Jesus, as we know, loved everyone, Jew and Greek, slave and free, man and woman. He dined with tax collectors and sought out sinners. He showed no partiality. He only asked that we follow him, imitating him, who said, "no one has greater love than this, to lay down one's <u>life</u> for one's friends" (John 15:13).

This is our mission. This is why we pray the Rosary together. So that by developing the habit of meditating on our Lord's life we can truly imitate him. This is what Respect Life Month reminds us of, that we are called to offer the same radical, selfless love that Jesus did, a love that requires that we turn away from the sins of individualism and indifference, and the mindset that it is someone else's responsibility to love the other. This month challenges us to see the other as God sees them, as beloved, no matter what differences separate us.

These beloved ones are the homeless and the poor, the migrant and the refugee, the widow and the orphan, the sick, the elderly and the handicapped. Ultimately, Respect Life Month calls our attention to the most vulnerable in our society, the unborn.

As we pray the Rosary during October, the month dedicated to this most special and powerful prayer, let us turn to St. Joseph, who defended the life of our Lord and His Mother; let us turn also to Mary, our Lady of the Rosary, and Mother of Mercy and entrust to their loving care our lives and the lives of all people. This is how we truly become God's, disciples.

Be Counted... October Count Begins this weekend. Attendance will be taken at each mass for the 4 weekends of October. Why do we count? It tells the proportion of the registered population who would normally be expected to attend Mass. Pastors, parish council members and diocesan staff use this for long-range planning of how best to allocate the limited resources of the Church. We chose October because it is a fairly typical month, unlike Lent or Advent or summertime. All parishioners should make every effort to attend mass at their home parish every Oct weekend. Stewardship Reflection... 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time. "For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control." 2 Timothy 1:7. ## Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Hab 1:2-3; 2:2-4 | 2 Tim 1:6-8, 13-14 | Lk 17:5-10

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE In today's Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples: "When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do." I think what Jesus is drawing us to see is the humility we need as his disciples. It's easy to get puffed up, thinking, "Well, I've done this" or "I've done that" in service of God. We can even start to feel that God owes us. But we are called to love God for God's own sake, not for the accolades or even the reward that comes from faithfully serving him. St. Ignatius of Loyola penned a beautiful prayer called the Prayer for Generosity that expresses the sentiment that I feel is at the heart of our Scriptures today: "Eternal Word, only begotten Son of God, teach me true generosity. Teach me to serve you as you deserve. To give without counting the cost ... to sacrifice myself without thought of any reward save the knowledge that I have done your will." Let's ask God to help us to serve him with generous hearts.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In his second letter to Timothy, Paul calls us to "bear [our] share of the hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God." Serving the Lord requires that we rely on the gift of the Spirit within us who empowers us to serve courageously and generously. The good news, Paul tells us, is that "God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control." In our efforts to serve God and to share our faith with others, let's remember that it is God's grace that is at work within us, equipping us and strengthening us. Let's remember Jesus' promise that even if we only have faith the size of a tiny mustard seed, we can still do great things for God. Indeed, through the gift of faith and the gift of his Holy Spirit, God has truly given us immense spiritual power.

#### PRAY

Take a moment to examine your own heart. Is your discipleship fueled more by a hope of reward (heaven), or, by pure love of God? Take some time to pray with St. Ignatius of Loyola's Prayer for Generosity (the full text can be found online), asking the Lord to increase your generosity in serving him.
