Today's Reflection:

The Ascension of the Lord

This week marks the 40th anniversary of the release of Steven Spielberg's E. T. The Extra-Terrestrial. Spoiler alert, I'm about to reveal the film's ending. When ET, the lovable Yoda-like galactic traveler stranded on earth, rose from the dead, the audience in the theater actually stood up and cheered. So did I. When he said goodbye to his beloved friend Elliot, audience members wept. Those witnessing the ascension in today's Gospel reading may have felt the same emotions.

As ET is about to board his rescue ship, a teary-eyed Elliot begs him, "Stay." ET pleads, "Come." But Elliot cannot go and ET cannot stay. They experience the pain of ambivalence. We've all experienced it. When we first left home or on our child's first day of school. We want them to stay and go at the same time. How do we deal with ambivalence?

In the movie, when they realize that parting is inevitable, ET extends a finger and touches Elliot's forehead. A light glows where they connect and ET says, "I'll be right here." That's when I lost it. At the Ascension, Jesus and his disciples face that same ambivalence of parting. But Christ promises them that the light of the Holy Spirit will be with them always. His light and Spirit are right here, with us, too. Christ's Spirit remains in our minds and our hearts. We connect whenever we phone home, that is, pray.
