PASTOR'S THOUGHTS: December 9-10, 2023

This Holy Season of Advent, I continue to give thanks to God for sending cheerful givers who assisted us with our Sound System Replacement Project. Through the prayers and intercessions of Saint Joseph, I pray that God bless y'all and all those who in their own ways, help us keep this beautiful dwelling place of God in good shape. Amen.

Please make plans to join us this coming **December 16**th as we come together to celebrate the Closing of our Jubilee Year with music, songs, prayers, and food! The Season of Advent call us to prepare God's dwelling place in our faith, lives, hearts, and community. Come, let us welcome Him together and give thanks for all His blessings to us and all! There will be lots of singing, biblical characters portrayal, tree-lighting and community caroling, ending with a shared meal at the Life Center!

The second Sunday of Advent Season continues with the message of "peace." While most people would consider peace as the absence of war, conflicts, divisions, pain, suffering, etc., I always consider peace as the presence of God! There is peace whenever God is present in every situation and persons.

In the first reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, the Lord speaks to His beloved and chosen people with words of comfort, reminding them that God is in their midst! The Hebrew people of old had been through rough times in their lives and faith and they needed the reassurance that God has not abandoned them, despite their iniquities and moments of unfaithfulness to the Lord. God's words to His people are so uplifting that whatever fear, doubts, or concerns they have, His comforting words strengthened them; they have peace!

In the second reading from the 2nd Letter of Peter, the apostle consoles his friends and followers of Jesus by reassuring them that although the Second coming of Christ is delayed, God didn't forget His promise that He will return to them (and us!). The delay of the Lord's return is not because He is taking His time or have changed His mind. No, God does not change His mind! St. Peter argues in his letter that the delay in Christ's return is because He is giving us time to be ready, prepare and be like Him while waiting. Quote: "Since everything is to

be dissolved in this way (referring to what will happen when the Lord comes), what sort of persons ought you to be, conducting yourselves in holiness and devotion, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God ..." Yes, the Lord delays His return to us to give us a chance to change our ways, become like Him, to be ready when His time comes! There is a wonderful Spanish saying that says, "Dios retrasa pero no olvida," which means, "God delays BUT He never forgets." His delay is for our benefit! This thought should give each one of us "peace" knowing and believing that God is giving me ALL the chances I need to be ready for His or MY return to Him before the time comes.

In the beginning paragraph of St. Mark's Gospel, he quotes the words of the Lord in the Book of the Prophet Isaiah which we read in the first reading, identifying John the Baptist as "the voice that cried out in the desert – prepare the way of the Lord!" The message of St. John the Baptist was the fulfillment of the promise of old that the Messiah will come and is here in presence of Jesus, *emmanu-El* – God (is) with us! The comforting assurance in the first reading, the encouraging words of St. Peter in the second reading, is now a reality in the Gospel of Mark. A Greek inscription found in the tomb of St. Peter ("petros eni", Peter is here), can be used in the gospel of Mark as "Christos eni," the Christ is here! All the doubts and fears of the chosen people, young and old, are now calmed by Jesus' Divine revelation – Peace, I am here. God is present among His people, **peace** is here. In the gospel narratives, Jesus is heard to say always, "Do not be afraid, it is I - I am here."

We are reminded again this Advent Season that God never abandons His people, that He is always with us "until the end of time." God is and wants to be present to us at all times especially in those times we need God, we need His presence, we need peace. The question you have to ask is, do I want and allow God to be present in my life and faith at all times?

If you are troubled and want peace, invite God to be present in and to you.

If you are worried and disturbed and want peace, allow God to be present with you.

If you are tired and exhausted and want peace, let the Good Shepherd give you rest.

This Advent Season have peace, He's waiting for you to ask Him!


