Dear Parish Family,

This weekend we recall the vicious attacks our country faced twenty one years ago on September 11th, 2001. No doubt we all remember where we were and what we were doing when those devastating events transpired. This weekend, we remember all the fallen heroes of that day, alongside all the brave men and women both past and present, who continuously serve us night and day to secure our freedom both at home and abroad! In a most special way, we will remember all of our heroes during our Mass for Heroes which will be celebrated this Saturday evening at 6:00p.m. May Almighty God continue to bless our brave military men and women and all police, fire, and first responders who selflessly sacrifice so much for us!

On Thursday, we celebrated the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. As we remember her birthday this week, I invite you to think of Mary in three ways. First, as the ideal image. It is true to say that oftentimes before we fall in love with any person, we first have an image or an imprint in our minds, as to what we desire to love! So too with God! As a matter of fact, the first Immaculate Conception took place inside the mind of our Heavenly Father. God the Father, conceived from the foundation of the world and preexisted in His mind, the most precious woman He could. She was to become the new Eve! Mary would also become the new Eden, a garden in which God could once again dwell, after the first had become corrupted by the stain of original sin. This garden would be the most beautiful, most pristine garden every created in the history of the world! From this new Eden would come the choicest fruit imaginable, namely, the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ Himself. You see my friends, Mary is what all men with a pure hearts desire, she is also who all women with a pure hearts aspire to be! Use her ideal image to grow in virtue, holiness, and sanctity! Use her model to surround yourself with people who exemplify her attributes and characteristics and allow yourself the opportunity to fall in love.

Second, I invite you to think of Mary as our Mother. At the Annunciation, when the Archangel Gabriel heralded her with tidings of great joy, the invitation was extended for Mary to allow God to use her human nature to bring forth the Savior of the world. In the same way, at our own baptisms, God invited us to share our human natures with Him, in order to become members of the body of Christ on earth. As members of that body, we strive to continuously build up the Kingdom of God here on earth. Our Blessed Lord gave Mary to the Church, as her Mother, from the Cross of Calvary. When Jesus looked at Mary and said "Woman, behold your son." Then turning to his beloved discipled John said, "Son, behold your Mother."

The final way I invite you to think of Mary is as a Spouse. There is something oftentimes hidden from our understanding of Calvary hill. What really transpired was a nuptial exchange, on the Cross there exists a sublime wedding. A marriage not consummated in pleasure as we're accustomed, but instead pain and suffering. You see my friends, the New Adam is on the Cross, the bridegroom, suspended between heaven and earth. He's offering all He has and all He is for the redemption of who He loves. At the foot of the Cross is the New Eve, Mary most holy, who represents the bride of Christ, that is the Church. In parables, our Lord always desribed the Word of God, as the seed. From the Cross of Calvary, the God made man implants the seed into His bride, the Church. That seed takes root in her, it germinates new life, it is nurtured and sustained. It comes forth in birth and is fed, educated, and ultimately grows into a disciple of Love Himself. This happens at every moment and every day in the Sacramental life of the Church.

In our daily trials, let us look to Mary who is the ideal image, our Mother, the perfect spouse. The more we fall in love with her, the more we'll fall in love with the bride of Christ on earth, namely, His Holy Roman Catholic and Apostolic Church.

Sancta Maria, Mater Dei, ora pro nobis! Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us!




