Today's Reflection

In today's first reading, Elijah stands on a mountain, waiting for God. A mighty wind tears through the landscape, followed by an earthquake and fire. Yet God is not found in these spectacular events. God comes instead in a “tiny whispering sound.” I have often associated that whisper with the voice of conscience. Yet conscience is more than a gut feeling or Jiminy Cricket sitting on our shoulder. Catholic teaching tells us that we must follow our conscience—but we also have a responsibility to form it carefully.

Jesus is our starting point. When facing a moral choice, we might ask: Is this action consistent with the life and teachings of Jesus of Nazareth? What would Jesus do—and whom would Jesus protect, welcome, forgive, or challenge? We also form our conscience through Scripture, understood within its historical setting rather than interpreted simplistically; through the teachings of the Church; through prayer; and through consultation with trustworthy people. A pastor, spiritual director, knowledgeable professional, or wise friend may help us recognize something we have overlooked.

Listening is especially difficult today. Social media, cable news, and political ideologies surround us with winds of outrage, earthquakes of fear, and fires of anger. Their noise can easily drown out God's quiet voice. When an important moral decision confronts us, we should step away from the commotion. Pray, study, seek counsel, and listen. God may not be shouting above the noise. God may be waiting for us in the silence.

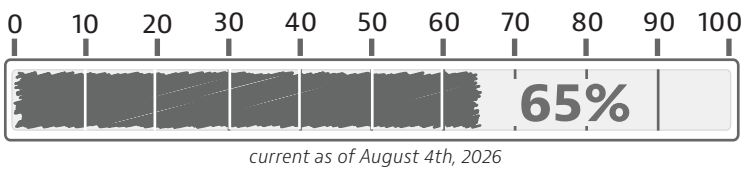
