Dear Parish Family,

Happy Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord! Jesus Christ has risen from the dead! This announcement resounds in the Church throughout the world together with the singing of 'Alleluia. He is alive forever in our midst.' This Good News has been lit like a new flame in the Holy night of the Easter Vigil; in the night of a world that faces crucial challenges, due to war and all the trials that hinder the life of humanity.

On this Easter Sunday morning, we must be grateful because we are able to gather as a parish family to celebrate our Lord's Resurrection, and that is the reason for our joy; a joy that has to become contagious, because it is meant to enable us to dispel fear from our lives. It is a "contagion which is transmitted from heart to heart, because every human heart awaits this Good News. It is the contagion of hope: "My love and my hope have truly risen!" It is not a magic formula that makes problems disappear. We must understand that the Resurrection of Christ is the victory of Love over the root of evil, a victory that does not "pass over" suffering and death, but goes beyond them, opening a path in the abyss, transforming evil in good, a distinctive sign of the power of God." (Pope Francis, Easter Message 2020).

As a parish, in the midst of Easter joy, I want to invite you to new possibilities, to new horizons, so that this Easter celebration is reflected in our faith commitment, and in the increase of our love for the worldwide Church and our local parish family. We have so many reasons to be joy filled and grateful to Almighty God. You may have noticed, as I have, how rapidly our parish family is growing! So many new faces in the pews, so many precious, beautiful children at Mass! Last weekend on Palm Sunday, over a hundred children stormed the parish lawn in search of Easter eggs! I heard there was even a lunatic priest on the roof of the rectory tossing Easter eggs to the children.

As we grow, we must thank God, yet be mindful and remain vigilant. In our town of Auburn, many souls do not attend Mass. Jesus Christ has conquered final suffering, sickness, and death, it is time for them to hear the Easter Proclamation and return home to the Catholic faith! It's time for them to overcome their fears, it is time for them to rise from their sinfulness and begin to live life anew in the promise of Easter! How will this be possible for them? How will they hear this message, especially if they don't come to Mass? More good news...they are our family and our friends. We know them! In the Church we refer to Saint Mary Magdalene as the "Apostle to the Apostles", do you know why? Because she was the first to bring Easter tidings to the ones closest to Jesus. Will you and I do the same? Will we invite people to experience the presence of Christ in the Eucharistic Celebration? Will we let our loved ones know that we don't just celebrate Easter Sunday one day a year, but at every single Holy Sacrifice of the Mass? Will we tell them there's no longer anything to be afraid of, that we have met, fallen in love with, and know the One who has subjected everything to Himself? I certainly hope so! Spread the message of Easter today and always, invite people you love home to Mass, invite them to North American Martyrs parish! If you have to, bribe them into breakfast afterwards, if you get them here, I promise God will do the rest, He's already proven that, hasn't He?

For those of us who are present, and in the pews, there's still more that we are called to do! On this Easter Sunday morning, our faith commitment must be reflected in full, active, participation in parish ministries. We need more lectors, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, more ushers, and please God, more altar servers! We need to rise from our pews with the Lord and begin to strengthen our parish more and make our ministries flourish again! If you're interested in any of the above ministries, please let me know. Otherwise, I will be forced to resort to Catholic guilt, and start personally requesting who I think would be the best for the jobs! There's nothing worse than when a priest guilts you into something, however, there's nothing more rewarding and fulfilling either!

Finally, I would like to sincerely thank all the volunteers of our parish: ushers, lectors, extraordinary ministers, sacristan, and musicians, who in communion with the parish staff, have made a tremendous effort to ensure that the liturgies throughout Lent and all of Holy Week, the Sacred Triduum, and today, were celebrated beautifully and with the utmost respect. A special thank you too, to our fourteen young adults who went above and beyond to portray a reverent depiction of our Lord's Passion and Death on Good Friday. We are so very blessed to have such wonderful young people among us! For their efforts, I have promised that this summer, alongside our altar servers, I will arrange a day of fun at a nearby amusement park as a thank you!
