Many depended only on what they produced. There was a real reason to give thanks and a real reason to fear a bad year.

This fear led ancient people to select kings to take care of them. They feared that others could come and seize what they harvested. Out of this fear, they looked for someone among themselves who could protect them from foreign invaders and evil neighbors. This king would focus on protecting the fields and bring justice within the community. Scripture tells us how the Israelite first approached the prophet Samuel to select a king for them. Then came Saul as their king.

Saul's kingship was a turbulent one and it ended in a disaster. The Israelites fearing that their farms and livelihoods would be threatened turned to David, who was from Judah. They reasoned that he was someone who both felt a kinship with them and could truly protect them. There was prosperity under king David in Israel and there was thanksgiving celebration every year.

Jesus is David's descendant, and the kingship of David was passed on to Jesus's kingship. David defended the Israelites. Jesus defended his people and his church even from greater enemies like sin and death. As St. Paul tells us "He delivered us from the power of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom". Sometime instead of protecting and promoting the welfare of people they harmed them.

Jesus is different He is the one person throughout history who is worthy of being named king. When all power was given to him, he did not use it for himself but for all of us, even the most unworthy of us. We need only to hear our gospel for today to understand this. Jesus accepted death on the cross and the humiliation of it because on his love. In doing so, he both dealt with sin and death by taking away their power and showed us what true love is. For this reason, Christ is King. He was one of us, died for us and loved us. For this we give thanks not just today, not simply at the thanksgiving holidays later this week, but at every mass where we, as his people celebrate the Eucharist. May we never cease to thank our King, Lord Jesus Christ.

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

2 Sm 5:1-3 | Col 1:12-20 | Lk 23:35-43

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Since the birth of my oldest child, I have seen and heard many things about what I *should* do as a mother. I have heard everything from which products I should purchase to how I should help my child develop a healthy sleep routine. But my identity as a mother is not dependent upon any of these things; instead, it rests on my relationship with God as his beloved daughter and who he has called me to be as a mother. Those living at the time of Jesus were also trying to understand his identity as king according to their own expectations of what a king was meant to be. They certainly did not expect their king to be crucified by the Romans as we read about in our Gospel today. But Jesus did not come to rule as an earthly king. He *is* king because of his identity as the beloved Son of God, whose mission it was to offer his life for the salvation of all. Jesus did not allow society's understanding of a king to dictate how he lived his mission. Likewise, we must act confidently in accordance with the particular call that God has entrusted to us.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I find it interesting that when David was anointed king of Israel, he is designated as a commander whose vocation it was to *shepherd* the tribes of Israel. Of course, now we also readily associate the term *shepherd* with Christ, the Good Shepherd who cares for his sheep. The notion of kingship and shepherding, therefore, seem to be intertwined. In the sacrament of baptism, each of us is invited to participate in Christ's mission as priest, prophet, and king. To join Christ in his mission as king, we must also lead lives of service in which we allow the love of God to generously flow through us by caring for others. Let us strive to be shepherds for those in our communities who are seeking to know Christ more intimately; let us participate in Christ's mission as king through humble service to others.

Today, take a few minutes to pray for all leaders. Ask the Lord to guide them in their leadership to be good shepherds to all those who fall under their governance. As you participate in your local community and parish, ask for the guidance of the Holy Spirit to join in Christ's mission as king by serving those in need.

Enclosed is a copy of the St. Aloysius Annual Parish Financial Report for Fiscal year 2024-25. I would like to draw your attention to what has been accomplished this year. We remain current with the Diocese and all other vendors, including utilities, payroll, and benefits.

Each year presents its challenges. This year our challenge was to replace the church air conditioner. Due to generous parishioners, we have raised enough for the air conditioner and the electrical work costs totaling \$176,000.

Half of the bleachers in the gym were replaced earlier this year. The Sports Boosters paid \$17,266 last fiscal year for the downpayment and another \$17,266 was paid in the current fiscal year for them.

As we move forward to the upcoming year, we should acknowledge the blessings we have in our lives and reflect on how we can use our time, talent, and treasure to act as Jesus' hands and feet in the world.

In Fiscal Year 2023-24

- St. Aloysius reduced their outstanding old debt by \$32,000.00.
- Paid \$48,839.75 to the Diocese for the Parish Tithe through June 30, 2024.
- Paid \$23,900.00 on the roof loan.

In Fiscal Year 2024-25

- St. Aloysius reduced their outstanding old debt by \$107,000.00.
- Paid \$87,100 to pay balance due on the church roof loan.
- Paid \$51,433.00 to the Diocese for the Parish Tithe through June 30, 2025.
- Paid \$78,700.00 for painting the exterior of the church.
- Paid \$48,150.00 for painting the interior of the church.
