### Scam Donation Requests

Individuals falsely representing themselves as members of our clergy have texted or emailed parishioners asking those parishioners to buy gift cards for the sick or to make contributions to a special cause.

Some of these bad actors will make a strong effort to make these messages appear to originate from the pastor. The scammer will write messages using very personal greetings and indicate there is a need to get the cards or funds quickly to create a sense of urgency.

Pastors or clergy members will not typically solicit donations via emails or texts. Any parishioner who receives such a message should always verify its authenticity personally with the sender before making any contribution. Report the incident to law enforcement and to the **FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center (<https://www.ic3.gov/>)**.

### Today's Reflection

Today's Gospel reading presents us with The Sermon on the Mount. The Beatitudes read like a summary of the entire sermon and provide us with a road map to discipleship. The words are familiar, blessed are the peacemakers. Does Jesus expect us to end wars like the brutal invasion or Ukraine? Isn't that beyond our ordinary capabilities and up to world leaders and heroic giants? We are not off the hook.

This year marks the 60th anniversary of St. Pope John XXIII's groundbreaking encyclical, Pacem in Terris. He published it after the Berlin Wall went up and in the aftermath of the Cuban Missile Crisis. But he addressed it to ordinary people as much as to world leaders. The peace he sought was more than the ending of war. He opposed all violence and held all of us responsible for restoring the natural order of things. God created a harmonious universe and we must eliminate the violence that mocks God's creation. How?

We need to pray for peace. The rosary, said alone or with others like our parish, Legion of Mary, serves as a starting point. I think our most immediate need, beyond prayer is to address the violence in our culture. We have just suffered another mass shooting. The U.S. bishops have called for gun control laws that would make military grade weapons illegal. We should support them. In addition, we need to lobby for school programs that address bullying in schools and elect public officials who would make mental health a priority. At Mass, we say, "The peace of the Lord be with you." As disciples, we must put that prayer into actions and become peacemakers.
