
This weekend is the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. As we celebrate the finding of the child Jesus by the Wise Men (a.k.a. "the Three Kings") and the annual appearance of King Cakes in Louisiana, we are reminded by the feast and the readings this weekend that the "Lord manifested (Greek, "*epiphanios*") His glorious presence to all today!" On the Feast of the Epiphany,

the Lord showed His glory and splendor to the second group of privileged ones who witnessed His first appearance in this world. After a long period of waiting for the Coming of the Messiah (advent), the shepherds and the Magi were finally rewarded with a personal encounter with the Lord and His family – Josef bar-Jacob (Joseph, son of Jacob from Bet-le-heim) and Maryam (Miriam or Miriamme) of Nazareth. God's revelation is now complete: first to a Virgin, followed by her husband to-be (in a dream), then to the shepherds and finally to the Wise Men. At this event, the Lord indeed makes His presence known! The message of the Scriptures for us this weekend as we celebrate the Feast of God's Manifestation to His people is TO SEE HIS PRESENCE IN OUR MIDST and not only at Christmas, BUT ALL THE TIME!

The joyful celebration of this season hopes to generate and instill in us that Jesus wants to come into our lives and faith every single seasons of our lives. Every year we have been reminded at Advent that the Lord will come again to complete His work of salvation. However, we cannot simply relegate and restrict the coming of the Lord, the manifestation of His presence, once a year. For whenever you and I are ready to welcome Him in our lives and faith, the Lord comes to manifest (*epiphanios*) His glory and presence. Let us pray this holy season and throughout the seasons of our lives that we will become God's dwelling place where ALL who seek Him will find His presence in us.

After 28 years of "long absence" from the Philippines and 4 years since my last "short visit," I will be able to finally take a long vacation in the Philippines beginning January 8th till February 14th. It's time for me to rest, renew and recuperate, surrounded by my brother's family and friends. Thanks!


