

WHY PRAY THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS?

Dear Parish Family,

One of my favorite parts of Lent is praying the Stations of the Cross. Many years ago, I can remember praying them diligently with my Mom during this sacred season. I vividly recall praying them with her on Good Friday one year. When we had finished and exited Our Lady of the Angels Church in Worcester, there was a fresh blanket of snow on the ground! Pray that doesn't happen this year! Snow removal isn't cheap!

Although the Stations of the Cross is a popular devotion, and while we pray it in our parish every Lent, it's helpful to understand how praying the Stations of the Cross can affect not just your own faith, but your daily life. Here are five reasons that I believe we can all benefit from this wonderful devotion during Lent!

First, they offer us strength in times of suffering. Praying the Stations of the Cross reminds us that we are not alone in our suffering: Jesus suffers with us. He chose to embrace every aspect of human life, including suffering and death.

Second, they instill in us a compassion for those who suffer. We see in the Stations of the Cross how people mocked Jesus, revealing the worst reactions to the suffering of others. Yet we also have the example of our Blessed Mother Mary, who stayed close to her Son throughout the entirety of His Passion. In the Stations of the Cross, we are afforded the ability to see Jesus in those who suffer and therefore to treat the suffering with compassion.

Third, the remind is of the vast love of God. Seeing the horror of Jesus' suffering reminds us of something wonderful: how much He loves us! Jesus endured His Passion because of the love He had for each individual person who would ever live, and so the Stations of the Cross remind us of how much we are loved!

Fourth, they provide us with tremendous hope. We know why Jesus suffered and we know what happened afterwards. His suffering and death was not the end of the story. He conquered death and through His Glorious Resurrection triumphed! This, in a powerful way, reminds us that our own individual sufferings are never in vain, but are redemptive!

Finally, they enable us to enter into and feel Jesus' suffering. For our faith to grow, we need to be able to empathize with Jesus' suffering on the Cross and feel His pain as though it were happening to ourselves or someone we care deeply about. The Stations of the Cross help us do this by giving us fourteen focal points to meditate on.

In closing, I invite you all to make use of this beautiful, sacred devotion during Lent. When we pray and meditate on the sublime humility, generosity, and awesome Love that our God has for all of us, it changes us! Now is the time to be changed, transfigured into something more beautiful than before. Please don't deprive yourself or God of that opportunity. Every Friday during Lent at 6:30p.m., I will pray the Stations of the Cross. It doesn't take long maybe a half hour of your valuable time. A half hour on the Mountain of Calvary, where we gaze in inexplicable awe at just how much God loves us. We then in turn, fall deeper in love with Him!
