Reception of Holy Communion:

Beginning Sunday, November 29, 2020, weather permitting, we will be offering the reception of Holy Communion after the 10:30am and the 12:30pm Live Streamed Masses. This will take place outside in the church parking lot. Father will confirm if communion will be happening following the virtual mass. Make sure that you tune in to the virtual mass and not just show up.

Communion will take place immediately after the Final Blessing.

Parishioners will be expected to line up by the Statue of Mary, directly across from the east side parking lot. Communion recipients will need to be 6 feet apart and wearing a mask that covers both the nose and mouth. After receiving communion, you must leave immediately.

Reflection on Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Evil was part of my curriculum in a senior high school religion class. Each day we began our class with a reading of the day's gospel. Evil or the Evil one turned up at least once a week. The unclean spirit in today's readings is a good example. Outside of church, we fictionalize these dark forces or relegate them to horror films. That's a mistake.

Movies graphically portray a war between good and evil. In hosts of horror movies. But we know that there is no contest. People are born good. Christ in his resurrection has overcome evil once and for all. Our souls are anchored in his victory and our triumph over evil assured. There is however a powerful tide that threatens to pull us from our mooring in his grace, the evil, and evildoers we encounter every day in the contemporary world. We rarely recognize it for what it is or pretend that it's not there. What should we do in the face of evil and evildoers? The same thing Jesus did.

Whenever Satan or demons or evil shows up in the New Testament, Jesus is not far behind. He casts our demons, cures people possessed of unclean spirits, as in today's passage. He calls out evil for what it is and then confronts it. Where we encounter sickness, we should heal. That may take the form of working in or supporting health care. It may mean healing broken relationships in our families. We should feed the hungry when we encounter the evil of poverty. It may mean comforting the fearful amid the pandemic. It may mean praying for those who have died and the families that mourn their loss.

Jesus confronted evil and evildoers head-on. So should we. That's what disciples do
