Today's Reflection

In every high school religion class I taught, no lesson began until we read the day’s Gospel and someone asked a question or connected the reading to real life. Not a summary or paraphrase, but an honest question or connection. Something that pierced the surface.

One Gospel has stayed with me more than most: today’s reading from Luke. Jesus says he has come not to bring peace but division, even within families. We were studying suffering, the nature of evil, and Satan. One student raised a hand: "Isn’t division Satan’s work? So why would Jesus cause it?" It started one of the most honest and unsettling conversations we ever had. Yes, historically, Jesus divided families. Some believed he was the Messiah; others called him a blasphemer, even possessed. Some thought he came to save, others to stir revolt.

Theologians argue that Christ calls us to reorder our commitments: God before kin, kingdom before comfort. They reason that the division he brings isn’t born of malice but of choice, between what is right and what is easy. And yet... That student's question still lingers. If Christ came to shatter Satan's reign, the reign of division, why does his Gospel still divide us? Maybe it’s not Jesus and his message that divides. Maybe it’s us. Perhaps we choose divisiveness.


