

MARIAN STATUE

In April 2023 Bishop Fabbro announced during his homily that our diocese is undertaking a Year of Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood. This year began on Pentecost Sunday 2023 (May 28) and ends on Pentecost Sunday 2024. The specific theme of this year is Priesthood: Not an Ordinary Life. This reminds us of the gift of the priesthood and the vital role priests play in our spiritual lives as they celebrate the Mass, hear Confessions, and anoint us in times of illness.

As part of this diocesan-wide prayer effort, we are initiating a specific Marian devotion asking the Blessed Virgin Mary to intercede for the men of the Chatham Catholic Family of Parishes and to inspire vocations to the priesthood. The devotion involves families or individuals taking a Marian statue in their home (it is about two feet high) for two weeks and committing to pray a Marian vocation prayer on a daily basis. The prayer takes about two minutes to recite and we recommend that all the household family members gather together to pray, if possible. Great spiritual benefits would also be obtained if the family prays a Rosary together, or even a decade of the Rosary, but the particular emphasis in this devotion is on the daily vocation prayer.

BECOMING CHRIST TODAY

REFLECTING ON OUR WEEKLY PRAYER

Last weekend I shared the second of four articles (the second article—NEW METHODS FOR A NEW TIME and the first article—CALLED TO BE MISSIONARIES) reflecting on our IGNITE THE MISSION PRAYER that we have been saying each weekend in our family of parishes. Sometimes we can say the words of prayers but not spend time reflecting on how this will change our lives and hearts. This special prayer is definitely calling us to adapt our perspective being transformed by God's grace to be missionaries in our time.

The third stanza of the prayer asks that we make a commitment to truly be Christ in this world love, compassion, acting in mercy, reconciliation, justice and We are asking our healing. Heavenly Father to transform us into Jesus-which requires the conversion of our hearts and a surrendering of our own plans for the sake of the Good News. This is not just a hope that we have



We are committed to becoming your hands, your feet, and your eyes in this world. Awaken in us the desire to live like Christ, so that, through our actions and words, we radiate His love and divine mercy.

HOW DO WE BECOME LIKE CHRIST?

The heart of any parish community or family of parishes is not simply filling the pews with attendees or raising enough money to pay the bills—it is to form disciples with the love and grace of Christ sending them into the world as modern apostles that radiate the Gospel in every aspect of life. This can only be done when the parish community fills the hearts of people with Jesus in a special and powerful way that cannot be received anywhere else. It is only then that the pews are filled and resources become available to help the mission of bringing Christ to our modern culture.

The mission of the Gospel and our parish communities has never changed. We have always been called to form disciples who reach out to all but the methods and ways we do this need to adapt and adjust according to the circumstances of our time. This is the reason for our family of parishes "Ignite the Mission" discernment.

(1) THE HANDS OF CHRIST

Our faith is not limited to Sunday worship but to be the hands of Christ in our world offering hospitality, peace and reconciliation to everyone around us. We are called to reach out and build bridges and engage people in our world today with joy, enthusiasm, hope and faith.

We are also called to be hands that feed the poor, comfort those who are sick and dying and of course those who are alone and afraid. Our hands need to continue reaching out building friendships and healing relationships wherever possible. This happens through our outreach ministries but also in our families, workplaces and schools.

(2) THE EYES OF CHRIST

In order to be the hands of Christ in our world today, we need to see the world like Jesus. We need to recognize and seek out those on the margins, those who feel alone or afraid, the sick, homeless and those who are not at Mass on the weekends. We need to see the injustices and challenges in the world first, discover how to act most effectively, and then act with great love.

Sometimes we can be blind to what is right before us and try to ignore certain problems hoping that others will act for us. This is why we need to pray and celebrate the sacraments—so that Jesus may offer us clarity for the mission given to us in baptism. At the same time we can also be blind to the graces, blessings and presence of Christ in our world today. There is always hope with Jesus and we need to celebrate the joys and respond to the challenges with the eyes of Jesus. We need to radiate His light.

(3) THE FEET OF CHRIST

Seeing the world with the eyes of the Lord lets us see clearly joys and sorrows. Offering our hands in building relationships and service takes our faith beyond ourselves to those around us. In order for us to do this most effectively, we need to remember that we are on pilgrimage to the kingdom. We need to walk the pathway of truth, justice, compassion and love with others—not alone. The gift of our faith community is that we are a family that is called to work together sharing who we are and what we have for the sake of those around us. We march with the Good News inviting everyone to join us as we walk towards the kingdom.

We do this by reaching out and not waiting for people to come to us. We need to step into the world and culture today with the love of Christ that radiates from our prayer and actions. May the Lord continue to bless us with courage, strength and wisdom seeking to be messengers of hope and joy for today!!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Just over a year ago on the 'penitential pilgrimage' that Pope Francis made to Canada, he said, "In a fraternal spirit, I encourage the Bishops and the Catholic community to continue taking steps towards the transparent search for truth and to foster healing and reconciliation." This year I am pleased to announce an exciting initiative, an annual collection for the diocesan Truth and Reconciliation Fund.

In December 2021, I established a Truth and Reconciliation Committee for the Diocese of London. Over the last twenty months the Committee has initiated dialogue with local Indigenous and Métis Peoples and promoted educational opportunities for clergy and diocesan employees. In June, the Committee provided an update on their work (click here) and information on approved projects (click here).

They have already done a lot of good work but, in their own words, "there is much more work to be done" as we continue the journey on the path to healing and reconciliation. The Committee's mandate includes promoting a fundraising campaign. The bishops of Canada have promised to raise \$30-million for the national Indigenous Reconciliation Fund (IRF). Over the next few years, the Diocese of London will be contributing \$1.8-million towards that fund. The goal of the IRF is to support projects that advance healing and reconciliation initiatives, promote culture and language revitalization, foster education and community building and initiate dialogues involving Indigenous elders, spiritual leaders and youth focusing on Indigenous spirituality and culture.

Today I am writing to you, the faithful of the Diocese, inviting you to support this fund. Your contributions will help us to reach our \$1.8-million commitment and to support local projects that are determined in collaboration with the First Nations and Métis people within the diocese and, as well, with other Indigenous organizations and service providers.

On the weekend of 23-24 September, the weekend before National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on Saturday, September 30th, each parish will take up a special Truth and Reconciliation Fund collection. We are grateful for your financial support, and we ask that you pray that our Catholic community will continue taking steps that foster healing and reconciliation.

Some have already contributed to the fund. I thank them for their support. Others have asked how they can contribute online. You can make an online donation through your parish or use the Diocese of London's online giving link (https://doi.pllenty.com). Please select "Truth and Reconciliation Fund" from the available options or add it as a comment, so that your gift can be allocated properly.

I thank you in advance for your support of this important work as we journey together with Indigenous people, seeking truth, reconciliation, healing, and justice.




