

ST. JOSEPH CHURCH UPDATES



I want to thank our four custodians for their hard work installing six new LED flood lights in the back of the sanctuary area that allows us to light up the dome and surrounding area by the Presider's Chair. It took a lot of work setting up

scaffolding on one side, install the lights, tear down the scaffolding and set it up again on the other side. Things look great!!

We have also painted and installed a new laminate floor in the washroom beside the Sacristy. We are currently preparing the walls around the Sacristy and downstairs area to be painted.

Over the next couple of months we will also be painting the sections around the Stations of the Cross and in behind the Presider's Chair in the sanctuary to cover up the dark shadow effects from the radiators. These dark spots are created over a long period of time due to the heating system in the church.

ST. URSULA CHURCH UPDATES



We have made upgrades to the safety system at St. Ursula Church. We have upgraded the alarm system to also monitor the newly installed fire panel. Now the fire alarm will be monitored 24 hours a day. New and updated pull stations have also been installed.

Finally we have to install a couple of more emergency lights so that if we lose power at night, people may exit the building safely.

BLESSED SACRAMENT CHURCH UPDATES



Almost two weeks ago the 26 year old boiler finally passed on and could no longer be fixed. We have installed the new one which is more efficient and actually puts out more heat than the old boiler. I want to thank everyone for their patience while we waited for the boiler to be delivered. It made for some pretty cold celebrations but helped us recognize in a very small way what those who are homeless go through all winter

long without reprieve. We should be set with heat for the next 26 years!! The cost for the boiler including installation was around \$24,000.

A Traditional Polish Easter Basket and Its Contents

Swieconka (shvyen-son-kah) is the traditional blessing of the food to be eaten on Easter Sunday. While the tradition varies from region to region and village to village, it is a tradition dear to the heart of every Pole. Today, this blessing takes place in church on Holy Saturday. All the items.

are placed in a wicker basket that is sometimes lined with an ornamental cloth or traditional folk fabric. The filled basket is then covered with a linen cloth which should be white, but can have a colorful crocheted or embroidered design. The basket is decorated with sprigs of boxwood (bukszpan), the typical Polish Palms" which are created from dried flowers, can also be used for decoration.

Listed at the right are Polish Easter Foods that are most commonly placed in the Easter Basket for the traditional blessing, along with the symbolism of each item.

Bacon - Boczek / Słonina (Doh-chek /Swo-nee-nah) Symbol of the overabundance of God's mercy on us. Bread - Chieb (hilland) Home baked bread, the staff of

Easter Bread - Babka (bab-kah)

A special round loaf, made of rich dough and raisins, and decorated with a cross, reminds us of Jesus, the Risen

Butter - Masto (mas-wo)

The butter should be shaped into the figure of a lamb or cross. Dairy products are included to celebrate the end of Lent and the richness of Salvation which flows from the Death and Resurrection of Jesus.

Candle - Świeca (sh-veh-tsa)

The only non-edible item in the basket, the candle symbolizes Jesus, the Life and Light of the World. The candle can be lit during the blessing.

Cheese - Ser (sair)

A symbol to remind Christians of moderation.

Colored Eggs - Pisanki (pee-san-key)

Both colored and uncolored eggs, indicate hope, new life and Resurrection. Because of their special meaning, it is fitting that the eggs to be blessed are decorated with symbols of Easter.

Ham - Szynka (shin-kah)

This popular main dish is symbolic of great joy and abundance.

Horseradish - Chrzan (h'shan)

This represents the bitter herbs prescribed in the original Passover meal as a reminder of the bitterness and harshness of the life of slavery in Egypt. It also reminds us of the bitterness of the Passion of Jesus, by which he entered glory. Horseradish is often prepared with red beets in the dish "cwikła."

Salt - Sól (sool)

Symbolizes wisdom and preservation from corruption, it is included to remind us that Jesus did not undergo corruption in the grave.

Sausage - Kiełbasa (kel-bah-sah)

This is an old Slavic tradition. Its links remind us of the chains of death that were broken when Jesus rose from the dead as well as God's favor and generosity.

Happy Easter! - Wesolego Alleluja! (ves-so-weh-go ah-lay-lu-jah)

The first step to having an attitude of gratitude is to recognize and accept the gifts you are offered. As you go through life, whatever your goal or whatever your hopes may be, "keep your eye on the donut and not the hole" otherwise you might miss the little blessings you receive each day!

Another attitude of gratitude is to express thanks openly by word or a note. Show thankfulness through SAYING IT OR WRITING IT. Let the giver know that you are

thankful.

And finally, the greatest attitude of gratitude is to become like the giver. Pay kindness forward. We learn to give thanks because someone else was generous towards us. Giving thanks is essential to keep the world going. In Psalm 1:16, the psalmist asks,

"How can I repay the Lord for all the great good done for me?"

In John's Gospel, Jesus hears that his good friend, Lazarus, has died. Even though Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem to face his own death, he goes back to Bethany, to the cave where Lazarus is buried. He asks that the stone be moved away and he calls Lazarus to come out of the tomb. He asks God to raise his friend from the dead. When Jesus calls Lazarus out of the tomb, Jesus teaches us about gratitude.

"And Jesus looked upward and said, "Father, I thank you for having heard me"

Take some time as a family to use the prayer by Michael Perras, OFM, to think about all the ways you can say those four simple words:

"Father, I thank you."

the life that you have created the way you walk with me the good people who stay with me the gift of being called from the tombs over and over.

Father, I thank you for:

the insights and wisdom that openness can bring the quiet moments when you speak to me the vibrant moments when you show your generosity the holiness in which I am created and called to.

the strength that arises in times of sorrow the deep faith which draws me to you the beauty of creation which show your love the hope in which I am rooted.

Father, I thank you for::

the courage to say, "I believe"
the ways in which you forgive me
the freedoms I have and discover
the variety of ways you call me to be your disciple.

Father I thank you for:

the tears which express my pain and sorrow the smiles which tells of my delights and joys the comfort and support of those who love me the telling of your never-ending story.
