

Dear Parish Family,

Welcome to Spring! As we bid farewell to another New England winter, we can begin to look beyond the potholes left behind in our roadways from necessary plowing. Perhaps after last Tuesday's snowfall, we can begin to put away our shovels and snowblowers, continue to adjust to daylight savings time, and maybe, just maybe, not be visited with snow removal and heating invoices! Indeed, now is the time to hope for new signs of life and growth that always arrive with Spring! In a short time, grass seed will be spread on neighboring lawns. Corn seed will be spread on neighboring farmlands. Flower seed will be planted in gardens and window boxes. Springtime fosters the hope that seeds planted will produce luscious, beautifully manicured lawns, abundant, bountiful crops, and gorgeous, fragrant flowers!

I can hardly believe it is already the fifth Sunday of Lent! In just one week from now we will be celebrating Passion Palm Sunday! The holiest week of the liturgical year is rapidly approaching and with it, so many extraordinary things to celebrate! On Palm Sunday, the youth of our parish will participate in an Easter egg hunt on the parish grounds at 9:30a.m.! This wonderful fun filled event is being sponsored and funded by our own Confirmation candidates! On Tuesday of Holy Week, all the priests of the diocese of Worcester will gather at the Cathedral of Saint Paul to celebrate the Chrism Mass. During this celebration, Bishop McManus will consecrate and bless the oil of the sick, the oil of catechumens, and the holy chrism. After Mass, these oils will be distributed to delegated parishioners who will return the oils to their respective parishes. These newly consecrated oils will then be received into each parish during the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening! Also, during this solemn Mass, each priest will recommit himself to the service of Christ and His beautiful bride the Church. In essence, the priests are reminded during this Mass, that the Cross of Christ is non-negotiable!

Here at North American Martyrs parish, we will celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:00p.m. on Holy Thursday evening. Incidentally, this Mass begins our Sacred Triduum. Since we celebrate the commemoration of two of the greatest gifts the Church has ever received on this day, namely, the priesthood and the Eucharist, I will be privileged to distribute both the Blessed Sacrament and blessed palms to all of our homebound parishioners on Wednesday and Thursday. I know that Eagles Wings has been working hard to

ensure a beautiful, spiritually uplifting celebration on this most solemn occasion, and as we know, they never disappoint!

On Good Friday, the second day of our Sacred Triduum, the young adults of our parish will present a magnificent portrayal of the Living Stations of the Cross at 3:00p.m. These remarkable young people have already begun rehearsing for this awe-inspiring devotion, and I am so proud to inform you that it was their idea to enact it! Imagine the magnitude of faith our young people possess to request that they be permitted to portray the greatest act of love that ever transpired!? We are so blessed to have such incredible, energetic, compassionate, dedicated, and faithful youth among us! Please make some time to come and pray with them, I guarantee we will all be made better because of it. They've already expressed their desire to make it even better than last year! I cannot wait!

In the evening of Good Friday, we will have a Good Friday service at 7:00p.m. Here we will meditate and reflect on the saddest day in human history, the day that Love Himself was nailed to a tree and died for us. We will have an opportunity to venerate the Cross as we reflect on our own individual sinfulness, and with that, the extraordinary mercy that God bestows upon us despite it. God's Mercy

isn't fair, and on this day, we thank God that His Mercy isn't fair!

On the morning of Holy Saturday, the town of Auburn will stage its annual little league parade here in the parish parking lot. I always enjoy watching the town's youngest athletes beam with pride as they prepare for a wonderful season. At 7:20p.m. on Holy Saturday, we will have the celebration of our Easter Vigil Mass. I am painfully aware that many Catholics dread the Easter Vigil because of its reputation for longevity. However, I assure you it is one of the most spectacularly beautiful Masses of the entire liturgical year! Although this year we do not have anyone enrolled in RCIA, I know how much parishioners enjoyed our little celebration in the hall last year. Therefore, at the conclusion of our Easter Vigil Mass, I would like to cordially invite all present to join us in the parish hall immediately following Mass, for some light refreshments and to participate in Easter Joy!

Finally, on Easter Sunday our Masses will assume the normal Sunday schedule of 8:30a.m. and 10:30a.m.! As you can see, we have so much to look forward to in the upcoming weeks leading up to the Highest Feast of our Liturgical Year, Easter! Remember, there are still opportunities to make a good confession! Last Monday evening, I heard confessions for three hours! It was an awesome experience to witness so many faithful souls return to Christ's loving embrace, let yourself be one of them! Confession will be available on Monday, March 27th @ 6:30p.m., and during Holy Week on Monday, April 3rd @ 6:30p.m.! As we prepare to celebrate the Resurrection, rise up from the ashes of your own sinfulness, and be transfigured in the Sacrament!
