PASTOR'S THOUGHTS: December 2-3, 2023

As we begin the Holy Season of Advent, I give thanks to God for sending cheerful givers who assisted us with our Sound System Replacement Project. Through the prayers and intercessions of Saint Joseph, I pray that God bless y'all and all those who in their own ways, help us keep this beautiful dwelling place of God in good shape. Amen.

Please make plans to join us this coming December 16th as we come together to celebrate the Closing of our Jubilee Year with music, songs, prayers, and food! The Season of Advent call us to prepare God's dwelling place in our faith, lives, hearts, and community. Come, let us welcome Him together and give thanks for all His blessings to us and all!

Every Advent Season our Ushers and Pam Folse ask families who bring up the offertory gifts to also light the Advent Candle/s on our wreath. Why? Because each one of us are part of the "advent-waiting" and preparing for the Coming of the Lord! This is the basic message of Advent. While the wreath and the candles are symbolic of our waiting, each one of us who lights the candle/s are the ones to whom the Lord will come. As the Angels proclaim: for unto us, a child is given; to each one of you the Savior will come. So, go ahead, light the way for the Lord, prepare His paths!

Our Advent journey this Season begins with our FIRST lesson of advent which is "hope." Online dictionaries defined "hope" as a "feeling of expectation, a desire or wish for a certain thing/s to happen." In the Scriptures, t is defined as "expectation with certainty that God will do what God has said will be done." While the two definitions are a little bit different, they share a common word — **expectation.** The question is "who's expecting whom or what?"

In the 1st reading for the 1st Sunday of Advent, the Prophet Isaiah was **hoping** that the Lord will return to the Hebrew people after abandoning them because of their (the people's) infidelities towards the Lord. A recurring theme among the early writings, the people of old think that the Lord "has abandoned them" when bad things happen in their kingdom, lives, and faith (e.g., invasion, deaths,

misfortune, calamities, pestilence, etc.).

The psalmist in Psalm 80, however, was **hoping** that his people "return to the Lord" so that they will continue to enjoy the Lord's blessings.

In the short gospel narrative from St. Mark, Jesus clearly spoke about what He wants all of us to hear about His coming: "Be watchful! Be alert! What I say to you, I say to all: Watch!" Nobody knows the day, time, hour, moment when the Lord will return OR when you, I or anyone will return to the God! Our **hope** is that the Lord will indeed return and/or you, I and everyone will return to the Lord, whichever comes first!

St. Paul's introductory words to his letter to the people at Corinth is filled with **hope** for they are "not lacking in any spiritual gift as they wait for the revelation Jesus Christ (second coming)." St. Paul was insisting that they have been given enough grace to wait for the Lord with fidelity and they must remain faithful and ready.

While we **hope** for the Return of the Lord and/or our return to the Lord someday, just like the readings this weekend, our "**hope**" has some expectations attached to it. Some **hope** that the Lord will return to fix everything that is wrong in our lives. Some **hope** that the Lord will return to take care of all the mess that we have in the world. Some **hope** that when the Lord returns, we will have everything that we longed, prayed for, and hoped for.

Each one of us has our own reasons for hoping and expectations attached to them -- including me. My hope is that someday when I have done all the Lord has asked me to do in ministry, the Lord will welcome me to His kingdom to be with Him and my beloved ones.

How about the Lord, what is God "hoping" for?

God is only **hoping** for one thing: "I will be your God and you will be my people." (See Genesis 17:3-8; Exodus 6:7; Ezekiel 34:23-24; 36:28; Jeremiah 30:22; 31:33). God has always been consistent in His **hope** for us from the beginning of time (Genesis) until the end. God wants to be united with us at His Kingdom!

As you begin your journey through the Advent Season, what is it you are **hoping** for?
