Today's Reflection

In today’s Gospel, Jesus says, “Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you.” His peace is not comfort without challenge or silence in the face of suffering. It is a deep, abiding gift rooted in love, justice, and mercy. His peace calls something forth in us. It invites us to still our hearts and move our hands.

In 1983, the U.S. bishops issued a pastoral letter on peace. It encouraged Catholics to weigh carefully the morality of war, and to imagine peace not simply as the absence of conflict but the presence of justice. Today, Catholic teaching has grown toward what leaders like Pope Francis and John Barry of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul call just peace—a peace grounded in encounter, community, and care for the poor. This is not abstract theology. It is as real as the hungry neighbor, the struggling family, and the elderly person alone. Just peace is built in food pantries and shelter lines, in prayers and in policy.

We are all called to be peacemakers—not only by what we oppose, but by what we build. Continue to support the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Write your legislators. Ask whether laws serve the common good, especially the poor. Pray for peace, and act with courage. The world needs healing, and as Pope Francis said, the Church is a field hospital. We are all first responders.
