Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ,

St. Thomas More was the Chancellor, when Henry VIII was the King of England. More was a successful lawyer, a great linguist and a renowned spiritual and political writer. His book, *Utopia*, has become a classic. When he refused to take an oath supporting the Act of Succession, which a) recognized the offspring of Henry and his second wife Anne Boleyn as the heir to the throne; b) declared Henry's first marriage with Catherine as null and void. More was imprisoned in the Tower of London in the

year 1534. Thomas More could not, with honesty, approve Henry's second marriage to Anne, and he could not acknowledge the King as the supreme head of the Church of England. More's beloved daughter, Margaret, took an oath to persuade him to do so, in order that the family might visit him in prison. He spent fifteen lonely months imprisoned in the Tower of London in poor health, isolated from the other prisoners, deprived of his books and not even paper and pen were given to him.

Thomas More was convicted of treason, sentenced to death and, on July 6th, 1535, he was beheaded. On mounting the scaffold, Thomas More proclaimed that he was "the king's good servant but God's first." St. Thomas More paid the price for his discipleship by loving God more than his wife, children, even his life. (John Rose in John's Sunday Homilies). Today's readings challenge us to the true Christian discipleship of total commitment to the will of God, putting God first in our lives.

Dear friends, A true Christian discipleship requires to "renounce" both earthly possessions and possessions of the heart that is to renounce too much attachment to family by giving priority to God and His commandments. Break off the excessive attachment to possessions by leading a detached life by willingly sharing one's blessings with others. Accept the hard consequences of discipleship which include daily sacrificial service done for others and even the giving one's life for them. And calculate the cost involved in following Jesus. Using the two parables of the tower-builder and the king defending his country, Jesus says: think long and hard about Christian discipleship before a decision is made.

Friends, we need to accept the challenges of Christian discipleship with heroic commitment and practice it. We could do it, by sharing God's life through frequent and active participation in the Eucharistic celebration, by practicing the spirit of detachment and the renunciation of evil habits and by giving our time, talents and resources generously, for the Lord's work in the Church, and especially in our parish community.

Thanks to all those who love our parishes and do their part to make our parish of love and caring.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I am particularly struck by this line from Solomon's prayer in today's first reading from the Book of Wisdom: "Or who ever knew your counsel, except you had given wisdom and sent your holy spirit from on high?" Solomon doesn't seem to be seeking direct answers to the questions he presents today, but rather, uses them as a sort of poem of praise to honor God in all his glory. In modern language, we could rephrase his questions: *What do we know that God has not instilled into our minds? What wisdom do we have that was not infused by the Holy Spirit?* There are many things that we cannot understand without the wisdom God gives us. May we, like Solomon, praise and thank God for this gift. Let us trust that where our feeble, corruptible humanity falters, our heavenly Father is our refuge in every age.

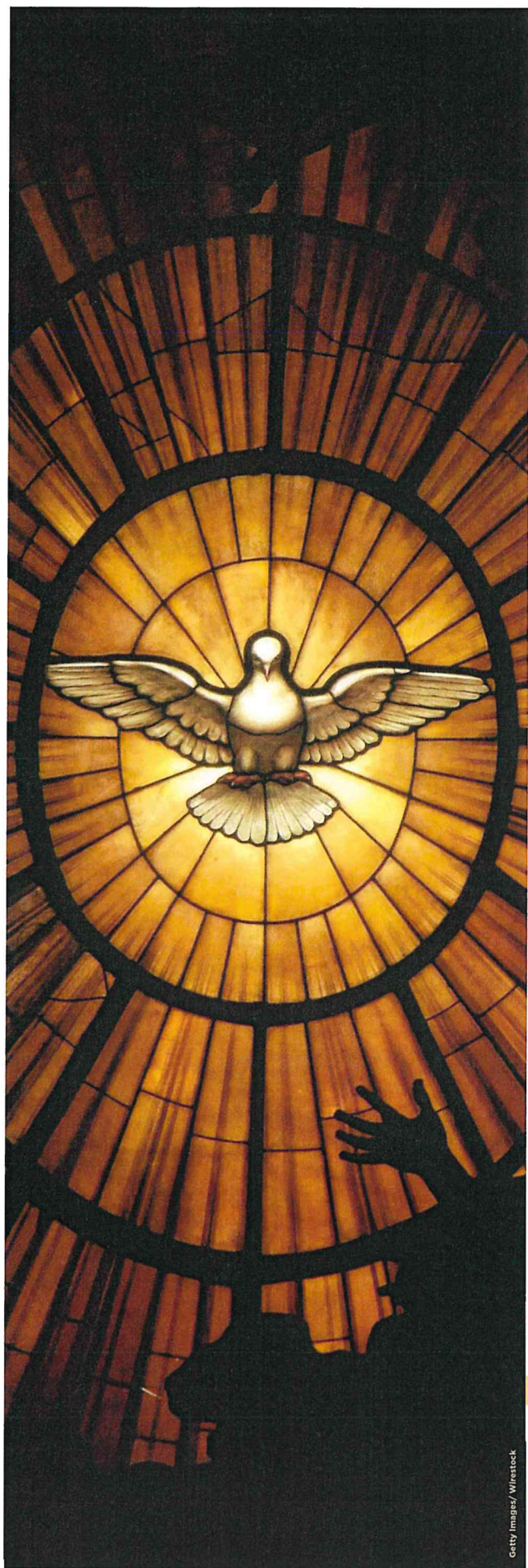
GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Today's Gospel is certainly one that we need God's wisdom to understand. This reading always makes me do a double take or a read-over. "*What did Jesus just say?!*" His words today are stark and can feel disconcerting. "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." When I encounter a challenging Scripture such as this one, I try to immediately root myself in concrete truths about the Lord. First, I acknowledge that he is good and desires *my* good. He is all-knowing, all-powerful and all-loving. After centering on those realities, I can look at this Gospel again, but this time through a clearer lens. Ultimately, this Gospel is a piercing reminder of the radical renunciation desired by the Lord. It is a rubric for the narrow road and for sanctity. Jesus does not mince his words, nor does he seek to confuse or confound: to follow Jesus is to release our hearts from earthly attachments, to embrace our cross and to set our lives in proper order. Clear and direct? Certainly. Easy? Not at all. But doing this in union with Jesus? *Absolutely possible.*

REFLECT

Today, consider reflecting on your attachments – the places you cling to anything that is not Christ. As you go into these tender places, invite Jesus to gently reveal where he wants to grant you his freedom.

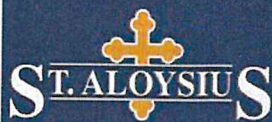
