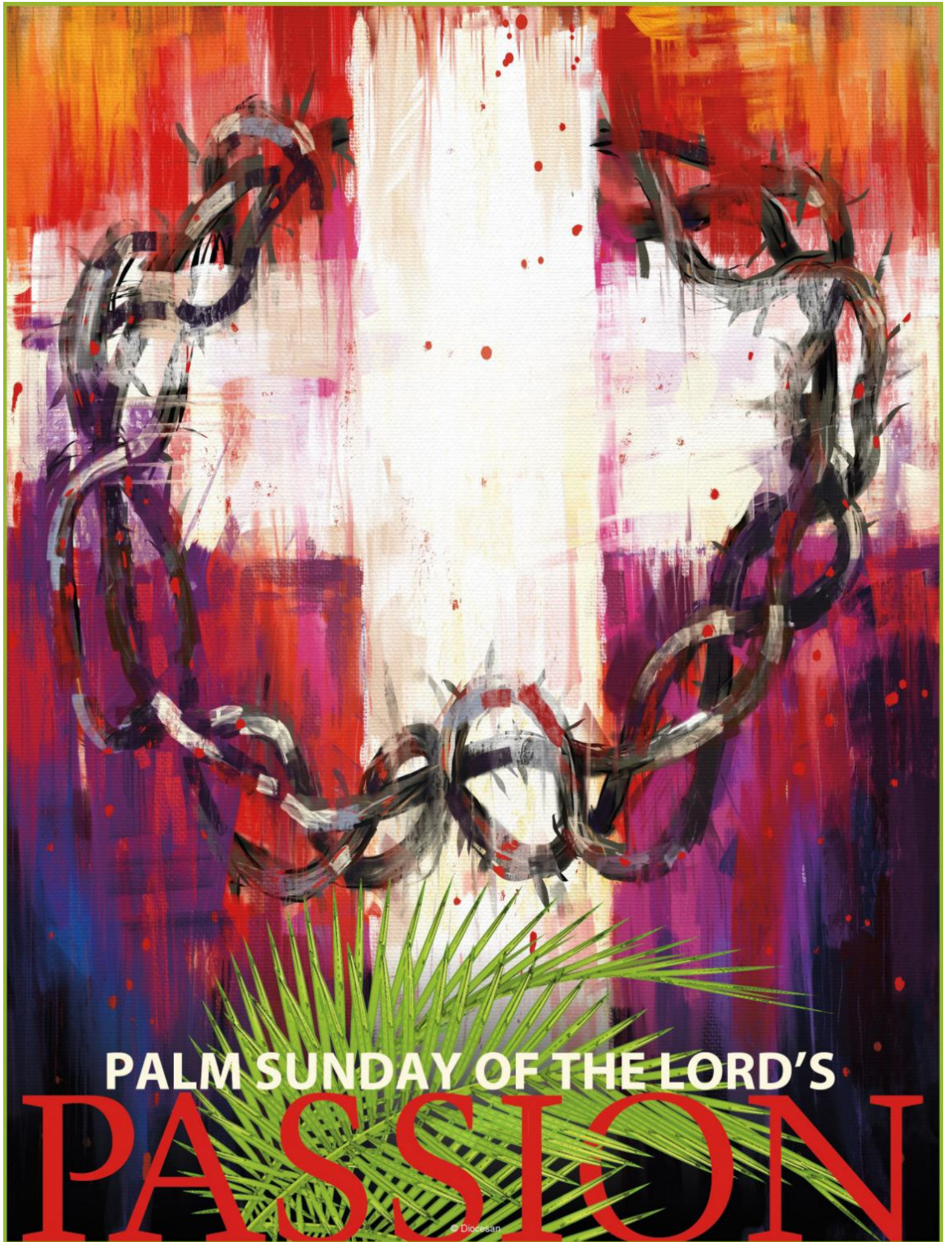

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

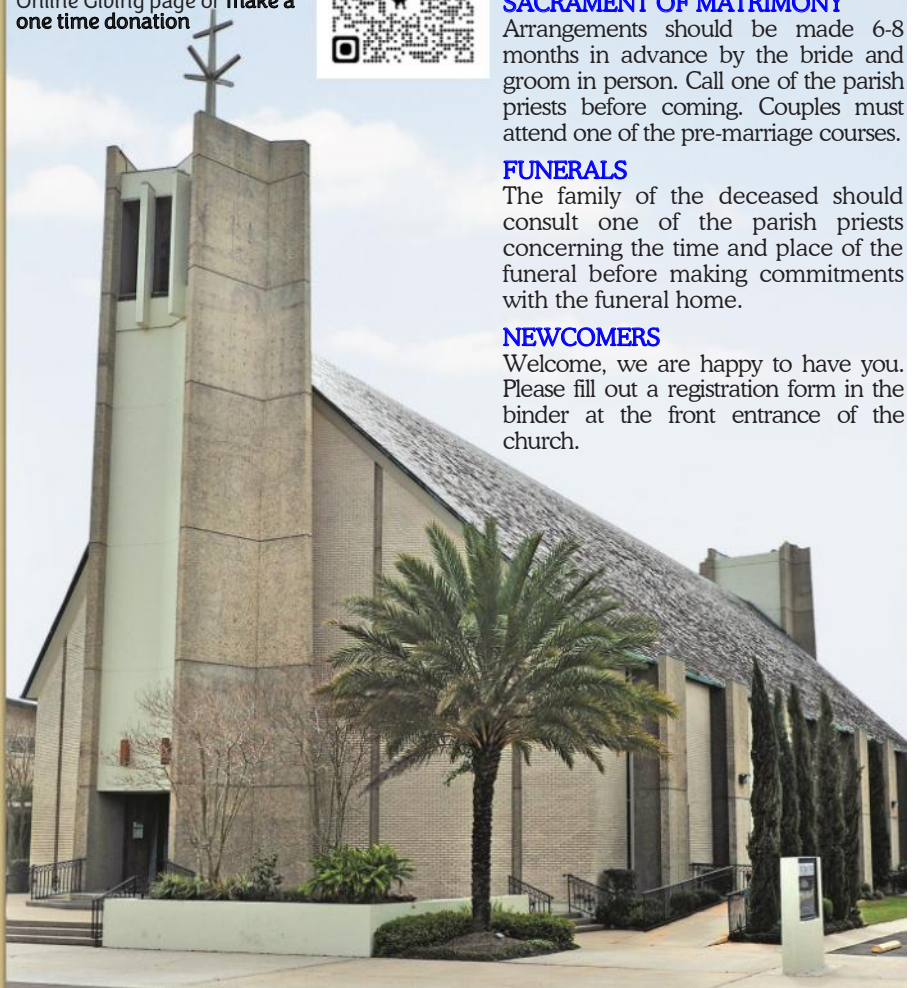
Arrangements should be made 6-8 months in advance by the bride and groom in person. Call one of the parish priests before coming. Couples must attend one of the pre-marriage courses.

One Who Serves— Palm Sunday

In the long form of the Passion from Luke's Gospel, Jesus refers to himself as "the one who serves" (Luke 22:27). This reminds me of today's second reading from Paul's letter to the Philippians. He says that Christ "emptied himself, taking the form of a slave" (Philippians 2:7). Jesus is not just being humble here. He gives us an example of how far God will go in loving humanity.

I suspect the apostles were confused when Jesus talked this way. Yet he tells them to be like a servant—expect little reward for what you do for others. Now the apostles might have thought, "Sure, I can do that. I'll preach about the Kingdom of God for free. Then I'll really look important and holy." So Jesus reminds them that the world looks at the person being served as more important than the servant. But he is one who serves. and if the apostles are to be leaders of the church they will need to be servants, too. Why? Because that is how God comes to the people.

In the Passion according to Luke, Jesus heals one of the men sent to arrest him. Barabbas, a murderer, is set free so Jesus can be crucified. As he is led to the cross, he consoles the women who weep for him. And even on the cross, he is the suffering servant who asks the Father to forgive those who are killing him.

With the example of service that Jesus shows toward those who put him to death, can we at least be "one who serves" those around us? Can we at least forgive those who hurt us—maybe even pray for our leaders, especially the ones with whom we disagree.

It Is Finished —Good Friday

During this Triduum, we are focused closely on our Savior's last and most difficult days on earth.

Reading St. John's narrative of Christ's Passion and Death, no more words are needed, and yet our hearts are overflowing with gratitude and awe at this graphic expression of the great love that overflows from the Heart of Jesus for each one of us.

He freely laid down His life for us, the life of the only Son of God in the flesh. He allowed His pure Heart, the Heart of Incarnate Love, to be pierced and poured out for us. As the great High Priest, Jesus offered the supreme Sacrifice to our eternal Father to atone for our sins, the Sacrifice that is offered each day on the altar at every Mass. Because of this great Sacrifice, we are able to become sons and daughters of God.

And as we look on Him whom we have pierced, whose beauty was distorted by our selfishness and whose wholeness was crushed for our sins, we begin to understand that he bore the guilt of us all. His serenity and his obedience to the Father were steadfast in spite of cruelty and mockery and torture. "Like a lamb led to the slaughter," He allowed himself to be condemned and killed. He freely laid down His life, He "surrendered himself to death," to give us the abundant life for which we are created.

Today, I look at the scene on Calvary and know that it is I who have crucified my Lord. My own selfwardness and refusal to love him and my neighbor as I should have caused the sufferings I see as He is sentenced, scourged, mocked, crowned with thorns, and nailed to the cross He embraced for love of me. Forgive me, Lord. Open my heart to this scene and teach me how to suffer with you, to be one with you, for others.

St. Paul tells us that we can make up in our own bodies what is lacking in the sufferings of Christ (Col 1:4). What was lacking? Did Jesus hold anything back? No. He gave everything for us. So what is lacking in the sufferings of Christ is the suffering of his Mystical Body – what is lacking is MY suffering. He did not hold anything back; Jesus just "left me a little room" to join Him there on the Cross.

Lord, help me to understand that in bearing life's difficulties with patience and generosity and offering them in union with your own Passion, you allow me to join you there, to take my place near you in this act of redemption, and in some mysterious way to help relieve the pain your heart bore. Teach me how to take up my own cross each day (Luke 9:23), and follow you more closely, in love and humility. Lord, I thank you for dying on the cross for me.

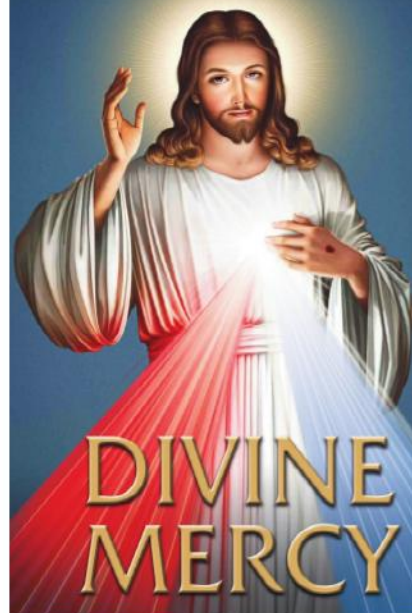

International Exhibition **THE EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES OF THE WORLD**

Designed and created by soon to be canonized Blessed Carlo Acutis



Carlo, the first millennial to be beatified, was noted from his early years for his joy and devotion to the Eucharist. To draw others to love the Blessed Sacrament, Carlo created a website that became the Eucharistic Miracles exhibition.

When he died of leukemia at the age of 15, he told his mother, "I can die happy."

The exhibit is intended to remind viewers that Our Lord is truly present in the Eucharist, and to inspire hearts to adore Him. Each panel in the exhibit presents a Eucharistic miracle, or a saint with a special devotion to the Eucharist, with photos and illustrations complementing the text.

This exhibit continues this goal of increasing faith, devotion, and love for the true presence of Our Lord in the Eucharist.
