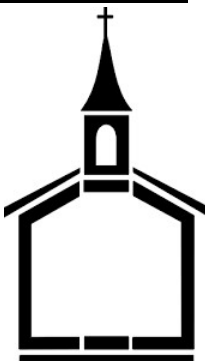

FAMILY UPDATES

NEW ROOF AT OUR LADY OF VICTORY CHURCH

The long awaited flat-roof replacement at Our Lady of Victory Church will be taking place in the next couple of weeks. As you may recall, the flat-roof covers the hall, kitchen, sacristy, side entrance and washroom areas. It has had leaks over the last few years and is at the end of life. After consultations with the OLV Building & Maintenance Committee, diocesan leadership and our Family of Parishes Finance Committee—we accepted a bid from Horizon Roofing in Windsor for this project.



I want to thank all those who have already made donations to the ROOF FUND at Our Lady of Victory. It is not too late to donate. The roof replacement costs will be around \$60,000. Many have already made donations including a \$10,000 donation from the Polish Club here in Chatham. There have also been a couple of fundraisers to help pay for the roof replacement. For those who would like to donate please make cheques out to Our Lady of Victory Church or e-transfer donations (sent to ourladyv@dol.ca) marked ROOF FUND.

I also want to thank Ben Kaminski, for the upgrade to the choir loft railing at Our Lady of Victory. This now makes the choir loft much safer and up to current provincial regulations.

SPIRIT & LIFE CENTRE UPDATES



(1) WATER DAMAGE—As you may know, we recently paid off the costs to replace the flat roof at the Spirit & Life Centre that began before my arrival to Chatham. The cost for the flat roof was about \$250,000. Funds raised by St. Joseph Church and St.

Ursula Church specifically for the maintenance and renovation of the centre were used to cover these costs.

Unfortunately, because of the roof deficiencies prior to the replacement, a large amount of flooding and water damage occurred on the second floor and basement. Due to the water damage, we are not able to use the basement and second floor. In addition, the water damage has resulted in growing mold and some asbestos breakdown that needs to be removed for safety reasons. Due to the mold we cannot use the air conditioning in the front meeting rooms on the main floor where the AA groups are

currently meeting (they cannot meet in the basement as they once did). The large hall and kitchen did not experience any water damage and can operate normally—including air conditioning since it is on a separate direct system.

Brian Elgie, our Plant Supervisor, Dino DiMurro, the Diocese of London Construction & Restoration Manager and I have met with a consultant to see what must be done. I have also met and discussed the situation with the Family Finance Committee. There is no question that the mold must be removed along with some of the damaged asbestos so that we can use as much of the building as possible for ministry and outreach.

Just this past week, we invited different companies to offer estimates for the work that needs to be done. We are awaiting for the official quotes but based on what I have been told by the consultant—it will exceed \$100,000. Further details and information will be shared when we receive it.

(2) SPIRIT & LIFE CENTRE PLANS—When I first arrived in Chatham, I spent some time talking to Rodger Luxton (our former Business Manager) and Deacon Chris Masterson, who gave me some background concerning the planned renovation of the centre. I also went back to read meeting minutes and other documentation to get a bigger picture of the project and potential of the building and how it was going to first serve the cluster of St. Joseph & St. Ursula and later revised for the family of parishes. I am also aware and thankful for those who donated to the Spirit & Life Centre Renovation Fund in the past and still do today—this support helps us maintain the building for ongoing ministry and outreach that is taking place.

Of course we know that the formation of the Chatham Catholic Family of Parishes changed how we as the five Catholic churches function now called to work together as one family. We are moving forward together seeking to be missionary disciples sharing the Gospel by reaching out.

A NEED FOR A BROADER PERSPECTIVE

What does this mean for the Spirit & Life Centre and the future of our family of parishes? I have been working with Pastoral Council, Finance Committee, Staff and Diocesan leadership putting together a process of broad listening/consultation with all parishioners in the new year to discern the future direction of our family moving forward with our new pastoral plan.

Together, we will have to discern how best we embrace this pastoral plan of forming disciples who reach out to all. This will invite us to consider what we will need to grow our family of parishes in the future and what we need to let go which prevents us from living out the Good News. More info to come.

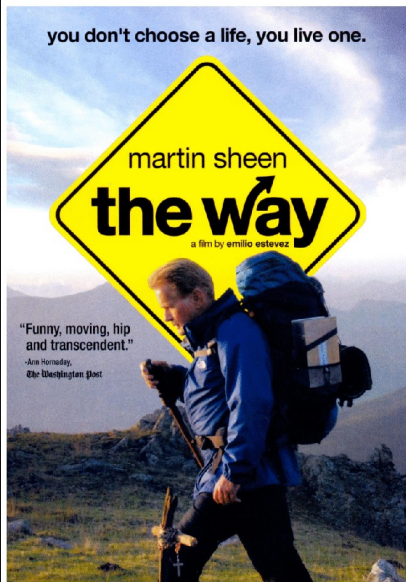


FAITH FILM SERIES

(at the Spirit & Life Centre)

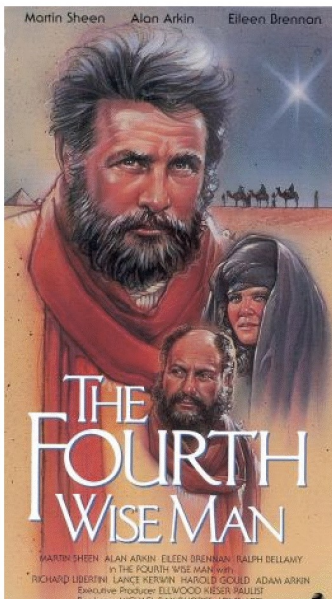

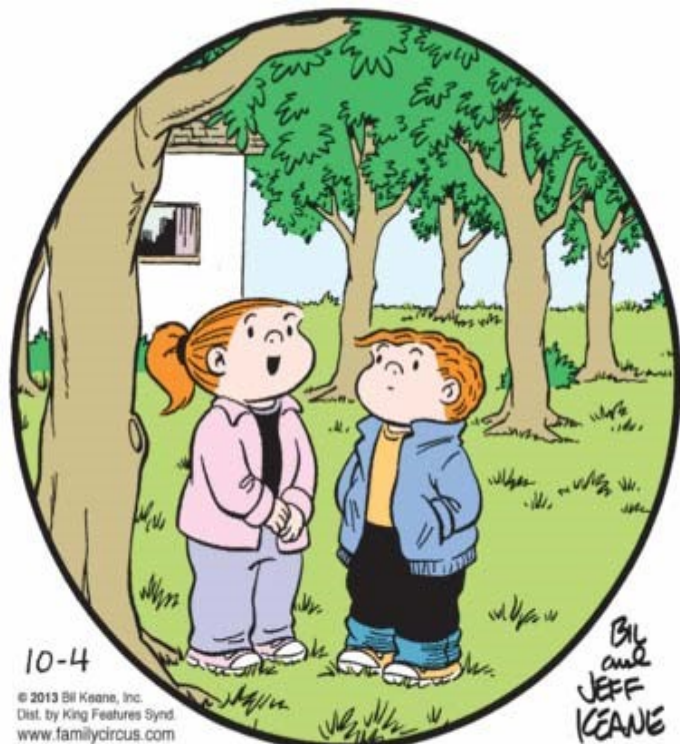
