

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 1ST QUARTER REPORT

- 1. We are slowly seeing increased attendance at our Masses which has translated into better collections at all our churches in the family. 2023 is looking much better than 2022.
- Despite the increased attendance and offertory collection, utility costs have increased in addition to ministry expenses as we continue to introduce and re-introduce various programs.
- 3. We continue to run a deficit (-\$85,700 for the First Quarter in 2023) which means our income does not cover the operating costs for the family. Please note that we are still short staffed and will continue to slowly introduce further ministries that will also require funding.
- 4. Maintaining the status quo as a family of parishes will continue to result in annual deficits that will erode the financial assets we have. Our IGNITE THE MISSION discernment process while focusing on the mission of the Gospel today—does include a call for financial stability and resources to fund our mission to form disciples who reach out to all.

Once again, I am extremely thankful to all parishioners for their support and the work of the Finance Committee that seeks to most efficiently and effectively use our limited resources to help proclaim the Gospel.

BISHOP JOSEPH DABROWSKI FAREWELL





This improvement resulted from a 35% increase in operating revenues offset by a 14% increase in expenses. When the capital surplus/deficit is included, the total family deficit at March 31/23 was \$85.7 thousand compared to \$112.3 OVERALL—The trends of the first two months continued through to the end of the first quarter of 2023. normally the lowest revenue quarter in the year for parishes. GOOD NEWS-We have seen an increase in Mass attendance, collections totalled \$231.4 thousand for the first quarter of 2023—an increase of almost \$50 thousand or 26.5% over donations and use of offertory envelopes in 2023. More people are continuing to return following the pandemic. last year's first quarter. The total operating revenue increase of 35% is an excellent start to the year---the first quarter is REVENUE—Regular weekly collections continued to exceed last year for the third month in a row (see charts below). These

EXPENSES—Expense growth of 14% was driven by a couple of large equipment repairs and a large increase in utilities expenses. Total facility expenses increased by 17% quarter over quarter. Ministry expenses have increased by 100%, due in part to fewer COVID attendance restrictions this year and increased ministries and programs being offered in the family.

CAPITAL—Despite the first capital spending of the year (\$24 thousand at Blessed Sacrament for a new boiler), capital revenue in the family exceeded spending, producing a small capital surplus of \$4.8 thousand at March 31/23.



TOTAL RESOURCES—Total available cash resources for the family declined by \$85.7 thousand since Dec 31/22. Two parishes (St. Joseph & St. Ursula) each had to draw down \$20,000 in the quarter from their Diocesan Loan Fund assets to maintain adequate cash balances to cover expenses. Total family resources at March 31/23 were \$1.2 million.



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I recently rescued a dog. She's a terrier and rather adorable. And she's crazy about me. She could spend all day with me. But I'm a pastor at a parish and sometimes I leave her at the front desk of the church office. She constantly amazes me by her ability to distinguish between my voice and that of everyone else. If I say one word, even if I'm hidden around a corner, she'll sprint toward me and jump up into my arms.

This week the readings focus our attention to the voice of the risen Jesus Christ. Comparing his disciples to sheep and himself to a shepherd, he says, "They recognize his voice." He speaks to us and wants us to respond. When we hear his voice, we follow. Throughout this coming week, we will experience many interior promptings to receive God's love, and to love Him in return. That's his voice. Follow it into the safe and tender arms of Christ.

By contrast, some voices we will hear do not convey God's concern and love for us, but rather produce fear, despair, and other harmful mischief. Jesus calls these voices those of robbers. Does an idea or thought make it harder for you to love God? If so, run away. Let it go. It is most likely not the voice of the Risen Lord. Keep waiting for him to speak. You will recognize his voice. Then run to him as fast as you can.






