Today's Reflection

Today's Gospel may feel unsettling at first glance. A servant works hard all day, then comes in and, rather than being told, “Put your feet up,” he’s expected to keep going: “Prepare my meal... serve me... then you may eat.” It feels like a harsh ask, uncharacteristic of the Jesus we imagine as gentle and affirming. But let’s look again, not from the master’s viewpoint, but from the servant’s perspective.

When I was a kid, my parents both worked full-time jobs. Yet when they came home, there was no rest. My mom cooked and cleaned. My dad tended the vegetable garden and fixed what needed fixing. No complaints; just love expressed through duty. Sound familiar?

Today, working parents still face that double shift. Single parents shoulder even more. People pitch in and help. Grandparents babysit. Retired priests help selflessly in our parishes. Some people put off retirement and stay in workplaces, where layoffs mean fewer workers and a greater workload. Love and a sense of necessity motivate these men and women.

This Gospel isn't about an uncaring master. It's about the quiet nobility of those who keep showing up, who understand that love often looks like service. Jesus isn't being harsh—He's being honest. The call to discipleship isn't part-time. But neither is grace.

Leo From Chicago

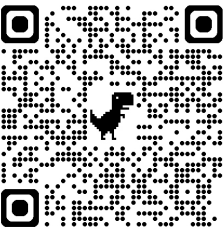
