

MOVING TOWARDS MISSION

FROM MAINTENANCE TO MISSION

Our Ignite the Mission Pastoral Plan is rooted in two major pillars— (1) forming disciples (2) who reach out to all. We know the challenges we face as a

family of parishes which includes insufficient financial resources, staff and volunteers. The reality of <u>Christendom</u> (a strong faith influence on all aspects of society) no longer exists, so we must shift to <u>Apostolic Mission</u> (like the first Apostles sharing the Gospel) so we can reach out to those who are not part of our community.

For nearly three years we have been praying and slowly implementing a shift to mission—that is, actively seeking out those who have drifted away from the faith and those who have never met or encountered

Jesus. The mission for us is not trying to maintain our current schedules or the buildings we worship in—it is to share the Good News of the Gospel to those in need—adapting and sacrificing so that the mission given to us by Christ never stops. Being a follower of Jesus involves change and sacrifice. We take another step in our journey with changes in our weekday Mass schedule effective July 1, 2024.

WHY CHANGE THE WEEKDAY MASS SCHEDULE?

There is no question that one of the essential roles for priests is the celebration of the Eucharist in addition to the other sacraments for the faithful. Yet there are additional essential roles of pastoral care that are required by priests to truly shepherd, support, inspire and empower the faithful. Many of these other essential roles are currently lacking.

We heard from parishioners last year during our "sharing sessions" and feedback forms that we need to prioritize outreach and support of our young people and families—especially at our Catholic elementary schools and Ursuline College. We also heard the need to reach out to our seniors in long-term care homes and those who are homebound. None of these priorities can take place in our current circumstances. Here is the rationale for the change:

(1) SHORT STAFFED & LIMITED VOLUNTEERS

We as a family of parishes are short-staffed. We lack two full-time pastoral team members (Coordinator of Family & Youth Ministry and a third Pastoral Minister) and one full-time Business Manager. Our current pastoral team is over extended and the current pace cannot be maintained. Since the pandemic, we are also lacking a number of volunteers to assist in the pastoral care of the faith community.

(2) PRIESTS NEED MORE TIME FOR PASTORAL CARE In addition to the current 10 weekday Masses that

are offered in our family of parishes, we average two funerals a week (117 funerals in 2022, 116 funerals in 2023). As priests, we are also on-call 24 hours a day two days a week for the hospital and hospice, we do limited school Masses/confessions/visits, are part of diocesan committees, are involved in business administration/maintenance of the churches and also have appointments with parishioners.

There simply isn't enough time to visit schools regularly, recruit/train/support volunteers, develop ministries and programs, visit the homebound and those in our nursing homes. Reducing the weekday Masses allows for more ministry, outreach, planning and pastoral care.

(3) MORE OPPORTUNITIES TO BUILD RELATIONSHIPS

With a reduced weekday Mass schedule, that offers morning and evening options for parishioners to attend, allows us to build

relationships and connections with parishioners while reaching out to those in our community drawing them closer to Christ working with volunteer ministers. We can devote more time to do the following:

- More consistent visits to our Catholic schools
- Connections with our seniors/homebound
- Develop new ministries and programs
- Recruit, train and empower volunteer ministers
- More outreach, planning, appointments

With full support of the Pastoral Council, Finance Committee and staff, our new weekday Mass schedule will take effect July 1, 2024:

WHAT IS A NOVENA?

THE WORD "NOVENA" MEANS NINE

The word "novena" comes from the Latin "novem" which means nine. Thus novenas always include nine of something: months, weeks, days, hours or even the same prayer repeated nine times.







Novenas are an ancient tradition that goes back to the days of the Apostles. Jesus told His disciples to pray together after His ascension, so the Apostles along with Mary gathered to pray in the Upper Room during the nine days between the Ascension and Pentecost. (The first novena).

WHY PRAY A NOVENA?

When we pray a novena, we focus our attention intently on a special intention in order to receive special graces and either the answer to our prayers or discernment on what we need to do.

REPETITION BRINGS GROWTH



Repeating prayers and repeating them over time is helpful because we often need that length of time to move beyond merely making a request to learning to listen to God as He speaks to us in prayer. Nine days of prayer gives us time to consider more aspects of our prayer intention than just receiving an answer.

OUR FAMILY LENTEN JOURNEY

WEEK FOUR













Acts 2:38-39;41; 44-45

Peter said to them, "Each one of you must turn away from your sins and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ, so that your sins will be forgiven; and you will receive God's gift, the Holy Spirit... Many of them believed this message and were baptized...All the believers continued together in close fellowship and shared their belongings with one another...

Before we think about what 'self-giving' means in our Lenten journey, we need to take some time to reflect on God's call to us in our BAPTISM. When we are baptized either as a small baby or later as a young person or adult, each of the symbols in the Sacrament of Baptism are very significant.



Oil of Chrism is rubbed on the head. It is a reminder that we are called to be PRIEST-by living a life of prayer PROPHET-by telling others about God's Word KING-by living a life of Jesus' example of love for others. The holy oil is a symbol that we have received the help and strength of the Holy Spirit.



The Paschal Candle or Easter Candle reminds us that through our baptism, we share in the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus. Jesus is the Light of World. Through his acts of love he teaches us to be his light.



Holy Water is the symbol of new life and washing away original sin. We cannot live without water. So the holy water reminds us that God gives us life and we cannot live without God.



The white garment is a sign of new life. We become a new person and give our life to Jesus. We have a fresh beginning to live without sin.



When we are baptized, we come to the font and we receive the sign of the cross on our forehead. The priest or deacon says our name and then says, "I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

Each time we make the Sign of the Cross we are reminded of our Baptism and to whom we belong



Each new baptized person receives their own candle which is lit from the Paschal Candle. Our candle reminds us that Jesus' light has entered into us and now we are called to bring His light to the world by being intentional disciples!



Set aside some time one night during Lent for each family member to remember their own baptism. Take out photo albums or videos and talk about your baptismal day. If you still have your baptismal candles, light them. Maybe you can take out any special momentos you received at your baptism. Parents, tell your children why you chose their names. Say a prayer for your godparents. Talk about how God is calling you, through your baptism, to give of yourself this Lent out of love for others. How can you and your family answer that call?

FAMILY LENTEN ACTION SELF-GIVING



Jesus' Light can shine in the world's darkness through each of us. The light we received in baptism was not meant to stay inside of us. We are supposed to share it with others through loving action.



During Lent we are called by God to put aside our selfish wants and open our eyes to the suffering of others.

St. Teresa of Calcutta once said, "Do small things with great love...Let us not be satisfied with just giving money. Money is not enough...people need your hearts to love them. So spread love everywhere you go."



Your gifts of self-giving should always lead you to a closer relationship with God and others. As Jesus gave his unconditional love for each of us, we in turn are asked to give to others with no strings attached.



You might:

Help your siblings with homework or read to them

Call your grandparent or parent and just ask them how their day has gone
Get up on Sunday instead of sleeping in and join the parish family for Mass
Make time to bring a snack to a neighbour you don't know and introduce yourself
Have your family choose five places in your community that have essential
workers-drive to each place and say the decade of the rosary for each group
Write letters of thanks to a teacher, a neighbour, a doctor, recycling collector,
grocery clerk, etc. Hand it to them or mail it...



You might think to:

Teach someone how to use the computer so they can communicate with friends
Set up a zoom call and entertain your grandparents or relatives with music or
juggling or dancing or jokes to give them a smile-invite them to dance with you!
Learn a new lifeskill- peeling potatoes, making breakfast, sorting and washing your
laundry, changing a diaper...do this so someone else doesn't have to do it for you
Offer your help in the parish to be a lector, help with live streaming, help with
outreach groups, clean the church yards, greeting at Mass, singing
Take a walk in your neighbourhood and pick up garbage or put the neighbour's
trash can or recycling bins at their door after they've been emptied



Maybe you could:

Find out about one of these outreach groups and donate money, time or things to help them: Canadian Food for Children, St. Ursula's Caring Kitchen, St. Vincent de Paul, Hope Haven, R.O.C.K., St. Agnes Soup Kitchen, Big Brothers/Big Sisters Make a plan as a family to use the money you would save on take out food, junk food and buying unnecessary things to put towards helping one of these groups Buy gift cards to take outs and coffee shops and give to the people who are homeless Make up 'Good Samaritan' bags to help Outreach For Hunger or bring extra lunch to share at school or work
