SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

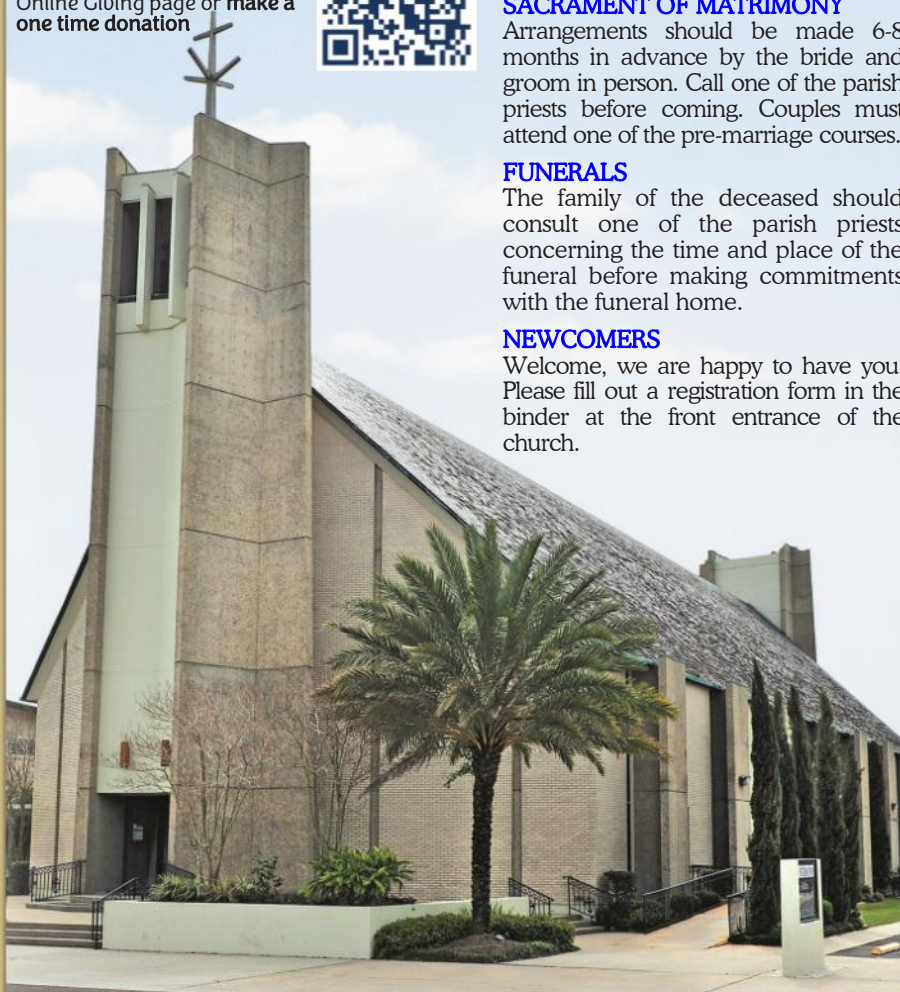
Arrangements should be made 6-8 months in advance by the bride and groom in person. Call one of the parish priests before coming. Couples must attend one of the pre-marriage courses.

Unwavering Fidelity to God's Will

In the old tradition of the Church, the Christmas season was celebrated up until this day, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This allowed for 40 days of bringing to mind the glorious day of Christ's birth on earth, similar to the 40 days we celebrate from Easter Sunday until the Feast of the Ascension. While current calendars have us taking down our trees at the Baptism of the Lord, just three short Sundays after the Nativity, today's Feast still holds great significance.

Jesus, our Lord and Savior, was born into a humble Jewish family. His parents were faithful to God's will, whether it be agreeing to a supernatural conception, following instructions given in dreams or fleeing to a foreign land. On this day, they were called to carry out a religious custom. 40 days after birth, the family was to bring their child to the temple to dedicate him to the Lord. A sacrifice was brought for the ritual offering, normally a lamb, but since Mary and Joseph were of humble means, they brought either a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons.

But perhaps the most surprising element of this event is the fact that the Holy Family falls into the background. They are not the main characters in this story, but rather two elderly individuals who seemingly come out of the woodwork when the Christ Child is brought into the temple. Simeon and Anna, two righteous and devout people who were awaiting the redemption of Israel, were chosen as some of the first people whose eyes lit up upon seeing our Savior! In fact, Simeon even got to hold Him in his arms!

And that is why some still call this day "Candlemas" as well. They bless candles that symbolize Jesus as the Light of the World. Simeon and Anna experienced first hand the splendor of the Lord and went on to give thanks to God and speak about the child to all who would listen. The light that shone forth from the tiny Babe, went on to shine forth through them, for Jesus illuminates all the nations.

As we gaze upon the unwavering fidelity of Simeon and Anna, Mary and Joseph, what will our response be? Let us ask for the intercession of these saints to imitate their prayerful faithfulness. May we always be ready to follow God's will in our lives and present all that we are to Him in love.

Saint of the Week

SAINT AGATHA (died 251)
February 5

"Of noble birth and great beauty," so the ancient accounts describe Saint Agatha, martyred during an early persecution for refusing a powerful Roman's offer of marriage, since she had consecrated her virginity to Christ. An early preacher, Saint Methodius, reflects instead on her name, noting that, in Greek, Agatha means "good," goodness being something we can all strive for, nobly born or common, blessed with beauty—or not! So brutal were the tortures that violated her youthful innocence, Agatha, like Agnes and several other women martyrs, was honored from time immemorial by having her name inscribed in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I). Long invoked as protector against earthquakes—Mount Etna erupted as she was being tortured—recent attention has focused on the particularly cruel torture decreed for Agatha, the cutting off of her breasts. This has inspired cancer survivors to promote Saint Agatha as patron and intercessor for women courageously facing breast cancer, for their families and the multitude of supporters who participate in fund-raising marches and races, and, of course, for the dedicated researchers who seek a cure.

From the desk of: Fr. David

Dear family,

Wow. Who would have thought that Harahan would start 2025 with that much snow? I don't know about you, but for me, there was so much to reflect on with the snow: how isolated we become when we can't access our personal circles of family and friends, even when they're just the next town over; or how good it is when we reconnect with our own community where we live, when we are forced to be less busy and get to take a walk around the neighborhood and build true community with our own neighbors around a snowman or fire pit or with some makeshift sleds; or just the hard-hitting visual reminder of what it means when God says He will take our sins away and make us white as snow. Lots to reflect upon. Sadly, we also started our year with many horrific occurrences practically in our backyard: the New Year's Day attack in New Orleans and the tragic murders in River Ridge, not to mention any other personal trials that 2025 may have brought into your own life already. As a priest, part of my role is to stand before God on behalf of the people entrusted to me, and intercede and offer sacrifice on your behalf. I'm feeling the weight of that especially this month, and I'm diving in as best I can, to be the priestly intercessor that our parish family needs me to be.

One thing that hopefully will help me be a better priest in this regard is a program that I'm undertaking for the first time, called Exodus 90. You may have heard of it; it is for Catholic men who want to find greater freedom from whatever is holding them back, in order to go deeper in their relationship with God. "Oh yeah, Father, I think I've heard of Exodus 90—that's the one where the men only take cold showers for 90 days?" Yes, that just might be the most well-known aspect of it—what kind of crazy person does that!?!—but I think before long we discover that there are other disciplines much more difficult than giving up warm showers. If you are a Catholic adult male who wants greater freedom in your life to be more present to your family and to God, it's not too late to jump into Exodus 90! Just download the app and sign up for the free trial to learn what it's all about... and come talk to me if you want to start (or have started) but you need a group of men to join... or get a group of men together and start your own! dfrank@arch-no.org

One of the disciplines of Exodus 90 is to exercise three times a week, and with that in mind I will be resuming my weekly Saturday morning 7:00 AM half-hour Rosary walk/run on the levee, starting at the levee end of Imperial Woods Drive, for the entire month of February. Whatever your speed, walking or running, feel free to join me out there any Saturday in February around 6:55 AM, as we motivate each other to give our bodies and souls a good start to the day. Maybe you can use it to get ready for the Born to Run 5K fundraiser this coming spring, and walk or run with your fellow St. Rita Trotters for Life!

Whatever trials or blessings are in store for you in 2025, this new year can be the year that God brings your relationship with Him to a new depth that you never imagined was possible. Let's go!!!!
