Twenty Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Friends,

Whether or not the weather knows it, according to the calendar the season of autumn is here, which to me means one thing: everyone's favorite H word... yep, you guessed it... hiking! No? Maybe that's just me; maybe your mind went, not to hiking, but to *Halloween*. Here in the United States, it has become a holiday centered around candy, costumes, the scary and the macabre, but also unfortunately at times the occult or diabolical. Some claim that the holiday is of pagan origin and are happy about that; others claim that Halloween is of pagan origin and thus is evil and should be rejected. But did you know that Halloween actually just comes from All Saints Day? It's the eve, the night before All Saints Day (November 1st) which used to be called All Hallows Day... so the eve before would be called "All Hallows Eve", or "Halloween" for short! Just like Christmas Day and Christmas Eve.

"But wait, Fr. David! If it comes from All Saints, why is Halloween all about scary things nowadays?" Well, there are a lot of answers to that, but the first thing to know is that All Saints Day and the day after (All Souls Day, November 2nd) are about people who are no longer in this world, which means they have *DIED*. So it's the perfect time to remember the reality of death and our own mortality... hence all the skeletons, ghosts, and tombstones on Halloween. So that's where the scary vibe of Halloween comes from. Of course, vampires, zombies, superheroes and villains, werewolves, monsters, cowboys, witches, and jack-o-lanterns have very little to do with the true meaning of Halloween, but you can see how the Catholic meaning faded, while the themes of dressing up, fear, and death have remained.

Unfortunately, the evil one never rests from opposing or making a mockery of what is sacred. What should be a harmless if not sacred celebration often gets poisoned these days by the glorification of evil and even the inclusion of occult practices under the guise of spooky fun. We really need to be extra careful about how we celebrate Halloween and how our kids participate in the festivities. Anything having to do with ouija boards, pentagrams, witchcraft, seances, crystal balls, or other occult items or activities must be ABSOLUTELY AVOIDED and rejected by Christians. These are not harmless fun but actually open us to the influence of evil. The devil is real, and people who create these items and activities do so with the intention of inviting the influence or power of dark spirits, whether or not they would actually call it the devil. So even if your kids aren't calling upon Satan when they play with an ouija board from Barnes & Noble, they are being exposed to the possibility of inviting demonic presence into their lives. It's 100% not worth it. On the other hand, if you dress up as Edward the sparkly vampire from Twilight, you're probably not opening yourself to any evil spirits; you're just being a blockhead like Charlie Brown who cut out 8 or 9 eyeholes in his ghost costume. Which you're more than welcome to do.

This isn't just the "satanic panic" of the 80's, folks; the devil is real, and any seeking of power or knowledge from the spiritual world that is not from God or angels or saints (in other words, the good spirits) leaves only one option: evil spirits. If you have done this in the past, don't freak out, but just go to confession as soon as you can. It's a serious offense against the first commandment, but God's mercy is stronger than any influence of evil spirits. As long as you cling to Him and not to the occult or sinful, you will be fine.

So if a Catholic chooses to celebrate Halloween, what might that look like? Well, it's certainly NOT dressing up in a sexy or sacrilegious costume, like a sexy nurse, a demon priest, or a pregnant nun, or putting out sacrilegious decorations of Jesus or the devil, and pretending they're just funny or harmless. If there are any such decorations or activities, we need to stay far away from them and keep our kids away as well. There is an event called Fear Fest on the Northshore which was going

to bring in all sorts of people involved in paranormal investigations, witchcraft, and other related activities, and much of that can be superstitious or downright demonic... not an innocent trunk or treat, that's for sure. Hopefully it's a flop and they don't continue to host it.

Of course not every scary costume glorifies evil, but let's try glorifying God for a change! Consider dressing your kids up as a saint! (Costumes of martyrs can get pretty scary too... like St. Lucy with the two eyeballs on a plate, or St. Sebastian with arrows sticking out of his side!) Scary or not, if our kids wear costumes of saints, not only will those kids learn more about the stories of these actual real life superheroes, but they can also tell those stories to others who ask! Let's be done with the glorification of evil and playing around with darkness and the occult, and instead promote the true meaning of Halloween, which is that death comes for us all and yet we are meant to be saints who share in Jesus' victory over death! All you holy men and women, Saints of God, pray for us!

WOULD YOU LIKE A PIECE OF ST. RITA HISTORY IN YOUR HOME OR OFFICE?

As mentioned in the pulpit announcements at Mass, our new pews are now being manufactured and should arrive in February. To make room, we will sell off most of our existing pews, which are the original pews of St Rita when the church was built in 1962. (Some we will auction off at Fall Fest and some we'll use here on campus) You can own a piece of history and bring one of these pews to enhance your patio or make a 'house chapel' of sorts where you can pray in the same seats where you sit for Mass!!!! There are a limited number of pews, so we will reserve them on a first come, first serve, basis beginning Oct 18. You will need to arrange to have the pew picked up and brought to your home sometime in January (we will announce the dates for removal when we get a more clear understanding about the completion of the new ones)

Here are the specs: the pews are 22.5" wide (from back to the front of the seat) and 33" tall. The length varies.... We have 34 of the small pews located on the side walls that are 7' long at \$275 a piece. We have 49 of the large pews in the two middle sections that are 17' long. We are requesting \$350 a piece. However, once the 34 small pews are reserved, we will gladly alter the 17' large pews to make smaller 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' pews at your request. These special requested pews will be \$300 a piece.

I addition to pews being sold, a wonderful benefactor used some of the broken pews to make crosses and pens with varied stains. These will be on sale at Fall Fest, along with some slates from the old roof, in the Auction booth!!

FORMED'

Dear St. Rita family,

Do you know anyone who has hiked the Appalachian Trail? The whole thing takes between five and seven months and costs each hiker around \$1,000 a month (probably more now, considering the price of groceries nowadays). A five to seven month mountain hike is no joke. And it matters what kind of food you're taking with you as you hike. Is it going to sustain you in the wilderness? You wouldn't attempt this hike with a backpack full of lettuce! Y'ALL: AS CATHÔLICS, IN TODAY'S ŴORLD WE WILL NOT PERSEVERE IN LIVING OUR FAITH WITHOUT THE EUCHARIST EVERY SUNDAY AND HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION! We just won't. Our spiritual journey will come to a halt, leaving us stranded in the mountains.

But because spiritual starvation doesn't cause our bodies to die yet, when we're not receiving communion, we find ways to ignore the fact that we are completely spiritually depleted and have no strength to follow Jesus, especially when it's a hard trek. We have no food for the journey, so we barely even get started, and then we tell ourselves it's not for us, it's just for other holy church people. "I'm spiritual, not religious. It's not really my thing." News flash: it is for you, and if there is some reason you can't receive communion, I beg you: call me or Fr. Steve and let's meet to discuss it, so we can work out how you can start receiving this indispensable food for the journey. Otherwise, just go to confession and then start going back to communion! Eternal life is at stake here! We exhaust ourselves for hours every week to collect a paycheck, and yet that's a total waste if we don't give that Sunday hour to worship and receive the Bread of Eternal Life! To lose that eternal life makes nothing else in life worth it. We claim to look forward to being with God and our loved ones in eternal life; are we willing to throw that (and them) away, just because we are discouraged about going to Sunday Mass every week?

This month's video starts a little differently, with a very moving personal story. Even if you haven't had time to watch any of the previous videos, at least watch the opening five minutes of Episode 3 of *Presence*, titled "Bread for the Journey." You don't have to catch up on the other videos if you don't have time. The videos are at Formed.org, which is available to you for free by FIRST going to formed.org/signup and creating a free account (which barely takes 2 minutes to do). Then search for "Presence" or go to watch.formed.org/presence, OR scan this handy QR code with your phone's camera and watch the videos on your phone (after you sign in). This month, let's all watch Episode 3, and let our devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist be renewed!
