Lorraine was the wife of our late Brother Ken. She was a strong supporter of our Council and a long-time member of the CWL and our Parish.



EASTER FUN IDEAS

Plan an Easter Egg hunt where each egg is filled with a clue to lead to the next egg and with the final clue leading to the Easter basket. We've been doing this for the last few years.

Make a traditional family dinner. Get the kids involved with the menu planning. Use this as an opportunity to teach them how to set a formal table and how to cook your family's traditional Easter dishes so that one day, they will be prepared to host. When they're ready, put them in charge of a dish or an entire course.

Nighttime Easter Egg hunt with glow-in-the-dark Easter Eggs. Place glow sticks in plastic Easter eggs. Or make it a flashlight egg hunt (add dots of paint stickers to the eggs that will glow under UV light and give everyone a UV flashlight) - this can be done indoors or out.

Dye Easter Eggs. Give your kids Sharpies and let them go crazy with goofy faces, phrases, and designs. Have a contest for the best-decorated egg with fun prizes – teens get more interested when competition is involved. Or make tie-dyed Easter eggs – so fun!

Spread the cheer and surprise your neighbors with a 'You've been egged' basket filled with Easter goodies.

Make Peeps s'mores.

Guess the Jelly Bean flavor. Blindfold the person who's up and give them a flavor to guess. Jelly Bellys work best for this! You can even mix in some Bean Boozled jelly beans for extra fun.
