Ignite the Mission

This weekend we officially begin the prayerful consultation and discernment process for the future of our Chatham Catholic Family of Parishes. I want to thank the Family Pastoral Council, Family Finance Committee and the Family Staff for their wisdom, support and dedication to our faith community in addition to their enthusiasm and hope for the future.

We enter into this process seeking to re-embrace a missionary and apostolic vision (see my article from the [February 12, 2023 bulletin](#)) that will shape the structure of our family of parishes. It is not just about closing churches, although that is definitely part of what is necessary but not the biggest component of the journey ahead.

Together, we need to prayerfully discover how we can most effectively adapt everything we do so that our world today can encounter Christ through us. This will require various sacrifices from all of us for the sake of proclaiming the Good News and future generations of Catholics in Chatham. Despite the challenges of the task ahead, I am excited at the opportunities that are before us.

(1) PRAYER

We begin our discernment journey with prayer. You will find in this weekend’s bulletin a prayer entitled **IGNITE THE GOSPEL**. We as a family of parishes will pray this regularly at our five churches in addition to asking all the faithful to pray it during personal prayer. We need to ask our Heavenly Father to send us the Holy Spirit so that we can have the courage and wisdom to become Apostles in our time. We all know that the power of prayer can move mountains. I believe that our prayer for the future mission of our family of parishes will open hearts to God’s will and not our own.

(2) IGNITE THE MISSION:

INTRODUCTION & GENERAL SUMMARY

You will also find a two page introduction and general summary of the current circumstances in our family of parishes. It highlights some of the challenges we face and the need for change. This insert is also being sent out to all registered parishioners via our LENT/EASTER mailout that you will be receiving shortly. We want as many people as possible to be involved in the discernment process.

(3) IGNITE THE MISSION: APOSTLES FOR A NEW ERA

This full, in-depth document is available for everyone at the back of each of the five churches of our family

in addition to the family of parishes website (www.chathamcatholic.ca).

This document is divided into three major sections. **Part One** reflects on the baptismal call that we share as missionaries of the Gospel—the heart of our Catholic faith. There are references to scripture, Church documents, Pope Francis and Bishop Fabbro. This section answers the question — **WHAT IS OUR MISSION?**

Part Two describes the circumstances and challenges we face as a family of parishes in 2023. There are a number of factors that we all need to be aware of as we discern the future. Statistics from the family of parishes in addition to information about Chatham-Kent and Canada are included. This section answers the question — **WHERE ARE WE RIGHT NOW?**

Part Three describes the planned response to form disciples who reach out to all. The pastoral plan is not general in nature, but has clear definitions of what a disciple should be and how we will reach out bringing Christ to the world. This pastoral plan was developed by the Pastoral Council, Finance Committee and Family Staff. The implementation of this plan has already begun. This section answers the question—**HOW ARE WE GOING TO BE APOSTLES IN THIS NEW ERA?**



(4) SHARING SESSIONS

We are inviting parishioners to pray, read the documents/resources provided via the bulletin and website and then gather to share/listen. We will be hosting **SHARING SESSIONS** throughout March seeking feedback on the three following questions (which I will share more about in next week’s bulletin).

- What are the essential elements for our family of parishes to be a vibrant, relevant and mission focused faith community?
- What are the blessings and challenges in our family of parishes today?
- What decisions do we need to make so that we can most effectively fulfill our mission to form disciples who reach out to all?

People will be able to complete feedback forms at the **SHARING SESSIONS**, via the family website and at home with forms available at each church site. **SHARING SESSIONS** dates/times/locations are available in the bulletin this weekend.

So the **TIME IS NOW**—I know that together we will become what God wants us to be as instruments of love, peace, hope and Christ for Chatham and the world.

IGNITE THE MISSION

Introduction & General Summary



Our Mission

We as baptized Catholics are called to live out the mission given to us by Jesus, from Matthew 28:18-20, *“Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”* Pope Francis has reinforced this as he dreams of a “missionary option” where the parish plays a key role reaching out to others. Bishop Fabbro in a 2015 document on the “Future Directions for People and Parishes of the Diocese of London” says *“In order for our parishes to be faithful to all that they are called to be, they must be constantly renewed. We have to study the signs of times.”*

The Chatham Catholic Family of Parishes **MUST** change and adapt to engage our society today bringing people most fully to the love of Christ through His Church!

Our Three Biggest Problems, and a Fourth!

While we are called to go forth strengthened by our parish life, the first problem is the number of active parishioners is in decline. We are not alone, other Families of Parishes are experiencing this and dealing with the second problem--declining collections. The third major problem is the declining number of priests available to serve! For parishioners and clergy, the average age is rapidly increasing. To make the priest and parishioner situation more real, many of us attending Mass now will not be on this earth in fifteen years!

The fourth problem is that we have too many buildings that are becoming too costly to maintain! What funds we do have need to be used offering ministries, programs and outreach that help all of us be Christ for one another.

If you were running a business, what would you do?

At Least Two Solutions

(1) We need to become more of a missionary church, reaching out and transforming lives. This requires adequate staff, volunteer ministers and financial resources--all of which are in short supply currently.

(2) We need to reduce costs and make more resources available. We will soon have to close buildings (churches)! This is likely a reality that we will soon have to face and may have to face more than once.

Some Statistics

These statistics indicate trends, given the observed age of those attending Mass and involved in ministry, it may be assumed that if we maintain the status quo, downward trends will continue for the number of registered families as well as revenues. The years presented for each chart come from the annual Spiritual Report that is sent to the Diocese of London which is forwarded to the Vatican.

Number of Registered Families Through the Years, and according to statistics from the Diocese of London, around 14% (2011 report) of Catholics attend weekly Mass on any given Sunday in our diocese.

Financial Snapshot

The trend for our financial situation is similar. Summary information only, excluding the COVID-19 government wage subsidy, is provided. It should be noted in the last year or so capital reserve funds have been used to pay operating expenses! In addition, while COVID-19 has had an impact on revenues, some expenses were paid by government wage subsidies, \$148,454 in 2020, \$171,850 in 2021, and only \$22,551 in 2022. Government subsidies ended March 31, 2022.

Note that there is a cost sharing formula that allocates some costs to each parish in the family. Some costs are direct to each parish (building & maintenance). Ministries, certain staff, and other costs are shared across all five churches. More details can be found in the full “Ignite the Mission” document.

Where do we go from here?

Mass attendance and related revenue have been increasing slightly since the end of COVID restrictions. Wage subsidies have ended. Factors such as required building maintenance will make the financial situation going forward a challenge!

A detailed document called “Ignite the Mission” has considerable information on the present circumstances of our family of parishes in addition to our new pastoral plan. It will help us discern how God is calling our faith community to transition from maintenance to mission rooted in forming disciples who reach out to all.

This general summary document as well as the full “Ignite the Mission” document have been developed and reviewed by members of our Pastoral Team, Pastoral Council and Finance Committee. You can find both documents and other information at the family of parishes website - www.chathamcatholic.ca. Hard copies are available at the back of each church.

We do face many challenges but with God’s grace, together as one family, we will also discover the solutions! This discernment will require prayer, reflection, listening, honesty and seeking Christ’s will for our family of parishes and not our own. It truly is a time of hope and light for the future.

Please review all the materials and participate in the upcoming Family Sharing Sessions that will take place in-person and online in March 2023. More information is coming soon. To stay up to date, please check the weekly bulletin and the family of parishes website.

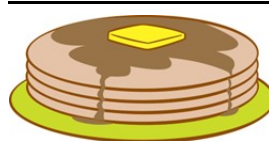

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER 2023



Informed Prayer. Prayerful Action. Imagine Christians from over 170 countries coming together in spirit, uniting on a common day to pray for relevant issues affecting women and children. This is a reality: the movement has been active for
