culture and world.

Through ongoing conversations and planning with the family staff, adding sufficient members to the Family Pastoral Council and Family Finance Committee from all the parishes seeking their wisdom and guidance, we now need to move forward guided by the Holy Spirit to share the Good News.

As we move forward to resume various ministries and programs in addition to starting new ones, we as a staff need more support and leadership. As you may remember, in the last year we had Karen Robert, a pastoral minister, leave parish ministry and Rodger Luxton, our business manager, retired.

After consultation and support from the family staff, Pastoral Council and Finance Committee, it is with great pleasure that I introduce two new people to our pastoral team as unpaid volunteer staff members.

(1) FUNERAL SUPPORT LEADER

We welcome Marie Harrison as our new Funeral Support Leader. Marie has been assisting at funeral celebrations in our parishes for many years. Her main responsibilities will include the following:

- Assist the priest/deacon in organizing all funeral Masses in the family
- Lead and coordinate all Mass hosts (greeters), servers and commentators for all our funerals
- Make connections for families and luncheon teams
- Ensure proper set up of each church site for funeral celebrations
- Lead, train and support all the ministries involved with funeral celebrations in our family of parishes

(2) FAMILY & YOUTH MINISTRY LEADER

We welcome Patty Coenen as our new Family & Youth Ministry Leader. Patty has an extensive background as a former youth coordinator in our diocese in addition to being our Video Team Leader. Patty is the Community Life Facilitator with the Ursuline Sisters here in Chatham. Her main responsibilities will include the following:

- Organize and coordinate various family and youth events in our family of parishes
- Recruit, support and train volunteers for our family and youth events/ministries
- Assist in the outreach to our Catholic schools and sacramental families

Due to the significant financial challenges we are facing as a family of parishes, it is not currently possible to hire paid staff members. I am extremely thankful to Marie and Patty for their overwhelming willingness to take on these leadership roles as volunteers. When I invited them to consider these roles they immediately responded so enthusiastically!! This will definitely help us move forward as we seek to be missionaries of hope in our world today.

All of us will get to know Marie, Patty and the rest of the staff more in the weeks and months ahead as we develop our pastoral plan seeking your support, involvement and assistance.

As I am sure you all know, Pentecost is the official Birthday of the Church. On this day The Holy Spirit came to those in the Upper Room and they were filled with His power, and went and preached without fear to the whole of Jerusalem.

The usual theme of the Deacon's Pen is the Sunday Gospel. I would like to move ahead one day to the memorial of, "Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church." GOSPEL REFLECTION

Even though Pentecost is rightly celebrated in late spring, the robust experience of a New England fall can provide a profound metaphor for reflection. A full expression of fall colors is beautiful to behold. But, with all of its majesty and beauty, the observer knows the experience of death is soon to come. Creation will be dark and barren for a while. Pentecost cannot be separated from the cross. Before God's transformative, life-giving power can bear fruit, we must first die.

Pentecost is all about leaving the lifeless dead wood behind and allowing God, through the power of the Holy Spirit, to create something new. These Pentecost creations happen repeatedly over and over again. The birthing process of the Church is ongoing. God is always bringing life out of death and creating something where there was once nothing. That is why the fall is such an apropos metaphorical season for Pentecost. In order to really receive the gift of the Holy Spirit we have to die to what we once knew and what no longer works.

When fire and wind find their fullest expression, they are in no way gentle nor kind. They have the potential to level anything in their paths. We are experiencing great turmoil in our world, nation, and our Church. Whether the result of circumstance or the work of the Holy Spirit, much of what we knew to be normal and constant is changing. Common systems and institutional structures that may have worked for a time no longer do. When the old and familiar need to be left behind, God creates something new. Change and disorder do not need to be our enemies. They always bring opportunities for something exciting and new. What we need is untiring faith, firm hope, and perfect love.

What we need is for the Holy Spirit to enlighten us to see what is important and what we must do. *"O Holy Spirit, descend plentifully into my heart. Enlighten the dark corners of this neglected dwelling and scatter there Thy cheerful beams."* (St. Augustine) If we experience joy, even in the midst of turbulence, then we will know we are exactly where God needs us to be. If not, then perhaps there is a lesson in the decaying leaves that graciously descend to the ground on a crisp fall day.

COVID-19 UPDATE (UPDATE #26)

During the most recent meeting of the Episcopal Council, I reviewed with the Episcopal Vicars and Vicars General all of the protocols that are still in place with respect to our churches, halls and offices. **As of Monday, 6 June 2022, I hereby abrogate all the restrictions and expectations as found in all previous COVID-related directives with the exception of the following.**

1. Some Precautions for the General Public

Though the worst of COVID -19 seems to have passed, we are aware that there are still variants which arise from time to time and that there is still danger of the spread of the virus. Therefore, all are encouraged to continue to wear masks in public spaces such as churches and halls. In offices, sensitivity to those who may be immuno-compromised should be shown by a willingness to wear masks also in the public spaces of our offices.

It is prudent, as well, to continue to make hand sanitizer available in all of our buildings.

If a member of your staff, parish team, volunteer or a parishioner has symptoms of COVID-19 or has been exposed to someone with COVID-19, follow the directions, such as those given for isolation, on the website of your local health unit. There is no longer a need to report positive cases to the Diocesan Centre.

2. Dispensation from the Sunday Obligation Extended

The celebration of the Eucharist and other sacraments is central to our Catholic faith. Not only do we need to pray and hear the word of God together, but our participation in Holy Communion is the essential “food for our journey” as disciples of Jesus. For this reason, we need to encourage the faithful to return to the celebration of Mass, providing a warm welcome, good homilies and good music – really, good liturgies in general – the three points I have often highlighted when I have spoken with various groups.

Our Pastoral Services team is working with people across the Diocese to develop the “Nurturing Joy Initiative”. The idea is to have a diocesan-wide approach to welcoming all those who have continued to come to Mass during the pandemic and to encourage those who until now have been concerned about returning. In later stages of “Nurturing Joy”, we want to extend such a welcome to the “de-churched” (those who for any number of reasons have stopped coming to Mass and the sacraments) and the “un-churched” (those who have no affiliation with any Church or ecclesial community). This is a vital part of the work of evangelization and the *raison d’être* of the Church, to bring people to Jesus and to form them as disciples.

We realize, however, that many are still cautious and concerned about being in crowds, since COVID is still with us. As such, we want to be sensitive to their needs and to serve them in the best way possible. Therefore, the dispensation from the Sunday obligation is now extended to the last weekend of the summer vacation period, that is, until 6 September 2022. Unless a serious danger presents itself again at some future date, this will be the last extension. The removal of the dispensation will be confirmed before Labour Day.

3. Restrictions within the Mass

Mass should be celebrated as before the pandemic, according to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal.

There remain three restrictions, however, within the celebration of the Mass:

- People should be invited to exchange the Sign of Peace in such a way that people will still feel comfortable when not wishing to make actual contact.
- Communion from the Cup is not to be given to members of the congregation. Concelebrating priests must receive by intinction or from a separate cup; deacons, if served the Precious Blood, must be served from a separate cup. Intinction is not used for deacons or any members of the faithful.
- All ministers of Holy Communion must wear a mask for the distribution of Communion. As well, hand sanitizer must be used prior to distributing Communion and after any communicant receives Communion on the tongue.

4. Other Sacraments

All the sacraments are to be celebrated according to the rubrics in the ritual books. Sacraments may be celebrated within the context of the Mass.

Continued vigilance in our parishes has borne much fruit, and we are glad to see the lifting of these restrictions. With Bishop Dabrowski, I thank all our priests, pastoral teams and the many volunteers who have worked hard to make it possible for us to celebrate our faith under these restraints throughout the pandemic. May Our Blessed Mother and St. Patrick, our heavenly patrons, continue to intercede for us.
