Today's Reflection

The historical Jesus of Nazareth was a rabbi, and the Risen Christ remains that same rabbi. We see this clearly in His teaching method. As He accompanies the two disciples on their journey, He first listens. He draws near and asks, "What are you discussing?" He invites them to speak, to share what weighs on their hearts. He listens closely, then gently questions them further. Only after hearing them does He open the Scriptures, helping them to understand. He stays with them, enters their home, and shares a meal. And then He leaves—but not as He found them. He leaves them transformed, with hearts burning, grounded in truth and renewed in hope.

I have been blessed to encounter this same method throughout my life in Catholic education. The Sisters of Saints Cyril and Methodius, the Holy Cross Fathers, priests, religious, and lay teachers—most listened, questioned, and challenged me. They helped me see more deeply, think more honestly, and understand both Scripture and life. In their own way, they were my rabbis. In my years of teaching, I tried to do the same. I listened and asked questions—but more importantly; I encouraged my students to ask their own. Each class began with the Gospel of the day, and we did not move on until someone questioned it or connected its message to real life—not just Church life, but daily living.

That was the heart of teaching: to listen, to question, to be present.

Jesus of Nazareth—Jesus the Christ—is the Jesus, the ancient rabbi, here and now.
