Today's Reflection

The older I get, the more aware I become of my mortality. That’s why today’s readings struck me so profoundly. Both Ecclesiastes and the Gospel invite us to reflect on inheritance, not just the kind recorded in legal documents, but the kind written on hearts.

In biblical times, inheritance was straightforward. One of my favorite scholars, Norman Perrin, notes that most people in Jesus’ day were too poor to worry about leaving anything behind. Those who had property passed it to the eldest son. Widows without sons were often left with nothing.

Today, things are different. A few years ago, my wife and I made our will. Though my retirement was set up with her in mind, preparing our will made us think beyond ourselves, to our daughters. That process sharpened our focus, reminding us that legacy is more than material.

Recently, I attended a celebration of life for a young man I’d never met, a friend’s son. For two hours, people stood and shared how he had touched their lives. By the end, I felt I knew him and that he was a good man. We don’t just leave behind property. We leave behind stories, memories, lives we’ve touched, and hearts we’ve changed. That is the true inheritance. Some may inherit our possessions. But all will inherit our memory. What memories will we leave behind? What will your loved ones inherit?.
